Court orders case Against MP Minister for remarks on Col Sofiya Qureshi

BHOPAL: A police case will be filed against Madhya Pradesh minister Vijay Shah over his derogatory and sexist comments on Colonel Sophia Qureshi, the state High Court has ordered. Taking suo motu cognizance of the matter, which has sparked a wave of condemnation, the court directed the state police chief today to file a First Information Report against Vijay Shah. Colonel Sofiya Qureshi has been participating in the press briefings on Operation Sindoor along with Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri. On Tuesday, Mr Shah, the Tribal Affairs Minister of Madhya Pradesh, speaking at a cultural event in Mhow, said, "They (referring to Pakistan) had taken away the sindoor of our sisters and daughters, and we sent their own sister to give it back to them in kind".

Amritsar hooch tragedy: Death toll rises to 23

AMRITSAR: The death toll in the hooch tragedy here climbed to 23, with two more people dying in the Majitha area, police said on Wednesday. They said both the deceased hailed from Bhangwan village. Two more people have died in Majitha after drinking spurious liquor, taking the death toll to 23, a senior police official said.

Pb cracks down on illegal de-addiction centre, 76 rescued

UNI SHAHKOT: Under its flag-ship campaign 'Yudh Nashian Virudh', the civil and police administration of Jalandhar district in Punjab conducted a joint operation against unauthorized de-addiction centres in the Shahkot area on Wednesday. Official sources said 76 individuals were rescued from two such illegal facilities. The operation, led by Deputy Commissioner Himanshu Aggarwal and SSP Harvinder Singh Virk, targeted unauthorized centres run by Baba Deep Singh Welfare Society in village Dhandwal and the Turning Point De-addiction Center in village Bajwa Kalan. From Dhandwal, 47 people were rescued, and from Bajwa Kalan, 29 individuals were freed, officials said. FIRs have been registered against the property owners and operators of both centres, and investigations are underway.

India's fruit traders boycott Turkish goods over support to Pakistan

Following Turkey's support to Pakistan in attacks against India, protests have erupted across several parts of the country, with fruit traders beginning to boycott Turkish goods, especially apples that are widely imported. Traders have expressed strong opposition, stating that any country supporting Pakistan in acts against India will face a boycott. "Turkey gave drones to Pakistan, which were used to attack India. That's why we've decided to stop selling Turkish fruits," said a fruit vendor. India imports goods worth over Rs1,200 crore from Turkey annually, including a significant share of fruits like apples. Vendors said that while some previously ordered shipments are still en route, no new orders will be placed. "We've decided to stop buying Turkish fruits from now on. Any country that supports terrorism will not be entertained in Indian markets," one trader



said. Protesters accused Turkey of using Indian money to aid Pakistan against India and vowed to stop the sale of Turkish produce in local markets. "We have boycotted all products from Turkey. Apart from apples, several other fruits were imported from Turkey. We took this step because Turkey supported Pakistan. Turkey used to do good business in India, but now we have ended all trade with them. We will never import anything from Turkey in the future," said Shadab Khan, a local fruit trader.

BSF constable Purnam Kumar Shaw was repatriated to India on Wednesday, after spending 21 days in Pakistani custody. Shaw had inadvertently crossed into Pakistan territory while on operational duty in the Ferozepur sector on April 23, 2025, and was detained by Pakistan Rangers. Family members of BSF Jawan Purnam Kumar Shaw celebrated the news of his repatriation to India by distributing sweets. Following the cessation of hostilities, diplomatic efforts between India and Pakistan facilitated the repatriation process. Shaw was handed over to Indian authorities at the Joint Check Post Attari in Punjab at 10:30 a.m. today. The handover was conducted peacefully and in accordance with established protocols. Shaw's family, who had been anxiously waiting for his return, celebrated the news of his repatriation with great relief. His wife, Rajni Shaw, had pleaded with the Indian government to ensure her husband's safe return. West Bengal Chief



Minister Mamata Banerjee expressed her happiness and relief on Wednesday after Border Security Force Constable Purnam Kumar Shaw was repatriated from Pakistan to India. Taking to the social media platform X, Banerjee shared that she had been in close contact with Shaw's family throughout the ordeal, offering her best wishes to the jawan, his wife Rajni Shaw, and their entire family. "I am happy to receive the information that our Purnam Kumar Shaw, the BSF jawan, has been released."

S Jaishankar's security enhanced

NEW DELHI: The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has increased the security of External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, according to government sources. Two bullet-resistant vehicles have been added following a review of the Z category security cover provided to him. Security measures around his residence in Delhi have also been tightened. The sources told the news agency PTI that a recent review of Jaishankar's armed security was undertaken by central intelligence agencies, and they recommended the addition of bullet-resistant vehicles to his Z category convoy. The security requirements necessitated the addition of two new vehicles that are bullet resistant and this arrangement has been made recently, they said.

Justice BR Gavai takes oath as 52nd Chief Justice of India

NEW DELHI: Justice BR Gavai was sworn in as the 52nd Chief Justice of India today, marking a significant milestone in the country's judicial history. After taking oath, Justice Gavai paid floral tributes to the statues of Mahatma Gandhi and BR Ambedkar, symbolising his respect for the founding fathers of the nation and the Constitution. The swearing-in ceremony was attended by dignitaries, including senior judges of the Supreme Court, government officials, and members of the legal fraternity. Justice Gavai's appointment as the Chief Justice of India was confirmed by the President of India, following the recommendation of the outgoing Chief Justice. As the new Chief Justice, Justice Gavai will lead the judiciary in upholding the Constitution and ensuring justice for all citizens. His tenure is expected to be marked by significant challenges and opportunities for the judiciary. "I pay my respects to Mahatma Gandhi and BR Ambedkar, who have been the guiding lights for our nation and our Constitution," Justice Gavai said after his swearing-in. Justice Bhushan Ramkrishna Gavai was sworn in as the 52nd Chief Justice of India (CJI) on Wednesday, with President Droupadi Murmu administering the oath of office at ceremony held at Rashtrapati Bhavan.



HC Issues Notice to Haryana over additional water row

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab Government marked a significant win today as the Punjab and Haryana High Court recognized the gravity of Punjab's review petition and issued notices to the Haryana government and BBMB (Bhakra Beas Management Board). The court has asked them to provide clear explanations regarding their demands of extra water and actions concerning water distribution. In its review, the High Court questioned the BBMB chairperson's changing stance on water allocation and sought clarification on why Haryana needs additional water. This decisive intervention reinforces Punjab's constitutional and legal rights over its water resources, a matter that has long been a point of contention between the two states. The High Court's order was a result of the Punjab government's persistent legal strategy, which exposed procedural irregularities in BBMB during the demands of Haryana to release additional water.



Haryana announces reservation for DSC and OSC in Group D recruitment

The representatives of PCA, includes, State General Secretary, G.S. Chawla; Naresh Jindal, President Sangrur; Lovely Dabur, President Ludhiana; Amardeep, Cashier Mohali; Rajiv Jain, General Secretary Sangrur; Sudarshan Chaudhary, President Ropar and Piyush Goyal told the high profile officers that drug licenses should not be issued in the name of MNC or Corporate sector, but a license should be issued in the name of qualified person. The existing distance rule between existing shops for chemist shops has been stated to be 100 meters in urban areas and 50 meters in rural areas, but it is not mentioned for the MNC and Corporate sector. The distance in the trades should be in radius only if the distance is applicable to both. The wholesale drug sellers should be based on competent experienced people, as earlier, because wholesalers deal with retailers only in bulk pack supply.

Ravjot Singh cracks down on civic negligence, orders swift clean-up in Dera Bassi

Reiterating zero tolerance policy towards laxity in cleanliness, Punjab Local Government Minister Dr Ravjot Singh today averred that Chief Minister S. While inaugurating the newly laid road, the MP said that this stretch of road was last carpeted in the year 2017. Since past many years, with the increase in traffic, people had been demanding widening of the road. The road had deep potholes and was broke from several places. He added that on the 10 feet narrow road, two vehicles could not



run parallel to each other. Consequently, driver of one of the vehicles had to lower down his vehicle on the kacha path on sides of road.

"With the widening, now two vehicles can easily run parallel to each other without causing any traffic snarls," MP said.

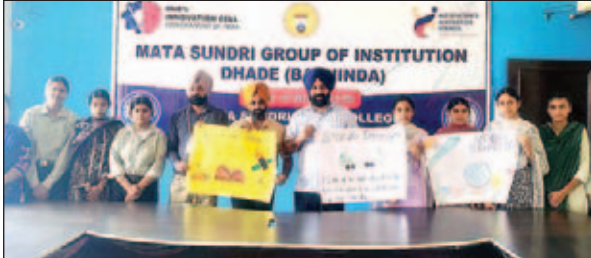

Nominations invited for ICCW Bravery Awards for Children & Youth - 2025

Indian Council for Child Welfare has invited the applications for ICCW Bravery Awards for Children & Youth - 2025. Divulging the details, Dr Pritam Sidhu, Secretary, Child Welfare Council, Punjab said that for these awards, nominations of eligible children between 6 to 18 years of age (Child Award) or 18 to 24 years of age (Youth Award) can be submitted through Deputy Commissioner Office.

Elaborating more details, she said that the cases of saving children from drowning and from beastly attack by wild animals are symbols of bravery but there must be many more instances, where the particular act of bravery of a child is distinctly visible. It should be an act of spontaneous selfless service in the face of risk to life, threat of physical injury and or an act of courage and daring against a social evil/crime. She said that the nominations must reach to Child Welfare Council office through Deputy Commissioner Offices latest by 5th October, 2025, in respect of incidents having occurred between 1st July, 2024 to 30th September, 2025. Each application must be accompanied with "On the Spot Verification" of the case. The application must be recommended by the Principal/Headmaster of the school/college in which the applicant is studying, President or General Secretary or any other Office Bearer of the State/UT Council for Child Welfare or Any retired Government Officer.

She said that incomplete applications or those not sent in the prescribed format will be rejected.

Furthermore, it should be ensured that all supporting documents are duly authenticated by the listed competent authorities and that all documents in the local/regional language are accompanied with translations in Hindi/English. Newspaper clippings/Magazine clippings must be attached with the application form.

Punjab pushes green revolution 2.0: 5 lakh acres targeted for DSR with Rs 1,500/ acre aid, Rs 40 cr backing from Mann Govt: Khuddian

In a bid to promote sustainable agriculture and conserve groundwater, Punjab Government has set a target of bringing five lakh acres under Direct Sowing of Rice (DSR) technique this Kharif season, with direct sowing of paddy scheduled to begin from May 15 onwards, informed S. Gurmeet Singh Khuddian, Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Punjab.

"Farmers can begin paddy cultivation using the Direct Sowing of Rice (DSR) technique from Thursday onwards," said S Khuddian, while adding that the Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann led Punjab Government is also offering financial assistance of Rs. 1,500 per acre to the farmers adopting DSR. A budgetary allocation of

Rs. 40 crore has been made for FY 2025-26. Farmers can register for the DSR scheme at on-line portal agrimachinerypb.com from May 10 to June 30, 2025. Basmati growers are also eligible to adopt the DSR technique and avail a financial incentive of Rs. 1,500 per acre from this season, the Agriculture Minister added. The state government had disbursed Rs. 29.02 crore to 21,338 farmers, who have adopted the water-saving DSR technique during the Kharif

season 2024. Notably, paddy was directly sown on 2.53 lakh acres in 2024, marking a significant 47% increase from 1.72 lakh acres in 2023. He further informed that the first verification of DSR fields, including basmati, is scheduled from July 1 to July 15, 2025. Highlighting the benefits of the Direct Sowing of Rice (DSR) technique, S. A skilled warrior and trained administrator, Ahilyabai personally led her armies and protected her state from

invaders. Rawat recalled how, in an era when the sati practice was prevalent, Ahilyabai was encouraged by her father-in-law to govern the state after her husband's demise rather than follow the path of self-immolation. "Her life is a shining example of courage, leadership, and service," said Rawat, adding that the BJP will organize a series of programs across the country and the state to promote women empowerment through her legacy. Deepti Rawat announced that a series of events will be conducted in Himachal Pradesh until May 31 to mark Ahilyabai Holkar's birth centenary year.

State govt strengthens tertiary health care services in medical colleges

In a bid to improve health care services across all the six medical colleges in Himachal Pradesh, the present state government is taking numerous steps to improve and offering better medical facilities to the patients. It has approved the establishment of departments of Nephrology, Neurology, and Gastroenterology at Dr. Radhakrishnan Government Medical College, Hamirpur, along-with creation and filling of 118 posts across various categories, aiming to provide specialized treatment facilities to the patients from Hamirpur and neighbouring districts including Mandi, Una, Bilaspur and Kangra. Under the directives of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, the hospital authorities have conducted a survey, which indicated a rise in the patients suffering from kidney, neurological and digestive system related ailments. However, due to lack of the specialist doctors of these departments in the medical college, the patients are forced to go to IGMC Shimla, Dr. RPGMC Tanda and PGIMER, Chandigarh for treatment. The Chief Minister directed the Health department to expedite the process of establishing the new departments and appointing the requisite medical and supportive staff. The Chief Minister has also directed the department to improve the health care facilities across all the medical colleges. Following these directives, the state government has also given its nod to establish the department of Nuclear Medicine at Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Medical College, Nerchowk in Mandi district along-with creation and filling of posts including Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Senior Resident Doctor, Nuclear Medicine Technologist and Radiation Safety Officer. Additionally, it also approved to fill up the post of Assistant Professor in the department of Immunohematology and blood transfusion in the department of Pathology in Dr. Y.S. Parmar Government Medical College Nahan, district Sirmaur.

credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, which made the action against "terrorism" successful. "I salute the valour, courage, and bravery of our Indian Army, Navy, Air Force, BSF, and the jawans of their security forces for Operation Sindoor's unprecedented success.

I also thank PM Narendra Modi for his strong leadership and policies, which made this action against terrorism successful", CM Dhama said while addressing the gathering after taking part in the 'Tiranga Samman Shaurya Yaatra'. India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7 as a decisive military response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 people were killed.

Indian Armed Forces targeted terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir, leading to the death of over 100 terrorists affiliated with terror outfits like the Jaish-e-Mohammed, Lashkar-e-Taiba and Hizbul Mujahideen. After the attack, Pakistan retaliated with cross-border shelling across the Line of Control and Jammu and Kashmir as well as attempted drone attacks along the border regions, following which India launched a coordinated attack and damaged radar infrastructure, communication centres and airfields across 11 airbases in Pakistan. After this, on May 10, an understanding of the cessation of hostilities between India and Pakistan was announced.

MP Meet Hayer inaugurates widened Dhanaula-Dangarh Road, irrigation projects in Sangrur

The Member Parliament Sangrur Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer today inaugurated Dhanaula to Dangarh link road that has been widened from 10 feet to 18 feet. The widening of road has been a long pending demand of the people of area who have been dedicated the newly built 3.5 kms stretch of road at a cost of Rs 154 lakhs. The road connects Dhanaula city with around 15 villages in the area. While

inaugurating the newly laid road, the MP said that this stretch of road was last carpeted in the year 2017. Since past many years, with the increase in traffic, people had been demanding widening of the road. The road had deep potholes and was broke from several places. He added that on the 10 feet narrow road, two vehicles could not run parallel to each other. Consequently, driver of one of the vehicles had to lower down his vehicle on the kacha path on sides of road.

No tampering should be done with teachers’ financial and administrative structure : Rajnish kumar

The state government is working to suppress the voice of the Primary Teachers' Association. The structure being prepared by the Education Directorate is completely inappropriate. It was stated that previously there were two directorates under the Education Department, but even then problems were not being solved. Now, a single directorate has been assigned to the Education Department, which is incorrect.

This was stated by Rajnish Kumar, District President of the Govt. Primary Teachers Federation, Hamirpur. He said that no tampering should be done with the financial and administrative powers of the B.E.E.O.s (Block Elementary



Education Officers). In addition, promotions through C.H.T. and H.T. should also not be affected. He said that sports competitions for children in primary schools should not be stopped. He demanded from the state government that sports competitions in

primary schools should be resumed as before.

He added that the state government is about to end 27-28 years of sports history in one go. Rajnish Kumar further said that the state government has printed primary school textbooks in English medium without any preparation. Whereas in government schools, not all students are able to read in English medium.

The association has also demanded the immediate reinstatement of suspended teachers, calling the action unfair and detrimental to the morale of the teaching community. They emphasized that justice must be served without delay. "The decision has been taken without any dialogue with the association, and it directly impacts the future of primary education," said union members.

Pakistani spy arrested from Panipat

Police have arrested a Pakistani spy from Panipat. He was in touch with Pakistani terrorist Iqbal. He was sending him Indian intelligence information through WhatsApp and other social media apps. Karnal and Panipat's acting SP Gangaram Poonia confirmed the arrest and said that the initial investigation has found the allegations of spying to be true. He has contacts with some people in Pakistan, with whom he was sharing sensitive and important information. Regarding his links with terrorists, the SP said that information has been received about this, it can be said with certainty after investigation. Police arrested him after tracing the suspicious activity from his number. Initial investigation revealed that the arrested spy Nauman Ilahi is originally from Kairana in Uttar Pradesh. a factory there. According to information, Nauman Ilahi (24) is originally from Mohalla Begumpura in Kairana in Shamli district of Uttar Pradesh. His sister Zeenat is married in Panipat. She lives in Holly Colony here. Nauman was also staying there. Earlier he worked in a factory in Sector 29. Security agencies are on alert after the 'Operation Sindoor' air strike on Pakistan. However, a ceasefire was reached

between the two countries on May 10. Still, police are investigating the suspects as a precaution. In this case, it came to light that Nauman Ilahi's phone number was connected to Pakistan. After which he was taken into custody and investigated. When police investigated his mobile, it was found that he was in contact with a terrorist named Iqbal in Pakistan. He was sending him information related to India's security. However, police have not yet disclosed what kind of information he sent. According to police sources, he is suspected of doing the job as a cover. His real job was to stay here and inform Pakistan about every small and big movement in the country. He is suspected to be in contact with Pakistani terrorists for a long time. Police may soon reveal it. SP Gangaram Poonia said - We had received an input. Acting on this, Nauman Ilahi has been arrested. A case has been regis-

tered in this regard at the Industrial Area Police Station of Panipat. The accused is being questioned. Gangaram Poonia said that the evidence we had and the things found from his electronic equipment, primarily the allegations were found to be correct. Much information was also received during interrogation, after which he was arrested. Some documents have also been found about taking money from him. Information will be given in this matter after confirming it. On the question of his connection with terrorists, SP Gangaram Poonia said that he was in contact with some people. To whom he was giving sensitive and important information. Right now the investigation is in the initial stage, so the team is interrogating. On the question of more people being involved in this, the SP said that the whole matter will be known on the basis of interrogation and investigation.

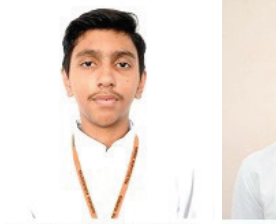

Editorial

India triumphs

The recent armed conflict between India and Pakistan underlines an interesting battle of political ideas. The Pakistani Establishment seems keen to assert a conventional and outdated Europe-centric imagination of the nation-state, which is based on one religion (Islam), one culture (Muslim), and one language (Urdu). To sustain and justify this foundational principle, the ruling classes in Pakistan inevitably rely on M.A. Jinnah's two-nation theory. It helps them represent India as a Hindu nation-state, while conveniently ignoring the existence of Bangladesh — an unwanted rupture in the Pakistan story.

India, on the other hand, represents a two-fold challenge. The Indian Constitution does not subscribe to the ideals of the European nation-state model; it celebrates India's social, religious, and cultural diversity as a political strength. The present armed conflict, in this sense, is not merely a war between two nuclear powers. Instead, it is an outcome of an ideological conflict that has been going on for almost eight decades.

Let us unpack the chronology of the present clash. The Pakistani army chief, Asim Munir, delivered a highly provocative anti-India speech prior to the Pahalgam attack. Munir made it very clear that Pakistan's anti-India position stemmed from its uncompromising adherence to the two-nation theory. Munir asserted that the differences between Hindus and Muslims constituted the philosophical foundation of Pakistan; and, for that reason, Muslim Pakistan would continue to support the militant struggle in Kashmir in the name of Islam to defeat Hindu India.

The Pahalgam massacre was the logical outcome of this assertion. There were three aspects to this terrorist attack which made it rather unprecedented. First, the terrorists discovered a new soft target — common, non-Muslim tourists. The presence of these visitors in Kashmir posed a serious challenge to the Pakistan-supported terrorist networks. The enthusiastic participation of Kashmiri people in the recent elections had already delegitimised the Pakistani claim that Kashmiri Muslims did not have faith in Indian democracy. It was clear that the Pakistan-supported terrorist groups did not represent the aspirations of ordinary Kashmiris. The terrorists wanted to re-establish their dominance and innocent tourists were the easily available targets.

The communal nature of the Pahalgam terror attack was the second important feature. Terrorists asked the tourists to reveal their religious identity. They even forced people to recite the Kalima before killing them. This overemphasis on the religion of the victims provided a clear Muslim versus Hindu framework to the event, something which was highlighted by Munir in his speech as well.

Chinese state mouthpiece 'Global Times' account withheld in India

In a recent development, the account of the Chinese state-run propaganda mouthpiece, Global Times, was withheld in India, as observed on Wednesday. Upon opening the account of Global Times, the following message is displayed—"Account Withheld""@globaltimesnews has been withheld in IN in response to a legal demand"https://x.com/globaltimes-newsEarlier on May 8, Social media platform X had received executive orders from the Indian government requiring X to block over 8,000 accounts in India, subject to potential penalties including significant fines and imprisonment of the company's local employees, a statement by the Global Government Affairs said. The orders include demands to block access in India to accounts belonging to international news organisations and prominent X users. On May 7, India's Embassy in China had rebuked the Chinese media outlet Global Times for reporting that Pakistan's military shot down an Indian fighter jet and advised verifying facts and sources before publishing such reports."Dear @globaltimesnews, we would recommend you verify your facts and cross-examine your sources before pushing out this kind of disinformation," the Embassy of India in Beijing, China, said on

India on May 8 had categorically rejected Pakistan's malicious misinformation campaign, which falsely claimed the destruction of critical Indian military assets and infrastructure. Addressing a joint press conference by the Ministry of External Affairs and the Ministry of Defence on Operation Sindoor, Wing Commander Vyomika Singh highlighted Pakistan's attempts to spread disinformation about damage caused to the S-400 system at Adhampur, airfields at Suratgarh and Sirsa, Brahmos space at Nagrota, and artillery-gun positions in Dehrangyari and Chandigarh, among other allegations. She emphasised that India unequivocally rejects these false narratives, which are



part of a broader strategy to undermine India's military capabilities and instil fear among the public." Pakistan has also attempted to execute a continued malicious misinformation campaign, with claims of destruction of the Indian S-400 system at Adhampur, destruction of airfields at Suratgarh and Sirsa, Brahmos space at Nagrota, and Arti-gun positions in Dehrangyari and Chandigarh forward ammunition depot, with heavy damages to other military stations being propagated across social media," she said. "India unequivocally rejects these false narratives being spread by Pakistan," the Wing Commander

added. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the Adampur Airbase on Tuesday was a testimony against the propaganda and lies being spread by Pakistan. During his visit to the Adampur Airbase, PM Modi had said, "Despite Pakistan's many efforts, our airbases, or our other defence infrastructure, have not been harmed. And the credit for this goes to all of you, and I am proud of all of you, every soldier deployed on the border, every person associated with this operation deserves credit for this".

Previously, India had announced a ban on 16 Pakistani YouTube channels for spreading provocative and communally sensitive content and misinformation against India, its Army and security agencies in the backdrop of the tragic Pahalgam terror incident in Jammu and Kashmir.

The action followed the recommendations of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). Following heightened tensions between India and Pakistan over the deadly terrorist attack in Pahalgam, the accounts of Pakistan Peoples Party Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari and former Prime Minister Imran Khan, founder of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), have been suspended in India.

AI-designed DNA controls genes in healthy mammalian cells for first time: Study

A recent study marks the first reported instance of generative AI designing synthetic molecules that can successfully control gene expression in healthy mammalian cells. As a proof-of-concept, the authors of the study asked the AI to design synthetic fragments which activate a gene coding for a fluorescent protein in some cells while leaving gene expression patterns unaltered.

They created the fragments from scratch and dropped them into mouse blood cells, where the sequence fused with the genome at random locations. The experiments worked exactly as predicted and pave the way for new strategies to give instructions to a cell and guide how they develop and behave with un-



precedented accuracy. The model can be told to create synthetic fragments of DNA with custom criteria, for example: 'switch this gene on in stem cells which will turn into red-blood-cells but not platelets. The model then predicts which combination of DNA letters (A, T, C, G) are needed for the gene expression patterns required in specific types of cells. Researchers can then chemically synthesise the roughly 250-

letter DNA fragments and add them to a virus for delivery into cells. "The potential applications are vast. It's like writing software but for biology, giving us new ways of giving instructions to a cell and guiding how they develop and behave with unprecedented accuracy," says Dr. Robert Fromel, first author of the study who carried out the work at the Centre for Genomic Regulation (CRG) in Barcelona.

Democracy vs Dictatorship: The elementary dissimilitude

One's Target Audience is Other's War Resource

At the heart of the unending hostility between India and Pakistan lies a fundamental clash of governance construct. India, as a robust democracy, draws its strength from the will and aspirations of its people, often driving its military to act in defence of national honour and public sentiment. In stark contrast, Pakistan's military-dominated state structure prioritizes the survival and supremacy of its generals, who wield significant influence over national policies at the expense of the civilian population.

What One Captivates, The Other Weaponizes

State-sponsored terrorism remains a defining aspect of this fraught relationship, with Pakistan's military establishment leveraging militant proxies to pursue strategic objectives while shielding itself behind a nuclear deterrent. The strategic calculus here is clear — while democracies seek public legitimacy, authoritarian regimes rely on coercive control, often sacrificing their own people to maintain internal dominance and external leverage. This makes constructive dialogue challenging, as one side views its populace as a resource to be protected, while the other sees it as expendable in the service of military adventurism.

Disrupting the Military Grip

The Megalomaniacal Generals will apocore resort to what they know and do best i.e. Combat. Over time, these arrangements have lit fresh fires, fuelling conflicts to their advantage. "...the Pak Army's grip on the system is the binding force for them.

For peace to take root, the entrenched military grip over Pakistan's polity must be weakened. Given their deep economic and political entrenchment, this is unlikely without significant internal and external pressure.

Only two options exist for ensuring peace for the Pakistanis themselves, India being the facilitator in only one

The Internal Reckoning

One path to lasting peace is internal reform — a grassroots movement to establish true democracy, transferring power from the military to the people. The true democracy must be allowed to bloom with the power in the hands of its people. This will require sustained global support, particularly from Western powers, which have often turned a blind eye to Pakistan's hypocrisy in the name of geopolitical expediency. Genuine democratic reform, however, demands that the military be not just sidelined but structurally reduced in its influence, akin to the post-World War I dis-

armament imposed on Germany through the Treaty of Versailles.

The Balkanization Scenario

The alternative, more extreme option often discussed, is the potential fragmentation of Pakistan into smaller, more manageable entities. However, even in this scenario, the powerful Punjab province — the heartland of the Pakistani military — is likely to retain significant influence, potentially perpetuating instability with frequent contretemps. Fragmentation may reduce the scale of the threat but would still leave a volatile, militarized neighbour prone to internal power struggles and external provocations.

The Ineluctable Conclusion

Ultimately, both approaches point to a common solution — cutting down the Pakistani military's oversized role in governance and national policy. Without this fundamental restructuring, the cycle of conflict is unlikely to end, and the region will remain a flashpoint for instability. However, with a global system that often profits from regional instability, achieving this transformation remains a distant prospect.

The Reality Check

In the end, while the pudding may be on the table, the question remains — does the world, particularly the West, truly want peace in South Asia, or is the status quo too lucrative to abandon? Until this question is resolved, thresholds will continue to be tested, and the reasons to test check war machines becomes routine.

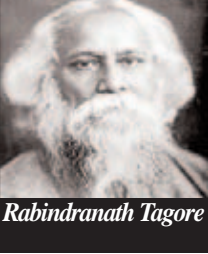

Operation Sindoor: A decisive victory in modern warfare

India has not declared Operation Sindoor completely over. What exists now is a sensitive halt in operations—some may call it a ceasefire, but military leaders have deliberately avoided that word. From a warfighting perspective, this is not merely a pause; it is a strategic hold following a rare and unambiguous military victory.

After just four days of calibrated military action, it is objectively conclusive: India achieved a massive victory. Operation Sindoor met and exceeded its strategic aims—destroying terrorist infrastructure, demonstrating military superiority, restoring deterrence, and unveiling a new national security doctrine. This was not symbolic force. It was decisive power, clearly applied.

India was attacked. On April 22, 2025, 26 Indian civilians, mostly Hindu tourists, were massacred in Pahalgam, Jammu & Kashmir. The Resistance Front (TRF), an offshoot of the Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), claimed responsibility. As has been the case for decades, the group is backed by Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI).

But unlike previous attacks, this time India didn't wait. It didn't appeal for international mediation or issue a diplomatic demarche. It launched warplanes.

On May 7, India initiated Operation Sindoor, a swift and precisely calibrated military campaign. The Indian Air Force struck nine terrorist infrastructure targets inside Pakistan, including headquarters and operational hubs for Jaish-e-Mohammed and Lashkar-e-Taiba. The message was clear: terror attacks launched from Pakistani soil will now be treated as acts of war.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi made the new doctrine unmistakable: "India will not tolerate any nuclear blackmail. India will strike precisely and decisively at the



terrorist hideouts developing under the cover of nuclear blackmail."

More than a retaliation, this was the unveiling of a strategic doctrine. As Modi said, "Terror and talks can't go together. Water and blood can't flow together."

Operation Sindoor was executed in deliberate phases:

- May 7: Nine precision strikes were launched deep into Pakistani territory. Targets included key terror training camps and logistics nodes in Bahawalpur, Muridke, Muzaffarabad, and elsewhere.
- May 8: Pakistan retaliated with a massive drone swarm across India's western states. India's multi-layered

air defense network—domestically built and augmented by Israeli and Russian systems—neutralized nearly all of them.

- May 9: India escalated with additional strikes on six Pakistani military airbases and UAV coordination hubs.
- May 10: A temporary halt in firing was reached. India did not call it a ceasefire. The Indian military referred to it as a "stoppage of firing"—a semantic but deliberate choice that reinforced its strategic control of the situation.

This wasn't just tactical success. It was doctrinal execution under live fire. India showcased its ability to strike any target in Pakistan at will—terror sites, drone coordination hubs, even airbases. Meanwhile, Pakistan was unable to penetrate a single defended area inside India. That is not parity. That is overwhelming superiority. And that is how real deterrence is established.

Strategic Effects Achieved

1. A New Red Line Was Drawn—and Enforced Terror attacks from Pakistani soil will now be met with military force. That's not a threat. It's precedent.

2. Military Superiority Demonstrated

India showcased its ability to strike any target in Pakistan at will—terror sites, drone coordination hubs, even airbases. Meanwhile, Pakistan was unable to penetrate a single defended area inside India. That is not parity. That is overwhelming superiority. And that is how real deterrence is established.

3. Restored Deterrence

India retaliated forcefully but stopped short of full war. The controlled escalation sent a clear deterrent signal: India will respond, and it controls the pace.

4. Asserted Strategic Independence

India handled this crisis without seeking international mediation. It enforced doctrine on sovereign terms, using sovereign means.

Operation Sindoor was not about occupation or regime change. It was limited war executed for specific objectives. Critics who argue India should have gone further miss the point. Strategic success isn't about the scale of destruction—it's about achieving the desired political effect.

India was not fighting for vengeance. It was fighting for deterrence. And it worked.

India's restraint is not weakness—it is maturity. It imposed costs, redefined thresholds, and retained escalation dominance. India didn't just respond to an attack. It changed the strategic equation.

In an age where many modern wars spiral into open-ended occupations or political confusion, Operation Sindoor stands apart. This was a demonstration of

disciplined military strategy: clear goals, aligned ways and means, and adaptive execution in the face of unpredictable escalation. India absorbed a blow, defined its objective, and achieved it—all within a contained timeframe.

The use of force in Operation Sindoor was overwhelming yet controlled—precise, decisive, and without hesitation. That kind of clarity is rare in modern war. In an era defined by "forever wars" and cycles of violence without strategic direction, Sindoor stands apart. It offers a model of limited war with clearly defined ends, matched ways and means, and a state that never relinquished the initiative.

The India of 2008 absorbed attacks and waited. This India hits back—immediately, precisely, and with clarity.

Modi's doctrine, India's advancing domestic defense industry, and the professionalism of its armed forces all signal a country no longer preparing for the last war. It is preparing for the next one.

The halt in operations is not the end of Operation Sindoor. It is a pause. India holds the initiative. If provoked again, it will strike again.

This is deterrence restored. This is a new doctrine revealed. And it should be studied by all nations confronting the scourge of state-sponsored terrorism.

Operation Sindoor was a modern war—fought under the shadow of nuclear escalation, with global attention, and within a limited objective framework. And by every measure that matters, it was a strategic success—and a decisive Indian victory.

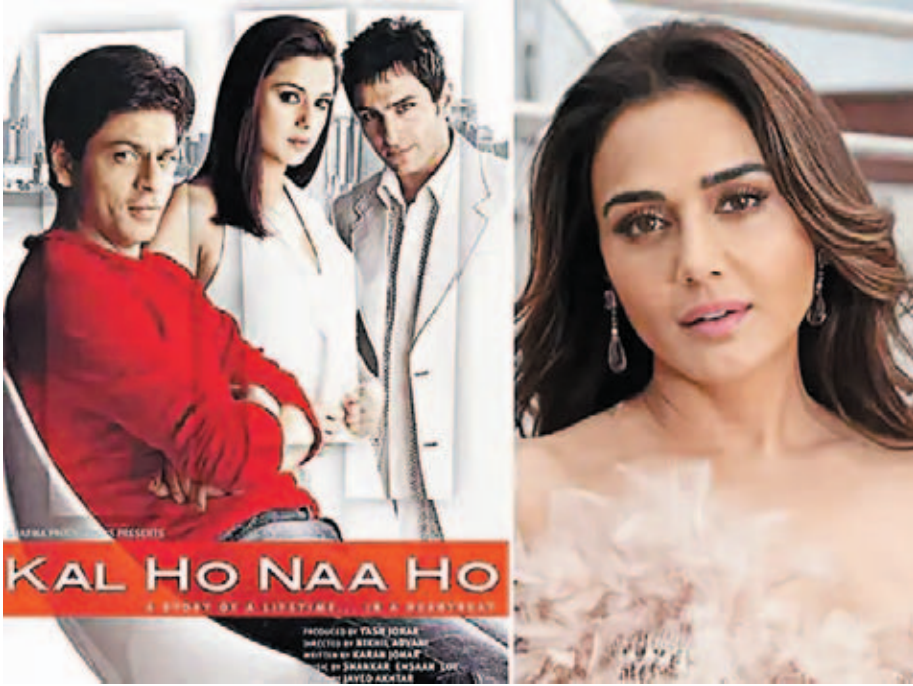

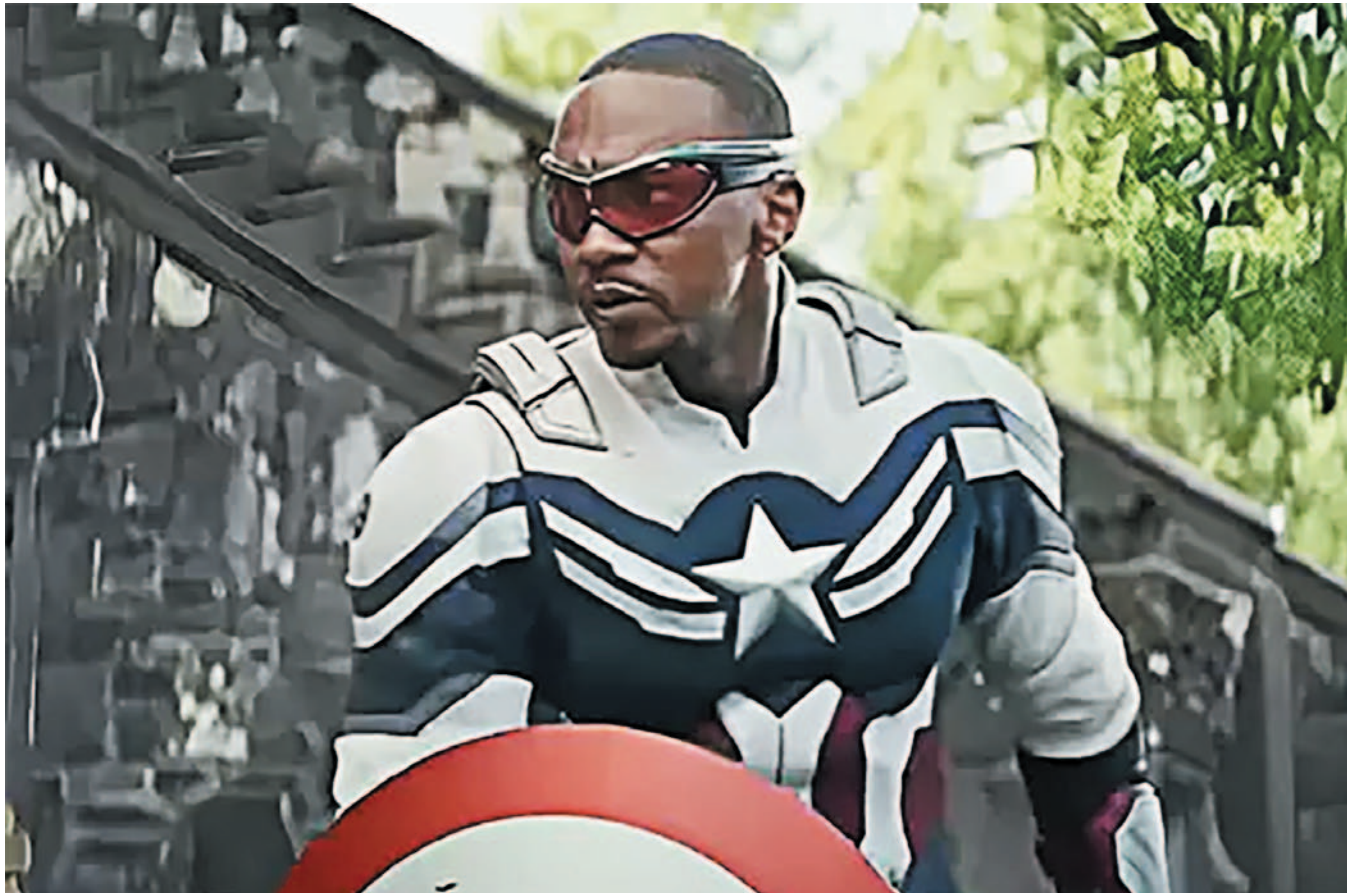
