Gold tanks Rs 3,400 to Rs 96,550/10 g

NEW DELHI: Gold prices tanked sharply by Rs 3,400 to Rs 96,550 per 10 grams in the national capi tal on Monday as traders shifted from safe-haven buying after the US declared a 90-day pause on tariff against Chinese imports. According to the All India Sarafa Association. the precious metal of 99.5 per cent purity plunged Rs 3,400 to Rs 96,100 per 10 grams on Monday. This marks the steepest fall in 10 months since gold prices plunged Rs 3,350 on July 23, 2024. Gold of 99.9 and 99.5 per cent purity had settled at Rs 99,950 and Rs 99.500 per 10 grams on Saturday

India will brook no discussion with Pakistan on the Jammu and Kashmir issue except to demand the return of Pak-occupied Kashmir , Prime Minister Narendra Modi said Monday night in his first address to the nation since a ceasefire halted the nearly 100-hour military conflict with Pakistan.

Operation Sindoor Is India's Policy Against Terror

NEW DELHI: Operation Sindoor that smashed terror infrastructure in Pakistan was not just an operation but a doctrinal change and a policy against terror, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said today in a televised address, his first since India launched cruise missiles at terror facilities in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK)

India will not tolerate any "nuclear blackmail

NEW DELHI: Asserting that India will not tolerate any "nuclear blackmail" Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday said that operations against Pakistan have only been kept in abeyance and the future will depend on their behaviour. In his first address to the nation after Operation Sindoor, Modi said while Pakistan pleaded with India to stop the military offensive, New Delhi considered it only after they promised to stop their misadventure. The Prime Minister termed the Pahalgam attack as the most "barbaric face of terrorism" saying it was personal pain for him but the enemy has now realised the consequence es of removing "sindoor" from the forehead of our women.

Punjab challenges court order on water release

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, MAY 12:

The Punjab Government has filed a review petition in court challenging the May 6 order regarding water release, terming it incorrect and based on misleading information presented before the hon'ble court.

Giving further details, the official spokesperson said, the Punjab Government informed in the petition that the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) is attempting to illegally divert Punjab's water to Harvana at the behest of the BJP-led Central Government. The Punjab Government has raised serious concerns over the proce-



dural irregularities and misrepresentation of facts that led to the disputed court order. The Government has clarified that attempts were made to mislead the court by incorrectly portraying the May 2 meeting as a formal decision-making forum. The Punjab Government informed that no official minutes of the meeting were ever provided to state authorities. Only a press note was circulated, which cannot be considered an official record of decisions made. How can an order be implemented when no formal decision was made in the first place?", questioned the state government, saying that the BBMB has overstepped its authority by at-

tempting to release water to Haryana without completing the required legal process. The Punjab Government highlighted that even the union Government failed to produce official minutes of the May 2 meeting when directed by the court, instead presenting only what they termed a "discussion record

Our fight is against terrorists, not with Pakistan Military: Air Marshal

Air Marshal AK Bharti stated on Monday that the purpose of Operation Sindoor was to target terrorists, and not to engage with the Pakistan Military or Pakistani civilians. Addressing a press briefing, Air Marshal Bharti said, "Our fight is with the terrorists, our fight is not with the Pakistan Military or Pakistan civilians, so that is very clear. We are very clear in our targeting." Air Marshal emphasised that the Indian Armed Forces showcased their effectiveness through precise strikes during Opera-

India confirms downing Pakistani Mirage Jet

NEW DELHI: India today confirmed that a Pakistani Mirage fighter jet was brought down during Operation Sindoor. Wreckage of a Pakistani Mirage could be seen in a video shared by the Indian Army. At a high-level press briefing in New Delhi, senior commanders from the Indian Army, Air Force, and Navy provided a comprehensive account of Operation Sindoor, launched on May 7 in retaliation for a deadly terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam on April 22 that killed 26 people. Indian intelligence services have linked the attack to the Pakistan-based terrorist group Lashkar-e-Taiba, and to elements within Pakistan's military establishment. The briefing was jointly led by Director General of Military Operations (DGMO) Lt Gen Rajiv Ghai, Director General Air Operations Air Vice Marshal AK Bharti, and Director General of Naval Operations Vice Admiral AN Pramod. "Our battle-proven systems stood the test of time and take them headon. Another highlight has been the stellar performance of the indigenous air defence system, the Akash system. Putting together and operationalising the potent AD environment has been possible only because of budgetary and policy support from the government of India in the last decade," Air Vice Marshal AK Bharti said at the briefing.

32 airports closed due to India-Pak standoff set to reopen

Civil aviation authorities have decided to reopen 32 airports that were shut for civil flight operations following last week's armed conflict between India and Pakistan, official sources said on Monday. Sharp rally in markets makes investors richer by Rs 16.15 lakh cr

Dalal Street investors became richer by Rs 16.15 lakh crore on Monday as markets skyrocketing nearly 4 per cent, after India and Pakistan announced reaching an understanding to stop all firings and military actions on land, air and sea.

Also, a trade agreement between the US and China added to the markets' optimism.

After starting the trade on an optimistic note, the 30-share BSE benchmark gauge Sensex further jumped 2,975.43 points or 3.74 per cent to settle at 82,429.90. During the day, it rallied 3,041.5 points or 3.82 per cent to a high of 82,495.97.

17 new born girls named 'Sindoor' in UP after Indian Army's Military Op

Inspired by Operation Sindoor, India's military action against Pakistan to avenge the Pahalgam terror attack last month, 17 newborn girls here have been named Sindoor by their families.

"As many as 17 newborn girls born in a span of two days -- on May 10 and 11 -- in Kushinagar Medical College have been named Sindoor by their family members," Principal Dr RK Shahi told

a news agency on Monday. Twenty-six people, mostly

Virat Kohli announces test retirement: says it's not easy but feels right

India's batting talisman Virat Kohli on Monday announced his retirement from Test cricket, ending a spectacular run in the format which celebrated him as its saviour at a time when T20 cricket took

centre-stage globally. The 36-year-old Kohli, who admitted that it wasn't an easy call to make, turned up in 123 Tests for India, scoring 9230 runs with 30 hundreds at an average of 46.85. He will now only play in ODIs,



having already retired from T20 Internationals last year. "I'm walking away with a

heart full of gratitude - for the game, for the people I shared the field with, and for every single person who made me feel seen along the way," Kohli announced on his instagram page, putting an end to incessant speculation about his future in the format. "It's been 14 years since I first wore the baggy blue in Test cricket.

Honestly, I never imagined the journey this format would take me on. It's tested me shaped me, and taught me lessons I'll carry for life." he added. The megastar's last Test assignment was a largely underwhelming tour of Australia in which he managed just one hundred. He ends his career well short of the 10,000 run mark, which was at one stage considered a formality. The righthander nonetheless signs off as a giant of the format with seven double hundreds, the highest for an Indian and well ahead of the iconic duo of Sunil Gavaskar (4), Sachin Tendulkar (6), Virender Sehwag (6) and Rahul Dravid (5).

Punjab govt sets new standards for agricultural education

In a significant step towards bringing uniformity and boosting agricultural education, Punjab Government has given a go-ahead to adopt ICAR Model Act, 2023 (Revised) for B.Sc (Hons.) agriculture in the state. This decision was taken

in a meeting of Punjab State Council for Agricultural Education (PSCAE), chaired by Dr. Basant Garg, Chairperson PSCAE - cum- administrative secretary agriculture and farmers welfare department, Punjab. Dr. Garg informed that a

detailed discussion on implementing the ICAR Model Act 2023 (Revised) for B.Sc (Hons.) Agriculture in Punjab led to a unanimous decision to adopt the Act. He said that the revised minimum standards for B.Sc (Hons.) Agriculture (per 120 students/ a unit) include 35 faculty members, 43 sup-



porting staff, and specific land requirements: 37.5 acres of total land area, with 19 acres (within a 7-KMs radius) dedicated to farm area, which can be owned or leased for 33 years, or a combination of 10 acres owned and 9 acres leased land for 10 years. Dr Balbir Singh empha-sized that the Punjab Government is committed to delivering quality healthcare services in government hospitals, which include free lab tests and medicines. He added that medical specialists in Medicine, Surgery, Gynecology and Pediatrics are available in

most sub-divisional hospitals and Community Health Centers (CHCs). To further enhance specialized care, Eye, ENT and Dermatology specialists will be assigned on a weekly roster basis at facilities with vacant positions.

The Minister noted that the Community Health Center in Lalru has adequate infra-

At the Sub-Divisional Hospital in Derabassi, while staffing levels are sufficient, there is a shortage of space that will be addressed in due course. for Delhi at 10:30 am and reach the national capital by 11:40 am, completing a full circuit in a single morning. Airlines and airport staff

Sudden ceasefire sparks national outcry: Sandeep questions foreign influence on India's sovereignty

Life returns to normal in Barmer and Jaisalmer after India-Pakistan border tensions

AGENCY JAISALMER, MAY 12

Two days after India and Pakistan came to an understanding on cessation of hostilities, life slowly returns to normal in the border villages. These villages especially in JK had borne the brunt of unprovoked firing from across the border. Morning visuals from Barmer market showed shops open and people going about their day, with life returning to normal after recent tensions along the India-Pakistan border. In Jaisalmer, a local resident said, "Everything is normal. The market is open, there are no issues during the day. Shops close around 7:30 pm. Our livelihood is not affected." in Barmer and Jaisalmer are relieved as daily

The tension had peaked early Saturday morning when a missile from Pakistan landed in an agricultural field in Jaisalmer district of Rajasthan. SSUM agitated over 'marking fee' by BIS, urge to frame industry friendly policies

NEW DELHI: The entrepreneurs, who are involved in the manufacturing of stainless steel utensils sector are agitated over the introduction of marking fee at the rate of 25 paise per kilogram by the bureau of indian



standards (BIS) in the recent past as they claim that it would approve fatal for the industry concern. A section of entrepreneurs speaking on the condition of anonymity claimed that this move has been done by BIS to deal a death blow to the stainless steel utensils manufacturer. They said that first it was conveyed that the marking fee would be at the rate of rs 2.50 per kilogram. Later on it was clarified that the marking fee would be charged at the rate of 25 paise per kilogram. They asserted that any concept of charging marking fee over the stainless steel utensils manufacturers (SSUM) would initiate an era of destruction for the industry especially the 'Laghu Udyog'. The industry sources argue that the stainless steel utensil standard under IS 14756 is highly technical and open to varied interpretations. With many manufacturers operating from small premises, lacking formal education, having no access to in-house labs or trained compliance officers, the standard is not just hard to follow, it is nearly impossible to implement in its current form.

He directed concerned officials to complete all essential work on a priority basis before the monsoon. Any kind of negligence in this regard will not be tol-

While chairing a meeting with officials from the Irrigation and Water Resources, Public Health Engineering and Urban Local Bodies departments, the Chief Minister directed that all the drains and minors in the state should be cleaned immediately to prevent waterlogging and potential flood situations

during the rainy season. He instructed officials to strengthen riverbeds by desilting the Saraswati, Markanda and Tangri rivers to maintain the natural flow of water. He also directed the officials to ensure the imme-

diate removal of water hyacinth from drains and other water channels to prevent any obstruction to the flow of water. In addition, all the dams in the state should be inspected in advance and if any deficiency or damage is found anywhere, it should be repaired promptly, he added.

The Chief Minister

stressed that all short-term projects must be executed on a war footing ahead of the monsoon. He also directed that details of the works being undertaken by the Irrigation and Water Resources and Public Health Engineering departments should be shared with local public representatives and the respective Deputy Commissioners.

Editorial

Work ahead

his year's United Nations' Human Development Report — an annual evaluation of the social and the economic development of countries – has indicated a worrying trend. According to HDR 2025, the global progress in human development is currently experiencing an unprecedented slowdown. India has made minimal progress, climbing three spots on the Human Development Index from its 2022 score, to rank 130 out of 193 countries. India's improved performance in three key sectors — health, education and standard of living — is believed to be behind this improvement. While India's life expectancy rose from 58.6 years in 1990 to 72 years in 2023 — the highest ever recorded — the average years of schooling have registered an increase as well — from 8.2 in 1990 to 13 in 2023. Further, the gross national income per capita surged over fourfold in the span of these 35 years. These gains, coming on the back of three deadly years of the pandemic, are laudable. Significantly, several flagship welfare programmes, such as the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act and the Right To Education Act, have been attributed as the drivers of development. These programmes must be further fortified and not weakened by starving them of funds or changes in rules.

The progress made must not deflect attention from the challenges that persist. India still ranks at the bottom third on the HDI. Its value, 0.685, is the same as that of Bangladesh and lower than that of its other neighbours, Sri Lanka and Bhutan. Rising inequality is another impediment to progress. The report shows that income and gender disparity have pulled down India's HDI score by 30.7%. This massive loss can derail the government's vision of making Bharat viksit in the true sense of the term. Measures to strive for an equitable society, supplemented by gender-inclusive policies that will not only increase women's participation but also ensure that they remain in the workforce, along with further improvements in public health and education, hold the key.

Taliban bans chess in Afghanistan over religious concerns

he Taliban has banned chess in Afghanistan due to religious concerns, continuing its opposition to various forms of entertainment and sports, Khaama Press reported. As per reports, the decision was taken due to "religious considerations" and restrictions announced by the Taliban's Ministry of Promotion of Virtue and Prevention of Vice. The decision places chess-related activities on hold indefinitely in Afghanistan. Officials from the Taliban-led Ministry of Sports confirmed the suspension of chess activities on May 11, stating that the sport will remain banned in the nation until suitable responses are found regarding religious concerns. As per reports, no activities related to chess would be allowed to resume without addressing these issues. Taliban's Ministry of Promotion of Virtue and Prevention of Vice has also dissolved the Afghanistan Chess Federation, terming the game "haram" (forbidden) as per the interpretation of the Islamic law, Khaama Press reported

The decision follows a growing trend of restrictions imposed by the Taliban on cultural, social and sporting events in Afghanistan since it seized power. Before the Taliban's announcement regarding the ban, several chess players and enthusiasts reportedly requested permission and financial support from the Taliban-led Ministry of Sports to continue their activities. However, the Taliban announced the ban, further complicating their efforts to play the game. Chess, once considered an intellectual sport in Afghanistan, has enjoyed a resurgence in recent years, with the national federation operating under the Taliban-led Ministry of Sports, Khaama Press reported. The Taliban's recent stance, citing Islamic legal interpretations, demonstrated their broader strategy to restrict cultural and recreational activities in Afghanistan.



The ban on playing chess demonstrates the Taliban's increasing restrictions on freedoms in Afghanistan. The Taliban has also imposed several restrictions on women in Afghanistan. It remains to be seen how long these policies will last or whether the international community will be able to pressurise the Taliban to reverse their decisions. Earlier in February, the Taliban announced that students from March 22 will have to wear the new Taliban-issued uniform.

The decision was published on February 27.According to the notice, students in classes 1st to 9th must wear a blue shirt, pants, and a white hat. Stu-

dents in classes 10th to 12th must wear a white shirt, pants and a headscarf or turban, Khaama Press reported. Previously, Taliban leader Hibatullah Akhundzada signed a nine-point decree stating that all public and private school uniforms would include a shirt, pants, turban, and white hat. The bill did not include the details regarding uniforms for female teachers or students. The colour of the uniform for female students is black. Since seizing power in Afghanistan, the Taliban has banned girls from pursuing studies in schools above sixth class and closed the doors of universities and medical educational centres to them.





Study finds how obesity linked to long Covid

People with excess weight are more likely to experience long-term neurological and mental health symptoms after Covid-19, including headache, vertigo, smell and taste disorders, sleep disturbance, and depression.

This research is done by Edith Cowan University (ECU) Centre of Precision Health visiting PhD scholar Debora Barbosa Ronca. "We anticipated some level of association between excess weight and post-Covid-19 symptoms based on prior evidence linking obesity with worse Covid-19 long-term outcomes. What stood out was the consistency of findings across a wide range of neurological and neuropsychiatric symptoms – including memory problems, depression, sleep disturbances, and sensory impairments.

While we did not perform subgroup analyses by ethnicity, the inclusion of studies from 23 different countries suggests the global relevance of our findings," said Ronca. Excess weight has been associated with



the development of long Covid or Post-Covid-19 condition, as proposed by the World Health Organization. While the mechanics behind the negative association be-

the body. Moreover, fat tissue helps the SARS-CoV-2 virus enter the body and may store the virus, allowing it to spread. Some studies have shown that long Covid symptoms could persist for 12 months or longer, necessitating the need for long-term medical interventions.

"These symptoms of long Covid can significantly impact quality of life and may linger for months. As we face overlapping public health challenges in the post-pandemic era, such as long Covid, mental health issues, and rising rates of obesity, it's essential to develop personalised and multidisciplinary care strategies to better support affected individuals," shared Ronca.

"Physicians and healthcare professionals should be aware that individuals with excess weight may be at higher risk of experiencing long-term neurological and mental health symptoms following Covid-19. This population may require closer monitoring and multidisciplinary care approaches. Integrating concomitant weight management, mental health support, and rehabilitation into post-Covids care plans could improve patient outcomes."


