**15-year-old girl

MEERUT (UP): A 15-year-old girl was allegedly raped inside a medical college here while she was admitted for a leg operation with the police on Monday saying that the accused has been arrested. The girl was raped by the attendant of another patient in a toilet of the medical college on the night of June 20, police said. Senior Superintendent of Police Vipin Tada told a news agency that the local Medical police station registered the FIR on the complaint of the girl's mother and arrested the accused on Sunday night.

**IRCTC to serve
Kashmiri vegetarian
cuisine on Katra-
Srinagar Vande
Bharat train**

NEW DELHI: The IRCTC has decided to serve Kashmiri vegetarian cuisine to passengers travelling on the Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat train from the second week of July. "We are working out a plan to serve local cuisine on the Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat train and it is expected to start from the second week of July," Anand Kumar Jha, Additional General Manager, IRCTC, told a news agency. "Popular local cuisine, such as amla kaddu, babru, Jammu paratha in breakfast and paneer chaman, Kashmiri dum aloo and Jammu rajma in lunch, will be served to those who wish to try the flavour of local food during their Katra-Srinagar train ride," an IRCTC official said.

**Sensex drops
500 pts**

MUMBAI: Stock market benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty tumbled on Monday, as intensifying tensions in the Middle East after the US bombed three major nuclear sites in Iran unnerved investors. Besides, selling pressure in IT, tech and auto stocks amid elevated global crude prices dented market sentiments, traders said. After losing over 900 points in day trade, the 30-share index recovered some lost ground to close with a loss of 511.38 points or 0.62 per cent at 81,896.79.

smuggling
racket busted
in Delhi, 6 held**

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Police on Monday claimed to have busted a racket siphoning off aviation turbine fuel from tankers meant for the international airport here and selling those in the open market as mineral turpentine oil, causing monthly loss of over Rs 1.62 crore to the national exchequer. The illegal operation — running for over three years — was uncovered following a tip-off received on Sunday, and led to the arrest of six people and detention of two others. The racket is said to be causing a loss of over Rs 1.62 crore to the exchequer every month, with an estimated 5,000 litres of fuel being stolen daily.

Israel continues to strike Iran's Fordo nuclear site, Evin prison

Israel hit Iranian government targets in Tehran on Monday (June 23, 2025) in a series of strikes that followed a salvo of missiles and drones fired by Iran at Israel as fighting between the two foes raged for the 11th day.

Israel's Defence Ministry said it hit targets including the notorious Evin Prison in the Iranian capital and the security headquarters of the paramilitary Revolutionary Guards.

Iran's underground enrichment site at Fordo, which was one of those hit in Sunday's attack by the U.S. on three nuclear facilities, was also struck again.

Aerial assaults raged between the two foes early Monday, while Tehran vowed retaliation over the bunker-buster bombs American warplanes unleashed at the weekend on three nuclear sites.

US President Donald Trump insisted the attack had "obliterated" Iran's nuclear capabilities, but other officials said it was too soon to determine how significantly Tehran's nuclear programme had been impacted.

Iran lashed out at the U.S. for crossing "a very big red line" with its risky gambit to launch strikes on three Iranian nuclear sites with missiles and the bunker-buster bombs. Amid fears of a wider regional conflict, the Trump administration sent a clear message that



it wanted to restart diplomatic talks with Iran. Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth told reporters that the US "does not seek war" with Iran. But Tehran said the time for diplomacy had passed and that it had the right to defend itself.

Iran's Military warns Trump of retaliation

TEHRAN: Iran's military on Monday warned US President Donald Trump of powerful retaliatory operations against the United States, saying America's direct attacks on Iranian nuclear sites have expanded the range of "legitimate targets" for the Iranian armed forces. Addressing US President Donald Trump directly, Ebrahim Zolfaghari, the spokesperson of Iran's Military Central Command, said in English: "Gambler Trump, you can start this war, but we will be the ones who end it." The United States' direct involvement in the conflict expands the range of legitimate targets for the Iranian armed forces, Iran's military central command spokesperson said on Monday. The remarks followed a series of US airstrikes on Iran's three key nuclear installations— underground uranium enrichment site at Fordo, along with nuclear facilities in Isfahan and Natanz— with Trump insisting the attack had "obliterated" Tehran's nuclear capabilities.

Air India was forced to cancel its scheduled flight from Thiruvananthapuram to Delhi on Sunday after the aircraft suffered a bird hit on its inbound journey from the national capital. Air India Flight AI 2455 from Thiruvananthapuram to Delhi on Sunday was cancelled. The cancellation was triggered after Air India flight AI 2454 from Delhi to Thiruvananthapuram reported a suspected bird hit upon landing. An Air India spokesperson said, "Air India regrets to inform that flight AI 2455, from Thiruvananthapuram to Delhi, on 22 June 2025, is cancelled due to extended engineering checks after a suspected bird hit was detected after the aircraft



landed safely in Thiruvananthapuram. The inconvenience caused to our passengers due to this unforeseen disruption is sincerely regretted, and every effort is being made to minimise it, including providing accommodation to passengers. Refunds on cancellation or complimentary rescheduling are also

Jammu bound flight returns to Delhi without landing

JAMMU: An Air India Express flight from Delhi to Srinagar via Jammu returned to its origin airport before landing here on Monday afternoon, officials said. It was, however, not known immediately what led the flight to return to Delhi, they said. The officials said that the flight IX-2564 was supposed to land in Jammu around noon before leaving for Srinagar.

5-day remand for two arrested in Pahalgam terror attack case

A Jammu court on Monday granted the National Investigation Agency (NIA) a five-day remand of the two accused arrested earlier in connection with the ghastly Pahalgam terror attack case. The two accused, identified as Parvaiz Ahmad and Bashir Ahmed, were brought to a Jammu court, where the Additional District and Session Judge granted the NIA a five-day remand and set the next hearing date as June 27, 2025. The NIA arrested the two individuals in connection

with the Pahalgam terror attack case, officials said on Sunday. According to the officials, the two accused were identified as Parvaiz Ahmad and Bashir Ahmed and have been arrested for allegedly harbouring terrorists involved in the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam that claimed 26 civilian lives. Earlier, on Sunday, PDP leader Iltija Mufti appealed to the Central government to arrest the perpetrators of the Pahalgam terror attack and stated that tourism halted in Pahalgam, "crippling" the economy of Jammu and Kashmir.

Landslide on Yamunotri walking route; 1 injured, 2 feared trapped

One person sustained injuries and two others are feared to be trapped following a landslide that struck the Yamunotri walking route at Nau Kanchi in Uttarakashi district of Uttarakhand, officials said on Monday. Local authorities have launched a rescue operation to locate and extricate those feared trapped under the debris. "One person has been injured in the landslide incident on the Yamunotri walking route. Two people are feared to be trapped un-

der the debris. Rescue work is going on at the spot," Garhwal Divisional Commissioner Vinay Shankar Pandey said.

Uttarakashi District Magistrate Prashant Arya told ANI that the person injured in the landslide incident at Nau Kanchi on the footpath to Yamunotri Dham, who is a resident of Mumbai, has been admitted to Janakichatti Primary Health Center for treatment. The DM said that SDRF, NDRF, police and administration personnel are engaged in relief work on the spot. Further details awaited.

KL Rahul, Pant score classy tons to steer India to 298 at Tea against England

Historic centuries from KL Rahul and Rishabh Pant helped India reassert their dominance over England, with the visitors increasing their lead against the hosts to 304 runs at the end of the second session on the fourth day of the first Test at Leeds. At Tea, India were 298/4, with KL Rahul (120*) and Karun Nair (4*) unbeaten. Pant scored 118 runs in the second innings, his second ton in the match, and consolidated the innings with a crucial 195-run partnership with KL Rahul. India started the second session at 153/3, with Pant (31*) and KL (72*) unbeaten. During this session, India displayed a much more positive intent, with Pant smashing two fours off Josh Tongue, while KL got two boundar-



ies against Shoaib Bashir. Pant reached his half-century in 83 balls, with eight fours and liberated himself further with two sixes against Bashir. India reached the 200-run mark in 57.4 overs. The duo reached their century stand in 193 balls. Pant and Rahul collected boundaries against pace and spin alike, with Pant displaying the ruthlessness India needed after a low-scoring first session. Rahul got to his ninth Test hundred and third in England, in 202 balls, with 13 fours. After a first innings knock of 42, he was finally able to get a big score. A pull shot on a Brydon Carse delivery in the 65th over by Rahul took India to 250-run mark in 64.1 overs. The 71st over by Joe Root proved to be a massive one for India as Pant hit him for two fours and a six, collecting 19 runs in total.

Deputy Mayor Mohali Kuljit Singh Bedi has written an urgent letter to Deputy Commissioner, Mohali regarding the increasing jhuggis in Mohali and the heavy infrastructure pressure due to it. He warned that if immediate and proper action is not taken, a serious law and order crisis could arise in Mohali. The Deputy Mayor said that while Chandigarh administration is consistently seen taking strict action against illegal encroachments, Mohali administration is extremely slow and negligent in this regard. Due to this, illegal encroachments are continuously seen increasing in Mohali. The Deputy Mayor informed that recently Chandigarh administration took action on illegal jhuggis near Phase 2, after which the jhuggi dwellers have moved towards many colonies of Mohali like Amb Sahib Colony, Udham Singh Colony, Jagatpura, Badmajra and other areas. The growing population of these jhuggi dwellers has put serious pressure on the area's basic infrastructure like water, electricity, sanitation and security. He said that this is not only a problem of increasing jhuggis, but in future it can become a big challenge affecting rising crime, employment



shortage and the lives of common residents. Bedi also said that new jhuggis have already settled in Badmajra, which indicates the seriousness of the situation. Through his letter, the Deputy Mayor has placed five main demands which include immediate survey of all jhuggi settlements in Mohali, police verification of new jhuggi dwellers, structural prevention to stop new jhuggis from settling, strict monitoring by GMADA and municipal administration, and demand to prepare a plan about rehabilitation policy of jhuggi dwellers to make legal housing arrangements for the needy. Kuljit Singh Bedi informed that a copy of the letter has also been sent to GMADA Chief Administrator and SSP Mohali so that all concerned departments can take immediate action with mutual coordination.

DC orders to keep 50,000 sandbags ready in potential flood-affected areas

To face potential flood-like situations during the upcoming monsoon season, Deputy Commissioner (DC), Sangrur, Mr. Sandeep Rishi has instructed all district-level and lower-level officers not to leave their stations without written permission from him, otherwise a strict departmental action will be taken against officers who violate these instructions.

The DC while holding a meeting with officers from various departments and directed them to complete tasks on time. The meeting was attended by Additional Deputy Commissioner (General), Amit Bambi; Additional Deputy Commissioner (D), Sukhchain Singh Papra, all SDMs, and district heads of various departments.

The Deputy Commissioner said that according to the meteorological department,



monsoon is likely to arrive in Punjab on July 1, and there is a possibility of more rainfall this year than in previous years.

In such a situation, relief work will need to be done immediately if a flood occurs. He directed the officers to work according to the District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) if needed and to keep 50,000 sandbags ready in potential flood-affected areas. He also directed the officers to ensure the cleaning of the Ghaggar river, ponds, sewage, siphons, and drains before the monsoon season.

Rishi made it clear that if water stagnates in cities, the executive officers will be personally responsible. He also directed the Additional Deputy Commissioner (D) to ensure that MGNREGA works are sanctioned and started immediately. The meeting was informed that the Punjab government has provided super suction and jetting machines for cleaning sewage and drains. The DC directed the officers to use these machines effectively and to ensure that all necessary measures are taken to prevent flooding.

Uttarakhand HC stays Panchayat Elections over reservation disputes

The Chief Justice's Bench of the Nainital High Court has stayed the Panchayat elections in the state of Uttarakhand. Two days ago, the State Election Commission announced that it would conduct Panchayat elections in two phases. The Uttarakhand High Court has stayed the notification of Panchayat elections in the state. Reservation-related matters from many places in the state were challenged in the High Court. During the last hearing, the Chief Justice's Bench of the High Court had directed the state government to submit its reply in the matter, on which a detailed reply was submitted by the state government today on



reservation and other matters. After hearing about it, the High Court stayed the Panchayat elections. This comes after Uttarakhand State Election Commissioner Sushil Kumar on Saturday had announced that the Panchayat elections 2025 will be held in two phases across 12 districts, except Haridwar. He also said that the first phase of the 2025 Panchayat elections in

Uttarakhand will be held on July 10, followed by the second phase on July 15. Speaking to ANI, Sushil Kumar said, "In Uttarakhand, with the exception of the Haridwar district, a notification has been issued for the three-tier Panchayat elections 2025 across 12 districts. The counting of votes will occur on 19 July 2025, and the results will be announced thereafter."

Secretary assures gazette notification to resolve stay

NAINITAL: Secretary Panchayati Raj Chandresh Kumar reaffirmed the Uttarakhand government's commitment to resolving the stay on three-tier panchayat elections imposed by the Nainital High Court. SDM advises people to take special care of cleanliness in and around their houses to prevent breeding of mosquitos

SDM Ashok Kumar Munjal advised the public to take special care of cleanliness around their houses, because due to increasing heat, fly-mosquitoes thrive which was very important to do better work to stop these in the house and surrounding. During rainy days, mosquito larvae spread due to excessive growing diseases like vomiting diarrhea and cholera and mosquitoes is the main cause of these diseases such as malaria, dengue, Japanese and brain fever and chikungunya. He said that mosquitoes spreading malaria and other types of fever were bred in stagnant dirty water, while mosquitoes spreading dengue fever breed in clean water. Therefore, all the people should clean their



water tanks thoroughly from time to time. SDM said that it was very important to take precautions to prevent diseases during the rainy season so that people's health can be good. He appealed to the people to always consume clean water, boil water, wash the hands thoroughly before and after eating and after defecation, do not defecate near the sources of drinking water, do not buy rotten items, throat,

chopped and stale foods. He said that to avoid increasing heat, drink sufficient amount of water, use cotton and loose clothes, heat strokes or heat cramps such as weakness, dizziness, headache, seek immediate doctor's advice.

No person should take dengue medicine without a doctor's advice as it can prove to be dangerous for a person's life. He said that it was necessary to have information about the symptoms and prevention of dengue. In such a situation, continuous awareness programs were being organized by the administration to protect them from dengue. He said that all the citizens should keep the water tank clean in their homes. Do not let mosquitoes flourish in coolers, cleaned these regularly.

open-air theatre under construction, Swami Vivekananda School culvert, Gymkhana Club, Professor Colony, Captain, Model Town, Jabbiwala Gurdwara, Sarojini Colony, and Tagore Garden.

Other locations inspected included Buria Gate, Hanuman Gate, Tejli

Gate, Metro Gate, Dhol Wali Pulia, Mohan Nagar, and major drains connecting these areas.

In Yamunanagar zone, areas like Lajpat Nagar, Vijay Nagar Colony, Vishwakarma Chowk, Camp, Old Hamida, Jodiyan, Starch Mill, Sugar Mill Cane Yard, and the ditch drain were also reviewed.

Despite being told by sanitation inspectors that cleaning at most locations was complete, the commissioner insisted on immediate action wherever waste was still visible in the drone footage. He also instructed that drain depths be fully cleared to ensure smooth flow of water.

Tiny tales

We often associate literature with long novels or sprawling epics, but storytelling doesn't always need numerous pages or even many words. The genre of micro-fiction demonstrates that brevity can be as powerful. These miniature literary forms offer an accessible, compelling way to incorporate literature into daily life. In a world of endless scrolling and constant interruption, what better fit than a story that fits in the palm of your hand?

Writers have begun to experiment with ultra-short narratives — some poetic, others jarring, and many hauntingly open-ended. Yet, even as we engage more with bite-sized content, we often reserve reading and writing for longer, set-aside moments. We thereby overlook the value of stories told in passing — on the Metro, during coffee breaks, or just before sleep.

What draws us in isn't the length of a story but its emotional truth, the spark of recognition, and the unexpected twist. Good micro-fiction doesn't shrink the scope of storytelling — it distils it.

Literature connects us to others and to ourselves, even in its shortest form. These brief encounters with fiction allow us to explore life's complexity through distilled, reimagined experiences. No matter how compact, a strong story offers a lens through which we can see the world anew. We're often told that attention span is shrinking but what people crave isn't just speed — it's resonance. If a novel is a ten-course meal and a short story is an expertly crafted sandwich, then micro-fiction is a chocolate truffle: compact, rich, and immensely satisfying.

But micro-fiction is not simply a summary of a larger tale. It's a discipline of its own. Writers must choose each word with precision. Quality micro-fiction delivers character, atmosphere, conflict, and change — often in less than 300 words.

In Micro Fiction: An Anthology of Fifty Really Short Stories, Jerome Stern recalls how short stories once thrived in everyday spaces — magazines, barber-shops, and waiting rooms. These weren't fringe experiments but part of how people engaged with fiction. Today, micro-fiction carries that everyday accessibility while demanding literary skill and subtlety.

One of the most cited examples of the form is the six-word story often (falsely) attributed to Ernest Hemingway: "For sale: baby shoes, never worn." It suggests joy, loss, memory, and grief in six words. The emotional impact lies in what is not said — what the reader imagines in the blank spaces. That's the essence of micro-fiction — implication over explanation.

Anti-war protests in New York

Anti-war protests broke out in New York City on Sunday (local time) as demonstrators took to the streets to condemn the recent US airstrikes on Iranian nuclear facilities, amid heightened security measures across major cities in the United States.

Hundreds of protesters marched through the streets of New York, waving Palestinian flags and holding placards that read "Hands Off Iran" and "Stop The War on Iran", in response to Operation Midnight Hammer – the US-led military action targeting Iran's Fordow, Isfahan, and Natanz nuclear sites. Protesters were also calling out to Israel for initiating the conflict with Iran, as well as their military operation in Gaza.

Earlier in the day, the New York City Police Department (NYPD) stated that it is deploying more resources across key sites in the city to monitor any potential impact as developments unfold in Iran.

In a post on X, the NYPD stated that the additional resources would be deployed to religious, cultural and diplomatic sites throughout the city. The department emphasised that it is coordinating with federal partners as part of precautionary measures. "We're tracking the situation unfolding in Iran. Out of an abundance of caution, we're deploying additional resources to religious, cultural, and diplomatic sites across



NYC and coordinating with our federal partners.

We'll continue to monitor for any potential impact to NYC."The developments follow after US President Donald Trump on Saturday (US local time) said that the United States has launched an attack on three Nuclear sites in Iran.

US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth confirmed the success of the operation launched by the US in Iran on Sunday. During a media briefing with Chairperson of the Joint Chiefs

of Staff Air Force General Dan Caine, Hegseth said that the US had successfully conducted precision strikes in Iran's Fordow, Isfahan, and Natanz. "Last night, on President Trump's order, the US Central Command conducted a precision strike in the middle of the night against three nuclear facilities in Iran - Fordow, Isfahan, and Natanz - in order to destroy or severely degrade Iran's nuclear programme. As Chairman of the Joint Chiefs will demonstrate, it was an incredible and overwhelming success,"

he said. Hegseth said that the orders from the US President and Commander-in-Chief were clear. They 'obliterated' Iran's nuclear ambitions. "The order we received from our Commander-in-Chief was focused, it was powerful, and it was clear.

We devastated the Iranian nuclear program," he said. Hegseth also said that the US did not target Iranian troops or civilians. "But it's worth noting that the operation did not target Iranian troops or the Iranian people," he added.

Mechanism behind life-threatening cancer drug side-effect revealed

New research has found immune changes in cancer patients that could help identify which patients are most at risk of dangerous heart complications from cancer drugs, known as immune checkpoint inhibitors.

The study was led by Assistant Professor Pilar Martin, Head of the Regulatory Molecules of Inflammation Lab at the Spanish National Centre for Cardiovascular Research (CNIC) and group leader at CIBER-CV. She explained, "Immune checkpoint inhibitors have revolutionised cancer treatment, but they can also damage the hearts of some patients. In this study, we monitored how levels of immune cells, which are known to be involved in the development of heart diseases, change after



treatment. "We were surprised to see an early and rapid loss of protective immune cells, called regulatory T cells, after cancer patients started treatment. This suggests a window of vulnerability early in treatment." Assistant Professor Martin continued. The new research is being presented at European Cardio-Oncology 2025, a scientific congress of the European Society of Cardiology.

Immune checkpoint inhibitors are drugs that work by harnessing the patient's own immune response to attack cancer cells. Unfortunately, they can also have side effects, including causing heart damage or cardiotoxicity, in some patients. Approximately 1 in 100 patients treated with these drugs develop myocarditis, a life-threatening heart complication.

Cambodia halts fuel imports from Thailand as border spat escalates

Cambodia has announced putting a stop to all fuel imports from Thailand as relations between the two countries deteriorated in over a decade after a Cambodian soldier was killed last month in a disputed area of the border, local media reported. Prime Minister Hun Manet, in a social media post on Sunday, June 22, said that the measure would take effect at midnight.

This comes amid his Thai counterpart, Paetongtarn Shinawatra's attempts to save her government from a political crisis triggered by a leaked phone call to Cambodian Senate leader Hun Sen. "Starting from midnight tonight, all fuel and gas imports from Thailand will be halted," Cambodian leader Hun Manet said in a Face



book posting late on Sunday, as cited by the country's Khmer Times media outlet. He added that the energy companies could "import sufficiently from other sources to meet domestic fuel and gas demands" in the country.

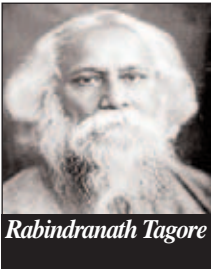
The two South East Asia neighbouring countries have each shut several border crossings after troops exchanged fire on May 28 in the disputed Chong Bok

area, which marks the meeting point of the borders of Cambodia, Thailand and Laos (the Emerald Triangle). Thailand's military has closed the border checkpoint in Chong Sai Taku in its northeastern Buri Ram province following an incident involving a group of Cambodian visitors at a temple in Phanom Dong Rak district in Surin on Saturday, the Bangkok Post reported.

Intermittent fasting matches traditional diets in weight loss benefits, study finds

Intermittent fasting may be just as effective as traditional calorie-restricted diets for helping people lose weight, according to a comprehensive new review published in The BMJ. The study suggests that certain fasting methods, such as alternate-day fasting, might offer slightly greater benefits.

However, researchers caution that longer-term studies are needed to confirm these effects. The findings come amid rising global concern about obesity. As of 2022, the World Health Organisation estimated that around 2.5 billion adults worldwide were overweight, and nearly 900 million were classified as obese. Obesity significantly increases the risk of chronic illnesses like type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and high blood pressure. Intermittent fasting, an eating pattern that involves cycles of fasting and eating, has grown in popularity as an alternative to traditional calorie-counting diets.

However, questions have remained about whether it is equally effective or more beneficial in the long run. To address this, researchers reviewed data from 99 randomised clinical trials involving more than 6,500 adults, most of whom had pre-existing health conditions and an average BMI of 31. The studies lasted anywhere from three to 52 weeks, and covered a variety of intermittent fasting styles, including: Time-restricted eating (e.g., 16:8 method) Alternate day fasting



(24-hour fast every other day) Whole day fasting (e.g., the 5:2 diet) All forms of intermittent fasting and continuous calorie restriction resulted in small weight reductions compared to diets with no calorie control.

Among the fasting types, alternate-day fast-

ing showed the most notable, though still modest, advantage, producing slightly more weight loss than calorie restriction and other intermittent fasting strategies. Compared to continuous calorie restriction, alternate-day fasting led to an average additional weight loss of 1.29 kg. It

also outperformed time-restricted eating and whole-day fasting by 1.69 kg and 1.05 kg, respectively. However, these differences did not meet the minimum threshold of 2 kg, which the study defined as clinically significant for individuals with obesity. In terms of cardiometabolic health,

alternate-day fasting appeared to reduce total and LDL ("bad") cholesterol more effectively than time-restricted eating. Conversely, time-restricted eating was associated with a slight increase in cholesterol compared to whole-day fasting.

No notable improvements were observed in blood sugar levels or HDL ("good") cholesterol for any fasting method. Notably, weight loss was mainly seen in studies lasting less than 24 weeks. Among longer trials (24 weeks or more), benefits were only evident when comparing structured diets to unrestricted eating patterns. The authors acknowledged several limitations, including high variability between the types of fasting, small sample sizes in many studies, and overall low to moderate confidence in the evidence. Nevertheless, this review is among the first to offer a broad comparative view across all major diet strategies using rigorous methods. "The current evidence provides some indication that intermittent fasting diets have similar benefits to continuous energy restriction for weight loss and cardiometabolic risk factors," the study authors concluded, emphasising the need for longer-term research. A linked editorial from experts in Colombia noted that the strength of any dietary plan may lie as much in structure and professional support as in the specific method used.

MC Chandigarh conducts intensive cleaning and anti-encroachment drive in sector 52 and 53



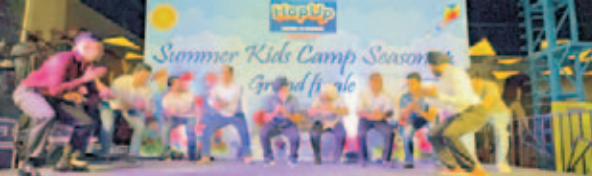

Govt should immediately take back increased electricity rates: Varun Chaudhary

JAIBEER RANA THAMBER BARARA: The BJP government of Haryana has increased electricity prices four times in one go. The common families who had to pay bills of 900 to 1000 rupees are now being given bills of 4000 to 5000 rupees. Ambala Lok Sabha MP Varun Chaudhary said this in a press release. The MP said that on one hand there is the torture of heat along with power cuts for several hours and on the other hand the blow of inflation, ever since the BJP has come to power, people are being crushed in this way. Due to the high electricity rates, people have started getting huge bills. The corporation has also added a fixed charge of Rs 75 per kilowatt to it. That is, now you have to pay Rs 750 extra every month for a 10 kilowatt connection. Earlier the rates were slab wise, that is, for 50 units or more, the cost per unit was Rs 2.50 to Rs 6.30. Now, for a load of more than 5 kilowatts, Rs 6.50 to Rs 7.50 per unit is being charged. Apart from this, the slab-wise electricity rates



have also increased by 20 to 40 paise per unit. Not only this, the slabs made for different categories have also been changed. The increased electricity rates have been quietly implemented from April 1. The MP said that not even a single unit of electricity was generated during the BJP rule. Despite this, this government has been continuously increasing the electricity rates for the last 10 years. During the Congress tenure,

electricity bills worth Rs 1600 crore of common consumers were waived off. But instead of giving any such relief, BJP is busy cutting people's pockets by adding unnecessary charges along with the rate hike. The MP said that the people of the state are already struggling with unemployment, inflation and corruption, on top of that, by increasing the electricity prices four times.
