EAM Jaishankar embarks on 3-nation visit today

NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will embark on a six-day visit of the Netherlands, Denmark and Germany beginning Monday during which he is expected to highlight Pakistan's relentless support to cross-border terrorism

It will be Jaishankar's first foreign visit after the fourday-long military confrontation between Indian and Pakistani armed forces. "External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will pay an official visit to the Netherlands. Denmark and Germany from May 19 to 24," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Sunday.

Associate professor arrested for social media posts on **Operation Sindoor**

SONIPAT: Ashoka University's head of the political science department, Ali Khan Mahmudabad, was arrested on Sunday after two FIRs were lodged on stringent charges, including endangering sovereignty and integrity, for his social media posts related to Operation Sindoor, police and his lawyer said. The arrest comes days after the Haryana State Commission for Women sent a notice to the assistant professor questioning his remarks, though Mahmudabad had maintained that they were "misunderstood" and asserted that he had exercised his fundamental right to freedom of speech. "Ali Khan Mahmudabad has been arrested in Delhi," Assistant Commissioner of Police, Rai, Ajeet Singh said

Eight children among 17 killed in Hyderabad building fire

UNI HYDERABAD, MAY 18

At least 17 people, including eight children and five women, have died after a massive fire broke out in a building near Hyderabad's iconic Charminar this morning. While the cause of the fire is not confirmed yet, it is suspected that a short circuit may have led to the tragedy.

According to the Telangana State Disaster Response and Fire Services Department, the fire was reported at 6:16 AM at a G+2 building located at Gulzar House Chowrasta, Charminar. A water tender and crew from the Moghalpura fire station were the first to respond. The fire originated on the ground floor and

quickly spread to the upper floors. Simultaneous firefighting, search, and rescue operations were launched. Seventeen individuals who were trapped on the first floor were rescued by fire department personnel and shifted to hospitals for treatment. To overcome access limitations and expedite the rescue, assistance was requested from additional fire stations. A total of 12 fire appliances responded to the scene.

In all, 11 firefighting vehicles, one advanced fire-fighting robot, 17 fire officers, and 70 personnel were deployed in the operation. It took approximately two hours to bring the blaze under control. The Bronto Skylift hydraulic platform and fire robot played a critical role in the

The cause of the fire is currently under investigation. The value of the property damage is yet to be assessed.

The deceased were identified as Prahlad (70), Munni (70), Rajendar Modi



(31), Sheetal (35), Priyansh (4), Iraaj (2), Arushi (3), Rishabh (4), Pratham (1.5 years), Anuyan (3), Varsha (35), Pankaj (36) Rajini (32) and Iddu (4)

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy expressed deep shock over the incident and ordered immediate rescue and relief measures. He directed senior officials to ensure the best medical treatment for the injured and full support for the victims' families. The CM also personally spoke to some vic-

charge Minister Ponnam Prabhakar to oversee the response. Minister Ponnam Prabhakar visited the site and gathered details from Fire Department Director General Nagi Reddy and South Zone DCP Sneha Mishra. He stated that the fire alert was received at 0616 hours and the teams responded promptly. Though many victims were critically injured by the time help arrived, the swift response helped prevent further loss of life.

PM Modi expresses grief

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said he was "deeply anguished" by the loss of lives in the fire at a building at Hyderabad's Gulzar House early this morning. According to fire department sources, 17 people died in the fire that broke out in a building at the Gulzar House near Charminal in Hyderabad early this morning. The PM also announced an ex gratia, of Rs 2 lakh and Rs 50,000 to those injured in the mishap, from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund to the kin of the deceased as per the Prime Minister's Office. In a post on X, the Prime Minister's Office wrote, "Deeply anguished by the loss of lives due to a fire tragedy in Hyderabad, Telangana. Condolences to those who have lost their loved ones. May the injured recover soon.

ISRO's 101st rocket launch fails, **Earth-observation satellite lost**

SRIHARIKOTA, MAY 18

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Sunday launched its 101st satellite, EOS-09, aboard the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV-C61), but it failed minutes later.

The 101st launch was done with PSLV-C61, carrying an Earth Observation Satellite, named as EOS-09, that chronous Polar Orbit (SSPO). However, the EOS-09 mission could not be accomplished According to the ISRO Chief, the PSLV 4-stage vehicle, and performance was normal till

EOS-09 is an advanced Earth observation satellite equipped with C-band synthetic aperture radar technology. It can capture high-resolution images of the Earth's surface under all weather conditions, day or night. This capability enhances India's surveillance and management systems across multiple

Earlier on Saturday, Scientist W Selvamurthy congratulated the ISRO scientists, technicians, industries associated with the space organisation for the launch of the satellite. Underlining the satellites' importance, he mentioned that EOS-09 is part of a constellation of satellites which will have applications in griculture, forestry, disaster management, or even for strategic and military appli-

late the ISRO scientists, technicians, industries associated with ISRO for this important satellite being launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota. It is a very important satellite because it forms a part of a constellation of satellites which can look at Earth and what changes are happening on Earth. Investigating Odisha YouTuber's links with alleged 'Pak Spy' Jyoti Malhotra: Police



BHUBANESWAR: The Odisha Police have started an investigation into alleged links between a Puri-based YouTuber and Jyoti Malhotra, who was arrested on the charge of passing on sensitive information to Pakistani intelligence operatives, an officer said on Sunday The police found that Malhotra, who runs the YouTube channel 'Travel with Jo' and lives in Hisar in Haryana, visited Puri in September 2024 and came in contact with a woman in the coastal town, who is also a YouTuber, Puri Superintendent of Police (SP) Vinit Agrawal said. Ms Jvoti, whose YouTube channel and Instagram account have 3.77 lakh subscribers and 1.33 lakh followers, respectively, allegedly was in contact with a Pakistani officer working at the Pakistan High Commission in Delhi. On May 13, India expelled that Pakistani official for allegedly indulging in espionage. The woman in Puri also travelled to Kartarpur Sahib Gurdwara in Paki stan recently, the SP said. "We found that Jyoti Malhotra visited Puri last year, and we are verifying the fact. Anything more can be shared after the verification," Mr Agrawal said. On whether the woman from Puri shared intelligence inputs with Ms Malhotra, Mr Agrawal said. "The Haryana Police are investigating the matter and we are providing them the required assistance.

Final preparations underway at Nathula for Kailash Mansarovar Yatra

AGENCY NATHULA PASS, MAY 18

The Kailash Mansarovar Yatra is all set to resume through Nathula from June this year, marking the end of a five-year suspension caused by the Doklam standoff in 2017 and the COVID-19 pandemic, for which the route through the Indo-China border in Sikkim is undergoing final preparations, with infrastructure development nearing completion. According to Sunil Kumar, Labour In-charge of the construction works, the renovation and reconstruction of acclimatisation centres is expected to be completed within the next four to five days."The Kailash Mansarovar Yatra is going to start soon. The reno-



vation and reconstruction of acclimatisation centres are expected to be completed within the next four to five days. Acclimatisation centres are being established along the route. A total of 50-60 people will be

92 entry, exit points sealed to keep vigil around drug smugglers & bootleggers



Larji Power Project restored and fully operational once again

126 MW Hydroelectric Power Project in Kullu district has been restored and is operational once again, which suffered extensive damage by the devastating Beas River floods on 9th and 10th July 2023. The project's swift revival, completed in less than two years, was made possible through the timely intervention and strong support of the State Government, helping avert major financial losses.

Under the leadership of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, the State Government allocated Rs. 25 crore initially for restoration, followed by Rs. 35 crore and subsequently Rs. 185.87 crore for the



and staff of the Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board Limited (HPSEBL) for their tireless efforts and commitment to restore the project.

Thanks dedication, Unit I of the Larji Power Project was restarted on 15 January 2024 and synchronized with the power grid on 2 May 2024. Unit II followed on 9 August 2024 and Unit III was restored on 17 January 2025. With all three turbines now operational, the project has fully resumed power generation. The flood had caused heavy deposition of muck deep inside the turbine units, rendering them inoperable for

removal was not feasible, the debris was painstakingly cleared by manual effort. To safeguard the project from future natural calamities, several preventive measures have been implemented. Slope stabilization work, including the installation of cable nets and rockfall barriers, has been completed near the surge shaft gates and underway at the powerhouse entrance to mitigate risks from landslides and falling debris.

Additionally, a Hinged Gate has been installed at the Main Access Tunnel (MAT) to prevent water ingress during high floods. A similar gate is being constructed at the Emergency Exit Tunnel (EET), with supporting civil works to ensure a secure, watertight system.

Civil warriors

Gaza deadliest place for children: UNICEF

he childrens-fund">United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has warned that the Gaza Strip has become the most dangerous place in the world for children, with no safe areas remaining, following the deaths of over 45 past two days alone amid ongoing Israeli attacks Edouard Beigbeder, UNICEF Regional Director for the Middle East and North Africa, stated that children are being targeted in locations that should be safe. such as hospitals, schools, shelters and even displacement tents. He stressed that over the past 19 months. Gaza has become increasing ly deadly for children. Beigbeder revealed that more than 950 Palestinian



children have been killed by airstrikes in the last two months, while those who remain face severe hardships, including relentless bombardment and extreme shortages of food, water and basic healthcare. He added that the blockade on humanitarian aid is worsening the crisis, noting that the dangers to children extend beyond bombs and bullets to include hunger, disease and contami-

nated water.Beigbeder emphasised that violations of children's rights have become systematic and daily occurrences, calling for urgent international action to end these abuses and ensure the protection of children from violence and loss of life.He renewed UNICEF's call for an immediate ceasefire, respect for international humanitarian law, unimpeded humanitarian access.

Taiwan completes initial tests of Tien Kung IV missiles

Taiwan has completed the initial operation evaluation and limited field testing of its military's new Tien Kung IV (Sky Bow IV) missiles, as reported by Taipei Times on Sunday. Citing a defence official, Taipei Times said that the Tien Kung IV missile is expected to be mass-produced from next year.

The missiles, which have been created by the Chungshan Institute of Science and Technology's Strong Bow program, is a new air defence weapon with a maximum altitude of 70km, a source told Taipei Times on condition of anonymity.Notably, this marks a significant improvement over the previous Tien Kung III and the



PAC-3 Missile Segment Enhancement systems, which have maximum altitudes of 45km and 60km respectively, the sources cited said. This latest advancement allows Tien Kung IV to intercept high-flying cruise missiles and ballistic missiles with a higher probability of success. Although the quantity of Tien


Kung IV systems to be purchased is yet to be decided, it was reported that the Tien Kung III system's mass production would cease early next year, as its NT USD 27.4 billion (USD 908.1 million) budget is expected to be all but exhausted by December, as per sources referred to by Taipei Times.

India has restricted imports worth USD 770 mn from Bangladesh

India's restrictions on imports from Bangladesh via land ports will impact goods worth USD 770 million, accounting for nearly 42 per cent of total bilateral imports, according to the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) report, a trade-focused research Group. Union Ministry of Commerce and Industry on Saturday imposed immediate port restrictions on the import of several categories of goods from Bangladesh, following a directive issued by the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT).

After this decision, key goods like garments, processed foods, and plastic items are now limited to select sea ports or barred from land routes entirely. Under the new policy, Bangladeshi garments, which are valued at USD 618 million annually, can now enter India only through two designated seaports, effectively barring access via land routes that previously served as primary trade arteries. The decision will severely impact Bangladesh's most lucra-



tive export channel to India, the GTRI added. Indian textile manufacturers have long voiced concern over what they describe as unfair advantages enjoyed by Bangladeshi competitors, who benefit

from duty-free imports of Chinese fabric and substantial government export subsidies.

These factors reportedly give Bangladeshi exporters a 10-15 per cent pricing edge in the Indian market. The GTRI added in its report that these trade measures did not emerge in isolation. "The restrictions look like India's response to Dhaka restricting imports from India on a large number of items and diplomatic pivot towards China," the GTRI report added.

The move is also possibly being seen as a response to controversial remarks by Bangladesh's interim chief advisor, Muhammad Yunus.During a speech in China, Bangladesh's Chief Adviser Yunus had described India's northeastern states as a "landlocked region with no access to the ocean". This comment has sparked diplomatic friction, with Indian officials viewing it as undermining the region's connectivity and status. Highlighting Dhaka's increasing proximity with China, the report adds that the fall of Sheikh Hasina's pro-India government in mid-2024 and the rise of an interim administration under Muhammad Yunus have brought a willingness to align with Beijing.

Yunus's visit to China in March 2025 yielded USD 2.1 billion in new investments and cooperation agreements. All these developments, along with infrastructure projects like the Teesta River development, have posed a significant threat to India's position in the region. Since late 2024, Bangladesh has imposed a series of restrictions on Indian exports.

These include an April 2025 ban on Indian yarn imports through five major land ports, tighter curbs on rice shipments, and import bans on dozens of Indian goodsfrom paper and tobacco to fish and powdered milk.

Adding to the friction, Dhaka introduced a transit fee of 1.8 taka per tonne per kilometre on Indian goods moving through its territory. The report added that these cumulative actions, along with operational delays and tightened port inspections, have hampered Indian exporters and triggered calls for a calibrated response.

With their playoff hopes hanging by a thread, Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) will look to stay in contention when they take on a struggling Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH) in Match 61 of the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025 at the Bharat Ratna Shri Atal Vajpayee Ekana Cricket Stadium here on Monday. LSG, placed seventh with 10 points from 11 matches, can ill afford another slip-up. A fourth consecutive defeat would all but knock them out of playoff contention. In contrast, SRH have already been eliminated a disappointing campaign, winning just three of their eleven games so far.

Despite their recent form slump, LSG will draw confidence from their earlier 5-wicket win over Hyderabad this season, and more importantly, from their familiarity with the sluggish Ekana track, where spin and slower deliveries often

Mitchell Marsh, Nicholas Pooran, and Aiden Markram remain the cornerstone of Lucknow's batting. Marsh has led from the front with 378 runs at a strike rate of 155.



Pooran has been even more explosive, amassing 410 runs at a staggering 201 strike rate. Markram, with 348 runs, has anchored the middle overs in recent outings. However, concerns linger around the form of Rishabh Pant and David Miller, who have both struggled to make significant contributions. Ayush Badoni and Abdul Samad, though, have chipped in with lateorder cameos that have helped LSG post or chase competitive totals. On the bowling front, Digvesh Rathi has been the standout performer for LSG

with 12 wickets in as many

games at an economy of 8.09. Avesh Khan and Akash Singh have provided support with pace, while Ravi Bishnoi will be eager to rediscover his rhythm after an expensive run in the tournament.



A Brilliant bowling performance from left-arm spinner Harpreet Brar guided the Punjab Kings (PBKS) team to victory over the Rajasthan Royals (RR) by 10 runs at the Sawai Mansingh Stadium on Sunday.

With this win, the Punjab side moved to the second spot (17 points in 12 games), on the other hand, the Rajasthan team slipped to the ninth position (6 points in 13 matches) in the IPL 2025 points table.

Chasing a mammoth total of 220 runs, the Rajasthan Royals openers Yashasvi Jaiswal (50 runs off 25 balls) and Vaibhav Suryavanshi (40 runs from 15 balls) started attacking the bowlers from the first over.

The Sanju Samson-led side touched the 550-run mark in the third over as Jaiswal slammed a boundary on the penultimate ball of

Both batters were dealing in sixes and fours. Jaiswal and Suryavanshi scored 67 runs in 25 balls before running for a single.

The first wicket fell in the fifth over at the score of 76 as Suryavanshi was sent back to the

After the fall of the first wicket, team skipper Sanju Samson came out to bat alongside Jaiswal. The Rajasthan-based



Nehal Wadhera's fifty led PBKS' innings.

completed the 100-run mark in the 8th over.

In the 11th over, the Royals lost the second wicket as Jaiswal was sent back to the dressing room on the bowling of Brar. Following his dismissal, Riyan Parag came to bat.

Samson (20 runs in 16 balls), Parag (13 runs off 11 balls), and left-hand batter Shimron Hetmyer (11 runs from 12 balls) were unable to make their mark in the game. Dhruv Jurel (53 runs in 31 balls) scored some crucial runs for the side, but it was not enough to take his team over the line.

For the PBKS side, three wickets were snapped by Brar (3/22 in 4 overs), and two wickets each were grabbed by Marco Jansen (2/41 in 3 overs) and Azmatullah Omarzai (2/44 in 4 overs) in their respective spells.

Earlier, after winning the toss and opting to bat first, openers Prabhsimran Singh and Priyansh Arya started by striking some boundaries. However, Tushar Deshpande got Priyansh for nine in seven deliveries, with Shimron Hetmyer taking a catch at mid-off. PBKS was 19/1 in 1.5 overs.

Debutant Mitchell Owen joined Prabhsimran. While Prabhsimran continued his rich run of form by attacking Kwena Maphaka, Owen was dismissed by the South African U19 star for a two-ball duck, with skipper Sanju Samson taking a catch. RR was 34/2 in three overs.

Deshpande just could not be kept out of action as he removed Prabhsimran for 21 in 10 balls, with three fours and a six. PBKS is 34/3 in 3.1 overs.

Towards the final few balls of the powerplay, skipper Shreyas Iyer and Nehal Wadhera collected some boundaries against RR pace, with PBKS bringing up their 50-run mark in 5.2 overs. At the end of six overs, PBKS was 58/3, with Nehal (11*) and Shreyas (13*) unbeaten.

Nehal and Iyer continued to strike one odd boundary or two every over, with the left-handed batter doing well against spinners Riyan Parag and Wanindu Hasaranga. Their half-century stand

was up in 34 balls.
At the end of 10 overs, PBKS was 97/3, with Nehal (37*) and

Shreyas (26*) unbeaten. The 100-run mark was up for PBKS in 10.2 overs, thanks to a fine four by Iyer against Parag. However, the PBKS skipper was caught at long-off by Yashasvi Jaiswal on the next ball for 30 in 25 balls, with five fours. PBKS was

101/4 in 10.3 overs. Nehal was joined by Shashank Singh at the crease and the duo looted 17 runs from Akash Madhwal in the 13th over, with a four by Shashank and a four and six by Wadhera, who reached his fourth IPL fifty in 25 balls, with five fours and three sixes.

At the end of 15 overs, PBKS was 147/4 with Shashank (18*) and Nehal (63*) unbeaten.

A low catch from Hetmyer in the 16th over gave Madhwal the scalp of Nehal for 70 in 37 balls, with five fours and five sixes. PBKS was 159/5 in 16 overs.

In the next over, Shashank made a meal out of Fazalhaq Farooqi, smashing him for two fours and a six, with him and Azmatullah Omarzai looting 18 runs from his over. It was Omarzai's turn to be the aggressor, as he hit

Maphaka for two fours and a six. PBKS reached the 200-run mark in 18.5 overs.

In the final over, Shashank continued his onslaught on Deshpande, bringing up his fourth IPL fifty in 27 balls, with four boundaries and three sixes. PBKS ended their innings at 219/5, with Shashank (59* in 30 balls, with five boundaries and three sixes) and Omarzai (21* in nine balls, with three fours and a six).

Deshpande (2/37) was the lead bowler for RR. Maphaka, Parag and Madhwal got a wicket
