## 22 Naxalites surrender in Narayanpur

**NARAYANPUR:** As many as 22 Naxalites, who were active in the Abhujmad area and carrying collective rewards of Rs 37.5 lakh, surrendered in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district on Friday, a senior police official said. The cadres, belonging to Kutul, Nelnar and Indravati area committees under the Maad division of Maoists, turned themselves in before senior police, Border Security Force (BSF) and Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) officials here. The surrendered Naxalites told the police that they were disappointed with the "hollow" Maoist ideology and growing internal differences within the banned outfit, Narayanpur Superintendent of Police Robinson Guria said.

## Sensex tanks 690 points on selling in IT, auto stocks

**MUMBAI:** Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty declined for the third session in a row on Friday, dropping nearly 1 per cent, dragged by heavy selling in IT, auto and energy stocks amid a muted start of the earnings season. Tariff-related uncertainties and mixed global market trends also added to the pressure, analysts said. The 30-share BSE Sensex tanked 689.81 points or 0.83 per cent to settle at 82,500.47. During the day, it fell 748.03 points or 0.89 per cent to 82,442.25.

## Karnataka HC stays trial against CM Siddaramaiah

**BENGALURU:** In a significant relief to Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, the Karnataka High Court today stayed trial court proceedings in a criminal defamation case filed by the BJP over the Congress' controversial 'corruption rate card' advertisements released during the 2023 Assembly election campaign. Justice SR Krishna Kumar, while hearing the matter, issued notice to the respondents and granted an interim stay on the trial pending before the lower court. Advocate general Shashi Kiran Shetty, appearing for the Chief Minister, argued that the case was similar to those involving other Congress leaders.

## AAP will go it alone in Bihar assembly polls

**PATNA:** Aam Aadmi Party leader Sanjay Singh on Friday said his party will contest the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections independently, even as he backed INDIA bloc's allegation of voter list manipulation at the behest of the BJP. In a free-wheeling conversation with PTI Videos here, the Rajya Sabha MP also strongly defended his party colleague and Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, who is under fire for ridiculing Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visits to small countries. The AAP leader also claimed that Modi has been given "a big signal" from RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat, who has said that people aged over 75 years.

## Punjab Vidhan Sabha passes resolution to oppose deployment of CISF at dams

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JULY 11

Slamming the Congress and BJP for their divisive policies in the last few decades, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Friday said that the country can witness unprecedented progress in every sphere if both these parties spare the nation.

Participating in the debate on the floor of Punjab Vidhan Sabha on the resolution to oppose deployment of CISF on dams, the Chief Minister said that these political parties had divided the people on sectarian, regional, lingual, communal and other lines due to which states have been at loggerhead with each other. He said that the sole motive of these people have been to vest political power through such misdeeds, which has done irreparable damage to the country and the states. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the country can scale new heights in any field provided these parties spare the country and its people from their nefarious designs.

Citing an example of treacherous motives of these parties, the Chief Minister said that if Modi can end the war between Ukraine and Russia, as propagated by their media, then what stops him from ensuring a truce between Punjab and Haryana. He said that both these states are like brothers and contribute more than 70% in the national food pool but over the years both these parties who had assumed the power in Punjab and Hary-



ana ensured that cockfight prevails between them so that they can enjoy fruits of power. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that these forces are always keen to ensure that both the states fight with each other on the issues like water despite the fact that both the states have several things in common.

### FIR against AAP over 'doctored video' of Cong leader Partap Bajwa

**CHANDIGARH:** A case was registered against the Aam Aadmi Party based on a complaint by Congress leader Partap Singh Bajwa who accused the ruling party of taking the video he posted related to SAD leader Bikram Singh Majithia's case, and circulating it after allegedly doctoring it, officials said on Friday. According to the FIR, the case was registered under BNS Sections 336 (4) (forgery), 356 (defamation) and 61 (2) (criminal conspiracy).

### Session extended till July 15

**CHANDIGARH:** The current session of the Punjab Assembly has now been extended by two days and it will now continue till July 15, 2025. Punjab Parliamentary Affairs Minister Dr. Ravjot Singh presented the report regarding the recommendation of the Business Advisory Committee of the Assembly in the House, which was passed by the House. It is noteworthy that the dates of July 10 and 11 were earlier fixed for the ninth session of the 16th Punjab Legislative Assembly.

## Accountability for crime control to be fixed at police station level: Haryana CM

**BUREAU CHANDIGARH:** Demonstrating his unwavering commitment to public safety, Haryana Chief Minister Sh. Nayab Singh Saini while chairing a high-level meeting on law and order late Thursday evening issued clear and strict directives to senior officers, emphasizing that the law and order situation must remain intact throughout the state and any disruptions should be dealt with swiftly and firmly. He stressed the need for each police station to consistently track crime patterns and respond swiftly to any rise in criminal incidents to maintain control. Accountability should be ensured not only at the district level but also at the police station level, said the Chief Minister.

Sh. Nayab Singh Saini said that negligence in crime control would not be tolerated under any circumstances. He directed officers to make maximum use of technology for real-time crime reporting and analysis, making the police system more efficient and responsive. He reiterated the government's commitment to curbing crimes and providing a secure environment to the public.

Taking serious note of ransom/extortion cases, the Chief Minister issued stringent directions, making it clear that such heinous crimes would not be tolerated under any circumstances. Immediate action must be taken to curb such cases, and the strictest punishment should be ensured for the culprits.

He emphasized that the police administration must work with full alertness and readiness so that the common citizen feels secure and confident in the police's role as a guardian of safety.



## Donkey route case: ED raids seven places in Hry

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JULY 11

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Friday carried out searches at seven locations in Haryana in connection with the 'Donkey Route case' related to the illegal immigrants deported from USA in February, 2025.

The searches, being carried out by Jalandhar Zonal Office, are underway at Haryana's Mansa, Kurukshetra and Karnal. Officials said that the searches are based on credible inputs gathered in previous search operation conducted on July 9 at 11 locations, including Amritsar, Sangrur, Patiala, Moga, Ambala, Kurukshetra, and

Karnal targeting travel and visa agents allegedly involved in the illegal immigration network. "Inputs gathered shows that second leg persons and human traffickers were used to arrange illegal route resources outside India in connivance with donkers (human trafficking conduits)," officials said. The Prevention of Money Laundering (PMLA) investigation was initiated based on 17 First Information Reports (FIRs) registered by the state police authorities in Punjab and Haryana against travel agents and middlemen accused of cheating individuals desperate to mi-



grate to the US. "These agents reportedly lured people with promises of legal travel arrangements but instead trafficked them through dangerous, il-

legal routes known as the Donkey Route—a term used for unauthorized, multi-country land crossings often fraught with peril," said the officials in the ED, privy to the development. According to ED findings, agents charged exorbitant sums—Rs 45 to Rs 50 lakh per person—under the pretense of legal migration. However, the agency officials said, victims were often smuggled across international borders through jungles and treacherous terrain with the involvement of organized crime networks and so-called "Donkers" (trafficking facilitators).

## Kanwar Yatra begins, thousands of devotees reach Haridwar

The Kanwar Yatra began on Friday amid tight security arrangements as thousands of Kanwariyas reached the holy city of Haridwar to collect Ganga water.

Since morning, a sea of saffron was seen at various ghats of Haridwar, including Har Ki Pauri, where kanwariyas took bath and collected water.

Every year, with the beginning of the month of Sawan, kanwariyas from different



states fetch water from Ganga in Haridwar and perform 'jalabhishek' at Shiva temples in their native places.

## India 'will have largest workforce by 2047': NSA Ajit Doval

AGENCY CHENNAI, JULY 11

National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval on Friday spoke about India's rising economic stature and military might on the world stage and also made a prophesy about likely milestones that the country will achieve by 2047, the landmark year when we celebrate 100 years of Independence.

He said that the country has the potential to grow at an exponential rate and the GDP may grow by eight times will 2047.

Doval, while addressing the gathering at the 62nd convocation ceremony of IIT-Madras, chronicled the country's journey from its troubled past to a bright future on the back of solid contributions from a host of national icons and also urged the students to shape themselves as dynamic leaders.



The NSA also underlined the importance of adopting high-value technology like Artificial Intelligence (AI) and sought to draw a comparison with China in developing 5G technology. "The Chinese took 12 years and

invested \$300 billion to develop 5G. We didn't have that much time or that much money. But, in just two-and-a-half years, we went to create an indigenous alternative," he remarked.

Rallying behind the popular sentiment at the conclave, Doval said that the big dreams of tomorrow are very much within our reach, however it requires collective effort of countrymen.

He supported the views expressed by one of the learned professors that by 2047, India's GDP could multiply by as many as eight times and it could reach \$32 trillion.

"If that happens, our per capita income will grow from \$2,500 dollars to \$22,000. The country will have about 1.1 billion working population - highly skilled across multi-oriented disciplines. There will be a burgeoning middle class while the country's demography, civilisational and spiritual

strength will add another dimension to its prowess," he told the gathering.

He added that in contrast to India, China would have a squeezed workforce and may see its workforce reduce to 23 per cent to less of what it has today.

The NSA called upon the students to prepare themselves as 'leaders of tomorrow' to sustain the multi-pronged challenges of the next era, as they will be the ones who will serve as the 'X factor'. He further said that the country's technological advancements will be at a critical juncture and will need a careful calibration to safeguard national security. Emphasizing on 'Operation Sindoor's' accuracy, Doval said that the entire operation was completed in 23 minutes and objected to irresponsible and careless reportage by foreign portals about damages on the Indian side.

## Bumrah creates history with most five-wicket hauls abroad by an Indian in Tests



Jasprit Bumrah entered his name in the history books on Friday (July 11) by becoming first Indian bowler to take 13 five-wicket hauls in Tests away from home. Bumrah, who tops the ICC Test bowler's ranking, picked up 13th fiver in Tests away from home during England's first innings of the ongoing third Test at Lord's. During his playing days Kapil Dev picked 12 five-wicket hauls for India in Tests played away from home.

CHANDIGARH (SUMER GARG): The Punjab Government is all set to expand its educational infrastructure with plans to establish new government colleges in the state, having a special focus on border areas and underserved regions, announced, Harjot Singh Bains, minister for higher education, Punjab. University, Mohali Bill, 2025 in the Punjab Vidhan Sabha on Friday, Bains highlighted the state's remarkable progress in the field of education, citing an 85% increase in enrolment in government colleges. The Education Minister stated that all the colleges in the state, Government, Private, Aided, saw a significant rise in student enrolment, from 7 lakh in 2022 to 9 lakh in the last academic session. Maharaja Ranjit Singh Punjab Technical University, Bathinda, witnessed a notable surge in enrolment, growing from 1,400 to 2,480 students. Furthermore, the state has expanded its IIT seats by approximately 35,000 in the past three years, with an impressive 99% seat fill-up rate last year, and further, plans to add 5,000-7,000 more seats this year.

#### GST department busts Rs. 100 cr fake billing racket spanning Himachal, Hry and J&K

**BADDI:** A multi-state fake billing racket involving fraudulent transactions worth around Rs. 100 crore has been uncovered by the GST department. The racket was orchestrated by a taxpayer based in Parwanoo, Himachal Pradesh, and has been found to have networks stretching across Himachal, Haryana and Jammu & Kashmir, with over 27 major beneficiaries actively involved. Joint Commissioner of State Taxes and Excise Department and GST Wing (South Zone) G.D. Thakur stated that the accused obtained a fake GSTIN and used it to generate bogus bills and claim substantial Input Tax Credit (ITC) fraudulently. The racket dates back to the financial years 2017-18 to 2022-23, and even involved door-to-door delivery of fake invoices. The South Zone GST office in Parwanoo first picked up on the fraud in April 2022. Initial investigations revealed that the accused, who began operations posing as a railway supplier, had carried out transactions worth Rs. 32.02 crore, with a tax liability of Rs. 2.29 crore. According to order number 103732761 issued during the inquiry, the total value of the fake transactions is estimated to be around Rs. 100 crore.

# Monsoon rain claims 91 lives in state so far; Mandi hit the hardest

The death toll due to heavy monsoon rains in Himachal Pradesh has risen to 91, with 34 people still missing and 131 others injured.

The State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) confirmed that Mandi district is the worst affected, reporting 15 deaths and over 290 people rescued from rain-hit areas. The state recorded 31 incidents of flash floods, 22 cloudbursts and 17 major landslides have caused large-scale destruction across the state, damaging houses, roads, and public infrastructure. More than 534 people have been shifted to 16 relief camps set up in various districts. So far, 824 houses have been completely destroyed, and 14 bridges have suffered serious damage. A major hydroelectric project has also been hit. The state has suffered a big loss in livestock as well, with 849 cattle dead and 622 cowsheds damaged in the



rain-related incidents. Road connectivity remains badly disrupted as 223 roads are blocked across the state. Mandi district alone has reported 166 road closures, including the important Mandi-Dharampur highway (NH-003). Power and water supply services have also taken a hit, with 151 electricity transformers out

of service. As many as 812 water supply schemes have been affected — 603 in Kangra district and 204 in Mandi. In the last 24 hours, Murari Devi received the heaviest rainfall at 68.2 mm, followed by Pandoh with 45 mm and Mandi with 35.8 mm. Hamirpur recorded the highest maximum temperature at 32.6°C,

while Kukumseri was the coldest at 9.4°C. The weather department has warned of more heavy to very heavy rainfall in isolated parts of the state over the next week.

Among the worst-hit regions, Thunag in Mandi district reported damage to 397 houses, death of 789 cattle, and collapse of six bridges. Karsog saw the destruction of 60 houses, one death, and five bridges being washed away. In Gohar, nine people were swept away in flash floods, and so far, four bodies have been recovered.

Rescue and relief efforts by teams from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), and the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) are in full swing.

However, continuous landslides and blocked roads are making the operations difficult. Authorities have urged people to remain cautious as more rain is expected in the coming days.

## Under PMAY-Urban, 215 applications received in Una MC; verification of 118 completed

As part of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban) 2.0, a total of 215 online applications have been received so far by the Una Municipal Corporation to support eligible urban poor families in constructing their own permanent homes. Out of these, verification of 118 applications has been completed, while the rest are under process. Joint Commissioner of Una Municipal Corporation, Manoj Kumar, stated that eligible families can apply online for the scheme via the Unified Web Portal or their nearest Lokmitra Kendra until 31 July. Families applying under the scheme must not own a permanent house in any part of India. The eligible



family unit includes husband, wife, and unmarried children, with an annual household income of up to Rs. 3 lakh. Ownership of land within the urban area is also a mandatory condition. Eligible beneficiaries will receive financial assistance of up to Rs. 2.5 lakh, disbursed in three installments: The first installment after foundation-level construction, The second after roofing is

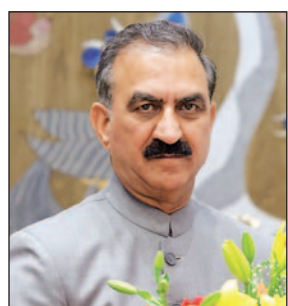

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu during his three-day visit to Mandi district visited various disaster affected areas of Seraj and Nachan Assembly Constituencies and took stock of the damage caused due to heavy rains and cloudburst. Talking to media persons at Sundernagar in Mandi district today, the Chief Minister said that the government acted swiftly to restore essential services in the affected areas. He said that the government has opened almost all the major roads of these areas and the work of opening the link roads of the disaster affected area were going on war



footing. He said that 50 JCB machines were engaged to open the roads of the affected areas from the very first day of the disaster. He said that the road up to Chail Chowk, Bagnyad, Thunag, Janjhli and Chhatra would be brought under CRIF so that it could be made a composite road. He said that the road and

bridges from Thunag to Janjhli have suffered extensive damage. At present it has been restored temporarily and there will be no shortage of money for restoration works. The government has so far released seven crore rupees for these relief and rescue works so that the restoration work can be accelerated further, he stated. He said that Deputy CM and PWD Minister had already visited and assessed the damages in the disaster affected areas. The Chief Minister said that there has been unprecedented loss in these areas and the government and the district administration were providing relief and other materials to the affected

families day and night. He said that livestock, crops and vegetables have also suffered a lot due to this disaster. He said that the state government would provide compensation to the affected families for buying clothes and also for loss of livestock besides all possible help from its own resources. He said that at many places in the disaster-affected area. In this regard, he will seek permission from the Central Government to give forest land to the people so that they could be settled at a safer place. According to the plan, ADC Una will serve as the Mela Officer, SDM Amb as Assistant Mela Officer, ASP Una will be the Police Mela Officer, and DSP Amb will act as the Assistant Police Mela Officer. The temple will remain open round-the-clock for devotees during the fair, with a brief closure at night for cleaning and a short break during the day for rituals like bhog and decoration.

Langar organisers must seek prior permission for



serving food during the fair and ensure proper cleanliness after distribution. The District Food and Supplies Controller (DFSC) Una will carry out routine inspections to check the quality of food. The SDM stated that the use of loud musical instruments like drums, chimtas, and loudspeakers is strictly prohibited. Additionally, plastic and thermocol products will not be allowed. The entry of freight vehicles into the temple area will also be completely banned. Violations of any of these rules will invite strict action.

To maintain law and order, the entire fair area will be divided into ten sectors.

Adequate police personnel, home guards, and quick response teams will be deployed. A central control room will monitor all sectors. Temporary toilets will be set up at various locations to maintain hygiene. Recovery vans will be deployed to manage traffic issues. Begging is strictly prohibited, and child protection teams will carry out regular inspections in this regard. Medical facilities including both allopathic and ayurvedic camps will be arranged across the fair grounds. Fire brigades will remain on standby to respond to any emergencies.

## Centre provided over Rs. 5,000 cr to Himachal for disaster relief; Cong spreading falsehoods: BJP

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has accused the ruling Congress government in Himachal Pradesh of misleading the public regarding central assistance for disaster relief. BJP state secretary and MLA Vinod Kumar, along with media in-charge Karan Nanda, asserted that the Central Government has stood firmly with the state during natural calamities and has extended over Rs. 5,000 crore for relief and reconstruction efforts.

Refuting Congress ministers' statements, the BJP leaders said, "The Congress is attempting to create a false narrative that the Centre has not supported Himachal during crises. The facts prove otherwise."

They detailed multiple financial packages disbursed by the Centre over the past two years, including: Rs. 189 crore released from the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) on October 1, 2024. Rs. 61 crore assistance granted on August 3, 2024, for pending claims from 2021. Rs. 139 crore allocated to Himachal on November 26, 2024, for disaster mitigation and capacity-building projects. Rs. 07.15 crore disbursed on April 30,



2025, under NDRF. Rs. 42.8 crore received on May 16, 2023, under State Disaster Mitigation Fund-1. Rs. 189.27 crore under NDRF-1 on August 7, 2023. Rs. 200 crore under NDRF-2 on August 21, 2023. Rs. 633.73 crore additional aid approved on December 12, 2024. Rs. 189.20 crore credited on October 6, 2024, for monsoon-related damage.

They further added that under the leadership of Union ministers Giriraj Singh, Anurag Thakur, and JP Nadda, the Centre sanctioned 16,206 rural housing units and 2,700 km of roads worth Rs. 2,373 crore under the PMGSY scheme.

## ED seizes assets worth Rs. 1.74 crore in Manav Bharti University fake degree scam

**BADDI:** In a major crackdown in the fake degree scam linked to Manav Bharti University (MBU), Dharampur, Solan, the Enforcement Directorate (ED), Shimla has provisionally attached seven immovable properties worth approximately Rs. 1.74 crore under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. These properties, located in Bihar, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, and Haryana, belong to three commission agents - Abhishek Gupta, Himanshu Sharma, and Ajay Kumar - who played a key role in connecting fake degree seekers with the university management in exchange for hefty commissions. The ED initiated its investigation based on three FIRs registered at the Dharampur police station in Solan district, Himachal Pradesh. According to the ED's findings, MBU president Raj Kumar, along with other accused and commission agents, was involved in the large-scale sale of fake degrees, generating illicit proceeds of around Rs. 387 crore. The money was subsequently used by Kumar and his associates to acquire both movable and immovable assets across various states. This is not the first action in the case. On 29 January 2021, the ED had attached assets worth Rs. 194.14 crore, which was later confirmed by the PMLA adjudicating authority.

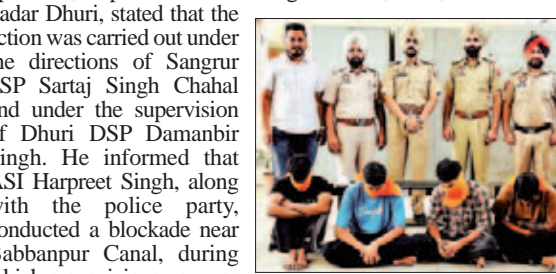
## Shrimad Bhagwat Katha will be held from August 6 to 13

## 4 youths arrested with 100 grams of heroin

They are currently being thoroughly interrogated, and police suspect the possibility of uncovering more crucial leads during the questioning. ## Surprise inspection of Government schools and anganwadi centres

Shri Vijay Dutt, Member of the Punjab State Food Commission, conducted surprise inspections today in various government schools and Anganwadi centres in the Kharar area, including Naya Shehar Badala and village Badali. The inspection was aimed at reviewing the implementation of welfare schemes under the National Food Security Act (NFSA).

Several irregularities were found during the inspection, especially in the preparation and distribution of Mid-Day Meals. Cooking staff were not adhering to hygiene and dress code norms — head caps, aprons, and gloves were not being used, and cleanliness standards were being ignored. Shri Dutt took serious note of these lapses and issued immediate directions for strict compliance. He instructed that all cooking and serving staff must wear proper uniforms, follow sanitation protocols, and undergo regular health check-ups to ensure



safety and hygiene in food handling. He also emphasized the need to maintain proper food testing registers, and to serve nutritious and clean meals to the students. Interacting with students, Shri Dutt also shared a meal with them to get direct feedback on food quality and taste.

He stressed the importance of transparency and cleanliness throughout the mid-day meal process. Another major concern raised was the poor quality of drinking water in several schools. TDS (Total Dissolved Solids) levels were found to be irregular. He directed concerned authorities to

conduct periodic water quality testing and ensure clean drinking water is available to all children. Furthermore, it was observed that Punjab State Food Commission's Complaint and Helpline Number was not displayed in any of the inspected schools or Anganwadi centres. Shri Dutt issued firm instructions to display the helpline number 9876764545 prominently at every centre and school. He stated that any beneficiary facing issues related to the National Food Security Act may register their grievance through this helpline number, and assured prompt action from the Commission.

## Water samples taken two days ago in Alipur Araiyan found safe, only mild cases in last 24 hours: Dr. Preeti Yadav

Deputy Commissioner Dr. Preeti Yadav today informed that the diarrhoea situation in Alipur Araiyan has significantly improved, with the latest water sample reports confirming potable water quality. She was reviewing the situation with Municipal Commissioner Paramvir Singh, ADCs Navreet Kaur Sekhon and Amarinder Singh Tiwana, SDM, Civil Surgeon, and officials from the Water Supply and Sewerage Board.

Dr. Preeti Yadav said that only six new patients with mild symptoms were reported during the door-to-door survey in the past 24 hours. No admissions were needed. So far, 137 cases have been reported, with 16 requiring hospitalisation. Currently, only two patients are admitted, both in stable condition. She said water sampling has been conducted dis-



tributed, with special focus on past hotspot areas, and chlorination efforts have been intensified. In Alipur Araiyan, contaminated water was detected at three spots and immediate corrective action was taken.

The Deputy Commissioner added that ADCs (Rural and Urban Development) and SDMs are monitoring the situation closely. In Omaxe City, water sampling has been done and pipelines scoured and chlorinated. Municipal Corpora-

## Balanced view

That the Supreme Court has permitted the Election Commission of India to continue with its special intensive revision of electoral rolls in Bihar will probably come as a relief to the institution. But some of the other observations by India's highest court are likely to leave the EC with egg on its face. For instance, the apex court raised the issue of the exclusion of the Aadhaar card from the list of documents that was deemed acceptable to ensure electoral enumeration. Most importantly, it reminded the EC that the issue of deciding citizenship does not fall under the remit of the poll body: it falls under the domain of the ministry of home affairs. The Supreme Court's suggestion that the EC consider including the Aadhaar card and the electors photo identity card among the documents that citizens can produce to be eligible for the revised electoral roll will be welcomed by countless people in that state. This is because in a country with a poor culture of record-keeping, thousands, especially those in rural Bihar, were finding it difficult to get hold of the prescribed documents other than the Aadhaar card or the voters' identity card for the SIR endeavour. Worryingly, there are also reports of other inconsistencies; the Aadhaar card was being accepted in, say, Patna but not in Seemanchal.

The SIR also faces scrutiny on grounds other than its rushed nature and methodology. This is because this time, the EC seems to be eager to pass the burden of proof of electoral eligibility and even citizenship on to citizens who are enrolled as voters already. This wilful desertion of people at the hands of a leaky, bureaucratic rigmarole is unacceptable. It raises the risk of disenfranchisement of segments of the population, especially those on the margins. The insensitivity on the part of the EC could even lead to an erosion in the compact of trust between the people and this institution. That would be disastrous for India's democracy. There can be no reservation about weeding out infirmities from the electoral rolls. This is crucial to ensure the sanctity of an electoral exercise. But such an exercise, as the Supreme Court seemed to allude to, has to be sensitive to timing, among other considerations. The EC has been indifferent to these imperatives. Why?

# Significant shift in India's counterterrorism doctrine

The response to the April 22 Pahalgam attack reflects a significant shift in India's counterterrorism doctrine, said Defence Analyst John Spencer, as the country now reacts swiftly and clearly, not to escalate tension but to prevent future violence and reestablish deterrence. Spencer also said that India's response to the Pahalgam terror attack in the form of Operation Sindoor displayed its military precision, and the leaders' unity in the same. "India's response combined military precision with strategic messaging.

It launched Operation Sindoor, targeting the infrastructure behind the attack, including cross-border training camps and staging areas used by Pakistan-based militant groups. Just as importantly, Indian leaders framed the attack within a larger pattern. They emphasized that terrorism would no longer be treated as isolated acts, and that those who support or enable such violence would also be held accountable," he said. "This reflects a significant shift in India's counterterrorism doctrine. For years, India endured major attacks without a consistent policy of deterrence.

That began to change after the Uri and Pulwama attacks. India now responds swiftly and clearly, not to escalate tension but to prevent future violence and reestablish deterrence," he added. He said that India has faced similar attacks—high-profile violence, targeting civilians or military targets." For more than twenty years, India has faced repeated assaults by Pakistan-based militant groups. These attacks are not random. They are often timed and targeted to provoke a crisis, halt economic progress, and inflame religious tensions. Major incidents include the 2001 attack on India's Parliament, the 2008 Mumbai attacks that killed over 170 people in hotels and train stations, the 2016 assault on an army base in Uri near the



Kashmir border, and the 2019 suicide bombing of Indian paramilitary forces in Pulwama," he said. Spencer opined that the Pahalgam terror attack was aimed at disturbing regional peace, especially since Kashmir was developing, and also to create division between religions."

The strike intended to achieve three things: fracture social peace, disrupt economic progress, and provoke a broader crisis. It was the latest act in a long campaign of Pakistan-based militancy aimed at destabilizing Kashmir, especially as the region has gained strength through development," he said. "Reports indicate they tried to separate civilians by religion before opening fire, aiming not just to kill but to reignite sectarian tensions. They struck during peak tourist

season to maximize fear and damage the perception of peace. And they sought global attention, hoping to force Kashmir back into headlines as a place defined by conflict," he added.

Spencer said that the developing region, which saw a footfall of over 23 million tourists, was a threat to extremist groups, which thrive on the narrative of an instilled Kashmir. "Since 2019, when India revoked Article 370 of its Constitution, which had granted Kashmir special autonomous status, the region has undergone a dramatic transformation. In the past year alone, more than 23 million tourists visited Kashmir. Roads, schools, and businesses have expanded. What was once a symbol of insurgency has become a destination for families and in-

vestment. That kind of stability poses a direct threat to extremist groups that depend on grievance and instability to justify their existence," he said. Spencer further explained that Pakistan is in deep crisis, economically and politically. In such a situation, Pakistan-backed groups like Lashkar-e-Taiba and its rebranded front, The Resistance Front, view progress as a direct threat. "The regional environment is also evolving. Pakistan is facing deep internal challenges, including economic crisis, political instability, and waning institutional credibility. Within this climate, Pakistan-backed groups like Lashkar-e-Taiba and its rebranded front, The Resistance Front, view progress as a direct threat. These organizations were built to exploit grievance and chaos. Their ideological and operational models depend on instability. Lashkar-e-Taiba, created with the backing of Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence, is more than a militant outfit. It operates across social, religious, and paramilitary domains. The Resistance Front, which emerged after the removal of Article 370, was created to obscure LeT's role while continuing its operations under a different name. Though rebranded and restructured, these groups remain embedded in a well-documented ecosystem of state-enabled violence," he said. He further said that the US and its allies must take note of the threats democracies are facing from non-state actors and must control the narrative. "The United States and its allies should pay close attention. Democracies today are confronting a common challenge: how to deal with non-state actors that exploit open societies, operate in legal gray zones, and use media coverage as a force multiplier.

Whether in India, Israel, Europe, or the United States, terrorism has evolved. It is no longer only about territorial control. It is about hijacking the narrative," he said.

### Trump announces 35 per cent tariffs on goods imported from Canada

US President Donald Trump on Thursday (local time) announced that the US will impose a tariff of 35 per cent on imports of goods from Canada. Trump sent a letter to Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney to inform him about the tariff. Trump posted the letter sent to Carney on his social media platform, Truth Social.

He said that Canada's failure to stop fentanyl from entering the US contributed to the tariff policy. In the letter, Trump wrote, "As you will recall, the United States imposed Tariffs on Canada to deal with our Nation's Fentanyl crisis, which is caused, in part, by Canada's failure to stop the drugs from pouring into our Country. Instead of working with



the United States, Canada retaliated with its own Tariffs. Starting August 1, 2025, we will charge Canada a Tariff of 35% on Canadian products sent into the United States, separate from all Sectoral Tariffs." "Goods transhipped to evade this higher Tariff will be subject to that higher Tariff. As you are

aware, there will be no Tariff if Canada, or companies within your Country, decide to build or manufacture product within the United States and, in fact, we will do everything possible to get approvals quickly, professionally, and routinely. In other words, in a matter of weeks," he added. In the letter, Trump threatened to increase the tariff rate by the same amount if Canada decides to increase their tariffs on importing American products. He also targeted Canada's tariffs on US dairy exports and called the trade deficit a major threat to the US economy and national security. In the letter, Trump wrote, "I must mention that the flow of Fentanyl is hardly the only challenge we have with Canada.

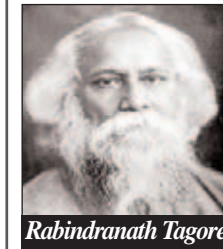

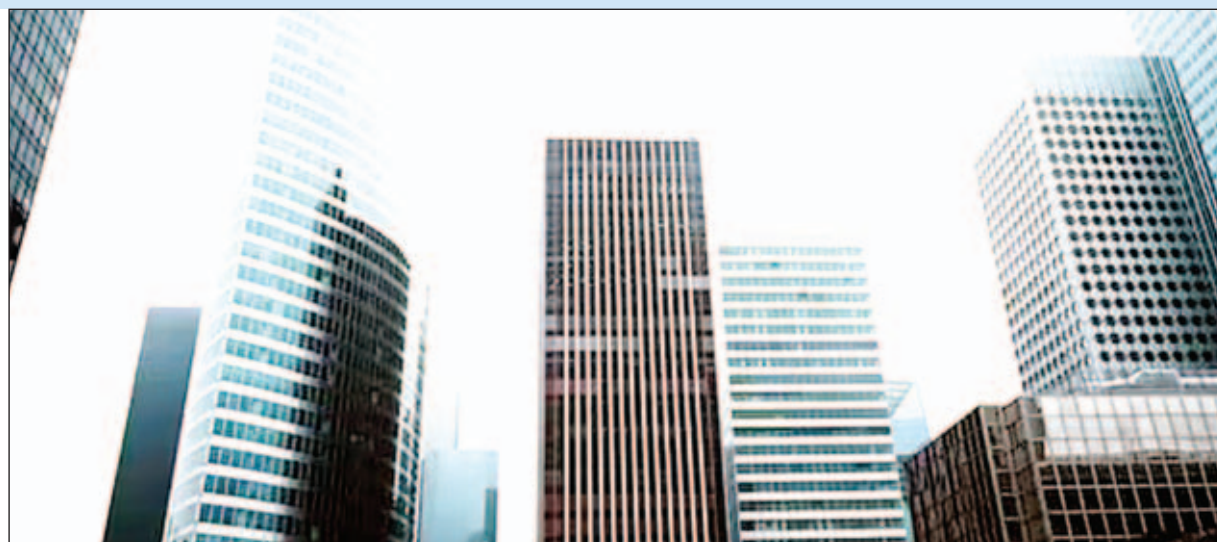

## India's quick commerce grew at a CAGR of 142% between FY22-25

India's Quick Commerce (Q-commerce) market is estimated to have reached around Rs 64,000 crore in FY25, growing at a staggering Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 142 per cent during FY22-FY25, said market analytics firm CareEdge in its latest report. According to the report, the Gross Order Value of the quick commerce market will nearly triple from an estimated Rs 64,000 crore in FY25 to around Rs 2 lakh crore by FY28, registering exponential growth. Quick commerce (or q-commerce) is a specialised form of e-commerce that focuses on delivering goods to customers within a very short timeframe, typically within 10-30 minutes.

According to the report, the sector is expected to maintain strong double-digit growth in the coming years. The growth will be



led by the rising adoption and expansion of services in the Tier II & III cities, enhanced delivery networks, and a shift in consumer preference towards instant fulfilment. Elaborating on

the factors behind the growth, the report added that a wider geographic footprint, regional penetration, a shift in consumer behaviour towards convenience and speed of delivery, an in-

crease in digitisation, and lower base are helping the industry to grow."

Moreover, structural trends such as growing urbanisation, changing consumer lifestyles,

and increasing disposable income favour quick app-based shopping experiences, further fueling industry growth," the report added. Major FMCG brands are also embracing Q-commerce through platform-specific SKUs, premium offerings, and marketing partnerships, thereby expanding product variety and boosting average order values. Simultaneously, companies are investing heavily in dark stores, tech infrastructure, and delivery optimisation, laying the groundwork for efficient and scalable operations.

"Together, these factors are supporting the Q-commerce industry to become one of the key pillars in India's evolving retail landscape," the report added. The observation reveals that the Q-commerce market revenue generated through fees has grown at

a significantly faster pace than the GOV. The fee-based revenue of Q-commerce companies, which stood at Rs 450 crore in FY22, has reached an estimated Rs 10,500 crore in FY25 and is further projected to reach Rs 34,500 crore by FY28, representing a significant CAGR of 26-27 per cent from FY25 to FY28, the report added."

This sharp increase is due to increased platform fees by major players, resulting in higher revenue realisation and a substantial increase in overall GOV," the report stated. Sharing more insights on the improvement of GOV, the report stated that a key driver behind this trend is the improved monetisation take rate of leading platforms. The fee rate across the Q-commerce sector has shown a sharp upward trend between FY22 and FY25.

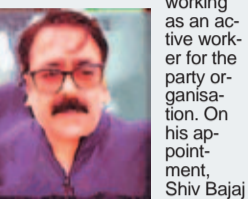
