2 new security camps set up in remote areas of Naxal-hit Bijapur

RAIPUR: Two new CRPF camps have been set up at strategically important locations in Chhattisgarh's Naxalite-hit Bijapur district to address the security vacuum and facilitate development works, police said on Sunday. With this, 36 security camps have been set up in the district since January 2024. During this period, 193 Maoists have been neutralised, 496 surrendered, and 900 were arrested, Bijapur Superintendent of Police Jitendra Kumar Yadav told.

Acharya Devvrat arrives in Mumbai, to be sworn in as Maharashtra gov today

MUMBAI: Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde welcomed Governor Acharya Devvrat on his arrival at the Mumbai Central railway station here on Sunday. The Gujarat governor, who has been given additional charge of Maharashtra, travelled to the city from Ahmedabad by Tejas Express with his wife Darshana Devi, a Raj Bhavan release said. The governor was accorded a ceremonial Guard of Honour by the Railway Police at the Mumbai Central station.

CBI busts two illegal call centres in Nashik, two arrested

NEW DELHI: The CBI today said that they have busted two illegal call centre rackets being run from Maharashtra's Nashik under the name Swagan Business Solutions Pvt. Ltd. The accused have been identified as Ganesh and Shyam Kamankar. According to a senior CBI official, the case was registered on September 11 against four individuals and unknown public servants on the allegations that the accused operated two illegal call centres in Nashik under the name Swagan Business Solutions Pvt. Ltd. to cheat UK nationals by impersonating insurance agents/government authorities.

Earthquake of magnitude 5.9 jolts major parts of North Bengal

SILIGURI: An earthquake of magnitude 5.9 struck near Dhekiajuli, Assam, today jolted major parts of West Bengal's northern district, especially in the Dooars, Terai and Darjeeling region, official sources said. The tremor was also felt in Kolkata, a separate report said as the quake happened exactly at 4:41 PM. Sources said the tremors felt across north Bengal districts and other parts of Northeastern parts of India. The people in various parts of north Bengal reported strong shaking for several seconds, causing some panic among the people.

Instead of supporting Indian Army, Cong stood with Pak during Op Sindoor : PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday launched blistering attacks on the Congress party, accusing it of "supporting" the Pakistani Army and "fostering" its agenda during Operation Sindoor. Sharpening his attacks, Prime Minister Modi further accused Congress of not standing with the Indian armed forces, adding that the opposition party's agenda is solely focused on propagating lies coming from Pakistan. Addressing a rally in Assam's Darrang, the Prime Minister said, "For its politics, the Congress associates with such ideology which is against India. The same was seen during Operation Sindoor. When the Congress was in power, the entire country was bleeding from terrorism, and the Congress stood silently by. In every corner of Pakistan, the leaders of the terrorists were destroyed, but the Congress stood with the Pakistani army instead of the Indian army." "Instead of standing with our army, the people of the Congress party promote the agenda of those who foster terrorists. The lies of Pakistan become the agenda of Congress. That is why you have to always be cautious of Congress," he added. Asserting that Congress prioritises its "vote bank over national interests", Prime Minister Modi accused the opposition party of promoting agendas that benefit infiltrators and anti-nationals. He further alleged



that Congress protects infiltrators and anti-national forces. "Today, the Congress has become a great protector of the infiltrators and the anti-nationals. When Congress was in power, it used to promote infiltration, and today Congress wants the infiltrators to settle in India forever and determine India's future," Prime Minister Modi stated. Prime Minister Narendra Modi also slammed Congress for "insulting" legendary singer Bhupen Hazarika. "When the 'Namdaar' beats the 'Kamdaar' and if the 'Kamdaar' cries out in pain, they torture him even more, saying that you don't even have the right to cry."

Modi extends heartfelt wishes on Hindi Diwas

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday extended his heartfelt greetings on the occasion of Hindi Diwas and called upon citizens to collectively work towards enriching all Indian languages and passing them on to future generations with pride. In a post shared on X, PM Modi said, "Heartfelt greetings to all on Hindi Diwali. Hindi is not merely a medium of communication, but a vibrant heritage of our identity and values. On this occasion, let us all together resolve to enrich Hindi along with all Indian languages and to pass them on to the coming generations with pride." He further said that the growing respect for Hindi on the global stage is a matter of pride and inspiration for everyone. Earlier today, Union Home Minister Amit Shah emphasised the importance of Hindi to be seen as a friend of Indian languages rather than a competition. While addressing the fifth Rajbhasha Sammelan in Gandhinagar on the occasion of Hindi Diwas, Shah said, "I always say that Hindi is not a competition to Indian languages. Hindi is a friend of Indian languages. There are no conflicts between Hindi and Indian languages." Citing the example of Gujarat, he said, "The biggest example of this is our Gujarat. Gujarat is not a Hindi-speaking state. The State language is Gujarati."

NIA files chargesheet against three accused in Amritsar temple grenade attack case

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a chargesheet against three accused in the Amritsar temple grenade attack case, the agency said in a release on Sunday. In the chargesheet filed before the Special NIA Court, Mohali (Punjab) on Friday, NIA charged Vishal Gill @ Chuchi, Bhagwant Singh @ Manna Bhatti, and Diwan Singh @ Sunny for their role in the conspiracy and execution of the attack, carried out on Thakurdwara Sanatan Temple, Chheharta, Amritsar. Vishal Gill was one of the two bike-borne assailants who had hurled the grenade in the wee hours of 15th March 2025. The other assailant, Gursidh Singh @ Sidki, was killed in a police encounter two days after the attack.

As per the chargesheet, Bhagwant Singh @ Manna Bhatti had facilitated the attackers by providing shelter, safe concealment of grenades, motorcycles for reconnaissance, and logistical support before and after the attack. Diwan Singh @ Sunny has been accused for his role in harbouring the co-accused and destruction of evidence. Another

key accused, Sharanjeet Kumar, was arrested by NIA from Gaya, Bihar, on 5th September 2025. Investigations against him and the foreign-based absconding accused, Badalpreet Singh, are continuing. The agency's investigations into the case RC-08/2025/NIA/DLI have also revealed the transfer of terror funds from foreign handlers to local operatives through UPI and MTSS channels,



Efforts are on to identify the other absconders in the case, and to trace the international linkages of the terror module involved in the attack - part of a larger conspiracy by terror operatives based in India and abroad with the aim to instil fear among people and incite communal disharmony in Punjab and the rest of the country.

Pb govt orders swift relief measures in flood-hit urban areas



UNI CHANDIGARH: The Punjab government has issued directives to urban local bodies (ULBs) to expedite relief and restoration efforts in flood-affected towns and cities, prioritising immediate measures to address waterlogging, damaged infrastructure, and public safety, according to a government statement. Local government Director Kulwant Singh instructed municipal commissioners and executive officers to promptly restore essential services, including electricity, sewerage treatment plants (STPs), and damaged roads through urgent patchwork. Permanent road repairs and pothole fixes are to be deferred until after the monsoon season, though temporary fillings should commence immediately. Authorities have been tasked with developing a robust implementation mechanism to prioritise and execute restoration works within set timelines. Designated officers will oversee each project, ensuring transparency through before-and-after photographs of all activities. The government emphasised public communication, directing ULBs to inform residents about planned measures. Community participation is encouraged, with local youth clubs, NGOs, and social organisations being urged to assist in mobilisation efforts. Nodal officers will be appointed for different zones, particularly in larger towns, with their names and contact details shared publicly to facilitate coordination.

NEP will be fully implemented in state this year: Haryana CM

Haryana Chief Minister Sh. Nayab Singh Saini said to realise Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi's dream of making India a developed nation by 2047, the education system in the state is being strengthened. The state government is committed to making Haryana a leading state in the field of education. The goal has been set to fully implement the new National Education Policy in the state by 2025. The government will establish 10 new IMTs in the state, which will provide employment opportunities to lakhs of youth. In the past 10 and a half years, the government has given government jobs to 1.80 lakh



youth purely on merit, without 'par-chi-khar-chi'.

Chief Minister Sh. Nayab Singh Saini was addressing the gathering as the chief guest at the programme organized on the occasion of the 75th foundation year of the local Saini Shikshan

Sansthan. He congratulated and extended best wishes to the institution for its commendable contribution in the field of education with a spirit of dedication. He said the institution has completed glorious 75 years of spreading the light of education in society. On May 10, 1941, in a chaupal (community courtyard) of this very city, the institution started with Saini Primary School and, following the message of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule that "work is worship," after 75 years today, the society has grown by leaps and bounds. He announced a grant of Rs. 51 lakh from his voluntary fund for the institution and assured that all the four demands put forth by the Saini Shikshan Sansthan would be fulfilled as

far as possible. Rajya Sabha MP Ram Chander Jangra announced a grant of Rs. 21 lakh for the institution.

On this occasion, Chief Minister Sh. Nayab Singh Saini inaugurated the Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Shiksha Sadan and laid the foundation stone of the new building of Saini Public School. The Chief Minister said that Mahatma Jyotiba Phule, the pioneer of social revolution, and India's first woman teacher Savitribai Phule, are the jewels of the Saini community. They worked in the field of women's education and struggled lifelong for the upliftment of weaker sections. They continuously raised their voice for the education of girls, widow remarriage, and the upliftment of deprived sections.

Drug smuggling attempt foiled in Ferozepur; one held with 15.7kg heroin

BUREAU CHANDIGARH/FAEROZEPUR: In a swift intelligence-led operation amidst the ongoing drive to make Punjab a drug free state as per directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Ferozepur Police has dismantled a cross-border drug smuggling attempt with the arrest of an individual and recovered 15.7 kg heroin from his possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Sunday. The arrested accused has been identified as Sonu Singh, a resident of Habibwala in Ferozepur. The accused has no criminal background. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that preliminary

investigation has revealed that the drug network is operated by an accused currently lodged in Kapurthala Jail, while the consignment was sent by Pakistan-based smugglers. The DGP said that further investigation is underway to establish forward and backward linkages in this case to expose the entire network. Sharing operation details, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Ferozepur Bhupinder Singh Sidhu said that the teams of CIA Ferozepur had received reliable input that suspect Sonu Singh had retrieved a heroin consignment and is on the way from village Palla Megha towards City Ferozepur.

J&K: Lone AAP MLA, arrested under public safety act, faces 18 cases

JAMMU: AAP MLA Mehraj Malik, who was booked under the draconian Public Safety Act (PSA) last week, had 18 cases and daily dairy reports of police registered against him. The Doda district magistrate in the PSA dossier described the MLA as a history sheeter and trying to "assert himself as a self-styled leader".

In all the cases filed against Malik, the common thread is "irresponsible and offensive remarks" made by the MLA against officials and his political opponents.

The 33-page PSA dossier details Malik's involvement in such cases, including using social media platform Facebook to "mount verbal and derogatory attacks on anybody who tries to stand up against his illegal demands and spreading false information to more than two lakh followers". Interestingly, after the PSA and arrest of Malik, his Facebook followers have risen to over 5.45 lakhs.

It's the first time a sitting MLA has been booked under the Public Safety Act in Jammu and Kashmir after it was invoked in the former state in 1978. Under the Public Safety Act, a person can be jailed for up to two years without a trial or prosecution.

Malik has been accused of



instigating people in a sensitive region like Doda with no "respect for harmonious co-existence and always behaving inappropriately, causing unrest and violence". The dossier, however, has not cited a single incident of violence in the region triggered by his remarks.

As part of the grounds for invoking the Public Safety Act, the dossier mentions that Malik didn't mend his ways despite legal action and preventive measures were taken against him from time to time. "Instead, the subject has been recorded to incite the people to burn government offices and to act as Lashkars like Burhan Wani", to get all illegal demands met through force, threats, heckling, physical assault, reads the dossier. The MLA has also been accused of "motivating young people to consume drugs to increase their intelligence quotient".

Not here to taste the power: Sushila Karki after assuming charge as Nepal's Interim PM

Moments after taking charge as the Prime Minister of Nepal's interim government, Sushila Karki on Sunday delivered a strong message of humility and accountability, stating that her administration is not in office to "taste power" but to stabilise the country, address demands for justice, and prepare for fresh elections within six months. "I and my team are not here to taste the power. We won't stay for more than six months. We will hand over the responsibility to the new parliament. We won't succeed without your support," Karki said during a press conference after formally as-



suming office at the Singha Durbar. She lauded the nationwide youth-led September 8 protest that shook the country, demanding economic reforms and an end to corruption and announced that those who were killed during the protest would be officially

recognised as "martyrs", aimed at honouring the protestors. She further added that a compensation amount of NRs one million would also be given to their families. "27 hours of movement is first in Nepal."

"They are demanding economic equality and the eradication of corruption. All the deceased of September 8 are announced martyrs and will be given one million each. Expenses of the injured will be borne by the government, and they will also be compensated," she stated. According to The Himalayan Times, the total number of deaths from the recent protests has risen to 72, comprising 59 demonstrators, 10 prison inmates, and three police officers. The interim Prime Minister

also assured families that the government will assist in transferring the bodies of the deceased to their home districts and acknowledged the destruction caused during the protests, including damage to personal property, and said the state will step in with support.

Karki also made it clear that the government will also investigate acts of vandalism and violence. "Transfer of the bodies from Kathmandu to other districts will be facilitated by the government... Personal properties were also burnt down; we will not leave them, the government will work on measures to give them some compensation. It can be through soft loans or any other measures..."

No combine in district will be operated without Super SMS: Deputy Commissioner

Deputy Commissioner Dr. Himanshu Agarwal instructed the combine owners that no combine will be operated without Super SMS in the district and harvesting of paddy with combine will be allowed from 10 am to 6 pm.

Dr. Agarwal instructed the combine owners that the paddy should be harvested only after it is fully ripe.

He said that it is generally seen that green cumin, which is not properly dried, is harvested at night by combines, due to which the moisture content in the paddy increases and farmers face problems in marketing.

He said that the combine owners should come for-



ward to harvest the crop only when the moisture content in the paddy is appropriate. He also instructed the combine owners to install Super SMS on the combine harvester at the time of paddy harvesting so that it is easy for the farmers to manage the paddy stubble.



The Deputy Commissioner said that strict compliance of these instructions should be ensured and if any violation is found, appropriate action will be taken against the concerned combine owner by the district administration. On the instructions of Deputy Com-

Vaishno Devi Yatra remains suspended for 20th Consecutive day

REASI : Vaishno Devi Yatra remained suspended for the 20th consecutive day on Sunday, following adverse weather conditions in the region. The Yatra, which was scheduled to resume today, stands postponed till further orders due to incessant rain at Bhawan and the track. In a post on social media X, the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board (SMVDSB) requested devotees to stay updated through official communication channels. "Due to incessant rain at Bhawan & the track, commencement of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Yatra scheduled from 14th September stands postponed till further order. Devotees are requested to stay updated through official communication channels," the post read. Earlier, the Shrine Board expressed gratitude to the devotees for their patience and understanding during the temporary suspension of the Yatra. "The resumption of the Yatra marks a reaffirmation of our collective faith and resilience, and the Board remains committed to upholding the sanctity, safety and dignity of this revered pilgrimage." Authorities cited safety concerns as persistent rainfall has triggered landslides and blocked tracks leading to the shrine, making movement unsafe for pilgrims. The Jammu-Srinagar National Highway also remains disrupted at several points due to landslides and road damage, further complicating connectivity.

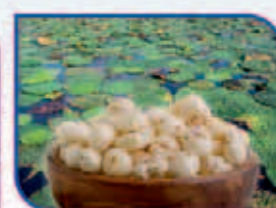

hoods of our farmers. We are deploying our entire veterinary machinery in campaign mode to leave no animal or farmer behind. Highlighting the key components of the Action Plan, S. Khudian said that intensive cleaning and disinfection of all affected livestock shelters and feeding areas will be undertaken under Rapid Clean-Up & Disinfection drive and Large-scale fogging operations in collaboration with Local Government Departments to control vector-borne diseases. The depart-

ment will also distribute Potassium Permanganate (KMnO4) crystals to farmers free of cost for disinfecting water troughs and creating foot-dips to prevent fatal infections like Foot-Rot. All these measures will be implemented by September 21, 2025. Under the Emergency Vaccination Protocol, the Animal Husbandry department teams will administer free booster doses of Haemorrhagic Septicaemia (HS) vaccine to all susceptible livestock by September 30.

5-day intensive drive to restore all flood-hit mandis in Punjab

In a bid ensure a seamless and hassle-free paddy procurement for farmers, the Punjab Government has initiated a special five-day campaign to restore all grain markets (mandis) affected by recent floods. The drive aims to clear stagnant water and silt deposits, ensuring all mandis are fully operational for the Kharif Procurement Season, informed S. Gurmeet Singh Khudian, Minister for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Punjab.

Divulging details, S. Khudian stated that the intensive campaign, Commencing from Sunday, focuses on flood-affected districts where mandis suffered water-logging and siltation. He directed the Punjab Mandi Board officials and all District Mandi Officers (DMOs) to personally oversee the efforts and ensure that all impacted mandis are fully restored and operational by September 19, 2025. The Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann-led Punjab Government



has been taking every possible step to safeguard the interests of our farmers, said S. Khudian. "Our state machinery is fully prepared for the season, we are acutely aware of the challenges posed by the recent floods. This special drive underscores our resolve to ensure that not a single farmer faces inconvenience in selling their produce. Every necessary step is being taken to protect the livelihood of our farmers and ensure efficient procurement." The Agriculture Minister informed that all preliminary arrangements have been successfully completed across the state's grain markets for smooth Kharif procurement season commencing on September 16, 2025.

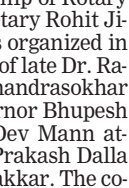

About 20 lakh people in Himachal are associated with cooperatives, and the state's cooperative societies are setting an example in women empowerment. At present, 2,287 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies are working towards rural financial inclusion. In this direction, six new multi-purpose societies

have been formed. In the state, 76 societies are serving the fishing community, 971 dairy societies are engaged in milk production and distribution, 441 societies are providing savings and credit facilities and 386 primary marketing cooperative societies are helping farmers sell their produce. Himachal is also progressing in the dairy sector, where 561 new societies have been established. The Deputy Chief Minister said that to expand cooperatives in

the state, the draft of Himachal Pradesh State Cooperative Policy 2025 has been prepared in line with the central cooperative policies. Health issues rising following recent floods

There has been a concerning rise in health issues following recent floods and heavy rains in the hill state, primarily due to contaminated water sources and increased vector-borne diseases like dengue, malaria and chikungunya, said Dr Naresh Purohit, Advisor - National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme.

In a release here to alert the public about the fever season noted Epidemiologist Dr Purohit stated that floods not only cause widespread destruction to homes, infrastructure and agricultural land but also pose severe health risks that are often overlooked in the immediate aftermath. Principal Investigator - Indian Medical Academy For Preventive Health averred that netizens of Chamba, Mandi, and Kullu districts are at increased risks of water-borne and vector-borne diseases during and after floods. Poor hygiene, flooding of water pipelines and stagnant and

contaminated water becomes the primary source of infections in these flood-affected areas, he added. "Diseases like cholera, diarrhoea, typhoid, hepatitis-A and gastroenteritis are very common after floods. Additionally, mosquito breeding in stagnant water leads to a rise in cases of vector borne diseases," he said.

He also pointed out that skin infections, snake bites and injuries from submerged or hidden objects are frequently reported during flood emergencies.

"Safe drinking water is the first and most important requirement in such circumstances," he said.

He emphasised that water should be boiled, filtered, or treated with chlorine tablets before consumption. Maintaining hand hygiene with soap is equally crucial to prevent the spread of infectious diseases.

On the issue of food safety, Dr Purohit stressed that only freshly cooked food should be consumed.

Tibetan Parliament introduces official motion on grave situation in Tibet

Torrential rain hits Khairi village, damages houses, vehicles

HAMIRPUR: Torrential rain last night in Khairi village of Sujampur assembly constituency, located on the left bank of the River Beas, caused widespread destruction, disrupting life in the area. Floodwaters and debris washed away roads, inundated farmers' fields, and damaged numerous houses. Some homes were completely buried in debris, while many others developed cracks, forcing residents to live in fear.

According to reports, the heavy rain that began late last night intensified within a few hours, creating a flood-like situation. Three houses were engulfed by an overflowing drain, prompting residents to flee and save their lives.

By morning, villagers surveyed the devastation. Main roads connecting the village were broken, vehicles parked on streets were buried under debris, and many homes suffered severe damage. Locals are now demanding immediate relief and safe rehabilitation from authorities. On receiving news of the incident, local MLA Captain Ranjit Singh visited the site today morning, met affected families, and assessed the situation. He coordinated with Public Works Department officials to clear roads and debris using JCB machines.

"The flood in Khairi has caused significant damage. Many houses have been affected and roads destroyed. Our priority is to provide immediate relief and restore connectivity," Captain Ranjit Singh said. He added that the administration has been instructed to assess the losses, and the government will extend all possible assistance to affected families, ensuring no one is left helpless.

Chandigarh police arrests man with heroin in Maloya

Jasbir Singh, achieved a major success by arresting a drug peddler. The accused, identified as Anuj Kumar (31), son of Satish Kumar and resident of Dadu Majra Colony, was apprehended near Tirkona Park, Dadu Majra, during police patrolling on September 13. The police recovered 5.27 grams of heroin from his possession without any permit or license.

A case under FIR No. 113 dated 13.09.2025, U/S 21 NDPS Act, has been registered at PS Maloya. The contraband was seized as per procedure, and the accused was arrested. He was produced before the court, which granted one-day police remand for further investigation.

Police officials said the action is part of their continuous drive against drug abuse and trafficking in the city.

16,578 cases settled, Rs 110-cr disputes resolved in one day

A matrimonial dispute turned into a story of reconciliation at the National Lok Adalat held in Chandigarh, when a husband and wife who had been living separately for 10 years decided to reunite. Their divorce petition, filed on July 31, 2023, was listed during the day-long Lok Adalat, but instead of ending their marriage, the estranged spouses chose to begin afresh after a decade apart. The matter came to the notice of Justice Deepak Sibal, Judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court and Executive Chairman of the UT State Legal Services Authority, who personally counselled the parties and persuaded them to resolve their differences. The reunion was among thousands of amicable resolutions that marked the third National Lok Adalat of the year, held under the aegis of the National Legal Services Authority at

the District Courts Complex, Sector 43, Chandigarh. Under the overall guidance of Justice Surya Kant, Judge, Supreme Court of India and Executive Chairman, NALSA, the Lok Adalat saw 16,578 cases disposed of in a single day. Disputes worth nearly Rs110 crore were settled, a significant increase over the 12,230 cases resolved in the previous National Lok Adalat. Along with Justice Surya Kant and Justice Sibal, the mega exercise was held under the guidance of Justice Sheel Nagu, Chief Justice of the Punjab and Haryana High Court and Patron-in-Chief of the UT State Legal Services Authority. Their active involvement ensured wide participation by litigants and institutions, reflecting strong public faith in alternative dispute resolution. Thousands of litigants across Chandigarh benefited from the initiative. Long-pending cases were cleared.

DC appeals to farmers to bring dry paddy to mandis

Ludhiana Deputy Commissioner Himanshu Jain has appealed to farmers to bring only dry paddy with 17% or less moisture to grain markets in order to ensure the smooth procurement process of paddy starting from September 16. Himanshu Jain stated that for the smooth conduct of the procurement season, combine harvesters have already been ordered to operate only between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. He further added that the administration will take strict action against violations, and the combines will be seized. He reiterated that only paddy with 17% or less moisture should be brought to the grain markets.



Kharar dev checking group to take samples to prevent adulteration of sweets and food items during festive season

To ensure that there is no adulteration of food items like milk, paneer, khoya and sweets during the festive season, the newly formed Kharar Development Checking Group will take action to conduct large-scale sampling from September 15.

Today, the leader of this group, Rupinder Singh Brar, told in the presence of his colleagues that there are regular reports of adulteration of sweets on a large scale during festivals and these people make sweets two months in advance and store them in

cold stores. He said that despite the action taken by the health department officials, there is no prevention of adulteration. He said that now samples will be taken from every shop with the consent of the officials and they will ensure that there is no tampering in the testing of the samples. He said that in this campaign he has the support of Aam Aadmi Party Lok Sabha member Malvinder Singh Kang.

He has also appealed to the leaders of other parties to rise above party affiliation and cooperate with him in this work so that adulteration can be eradicated.

While talking, Sanjay Jain, son of Bal Krishna, owner of Agarwal Enterprises, resident of village Bhabat, said that he had closed his shop like every day. When he came to the shop at around 8 a.m, he saw that the shutter of the shop was broken and he immediately informed the police. When he went inside, he saw that boxes of expensive cigarettes and about 1 lakh

rupees in cash were stolen from the shop.

He said that he had to give this money to a businessman. When he saw it in the CCTV, the thieves came to his shop at around 1:30 pm and as soon as they came, they first put sheets on the fence in front of the shop so that no one could see them, after which they broke the light and also turned the faces of the CCTV cameras. One of the two thieves had covered his face with his shirt and the other had covered his face with a sheet. They cut the shutter leaf for an hour and twisted it

with a knife to enter and as soon as they entered, they filled the money and cigarettes in the bag and took it away. From the style of the theft, it seemed that they knew where the bag was and where the cigarettes were kept, which can be inferred that they must have scouted the shop first. A complaint has been filed with the police about the matter. The second robbery took place at the Durga temple located near the Shivalki Vihar ground, from where the thieves stole the goddess's nath and other belongings.

Calm returns to Kathmandu

The streets of Kathmandu began returning to normal on Sunday morning following days of intense anti-corruption protests that gripped the capital and several other cities across Nepal. Light traffic returned to the streets, some shops were opened, and a visible easing of tensions signals a gradual restoration of public order. The protests on September 8, primarily led by Gen Z youth activists, were sparked by growing frustration over corruption, a lack of accountability, and the perceived failure of political elites, triggered by the Nepalese government's ban on social media. However, the recent appointment of Sushila Karki as the country's first female Prime Minister has injected a new sense of hope among many citizens. Resident Bijay Kumar Thapa expressed cautious optimism about the road ahead.

"The political parties that exist today now have new, younger faces -- the Gen Z. Including them and earning their trust will be important to keep the nation from falling into a deeper crisis," he said. "If existing parties are unwilling to support the government, then individuals who enjoy public trust should be brought into the Cabinet. That, combined with an eventual election, could be the way forward." Another Kathmandu resident voiced strong support for the new Prime Minister. "Sushila Karki is very good, very nice," he said. "Before this, she was a judge, and I believe she will bring in good rules and regulations. I hope under her leadership, Nepal will nicely go to a new generation.

"Karki, who will officially assume office at Singha Durbar today as the interim PM, has already begun consultations with aides and representatives from the Gen Z movement to shape a smaller, reform-oriented Cabinet. According to The Kathmandu Post, citing one of her aides, Karki will begin intensive discussions Sunday morning to form her Cabinet. Despite holding authority over all 25 ministries, she is reportedly committed to forming a streamlined Cabinet with no more than 15 ministers, a move aligned with calls from civil society and the Gen Z-led protest movement. The 73-year-old former Chief Justice of Nepal was sworn in as the interim Prime Minister on Friday after a widespread Gen Z protest, due to frustration over political stagnation, corruption, and economic disparity, triggered by the ban of social media platforms in the country.

From decay to dynamism: How Modi is rebuilding urban India



Rome was not built in a day, and neither will be the New Urban India. But even as we demand more from our cities, we must also pause to acknowledge the distance we have already travelled. For decades after Independence, India's urban spaces were an afterthought. Nehru's fascination with Soviet-style centralisation gave us the likes of Shastri Bhavan and Udyog Bhavan, concrete monoliths already crumbling by the 1990s, monuments to bureaucracy rather than service.

By the 2010s, central Delhi presented a dismal sight: potholed avenues, drab and leaking government buildings, and peripheral roads in NCR that were hopelessly jammed. Expressways were scarce, metros were confined to a handful of cities, and civic infrastructure was visibly decaying. A country aspiring to global leadership had a capital city that reflected only neglect.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi changed that trajectory. He placed cities at the heart of the national development agenda, treating them not as burdens to be managed but as engines of growth and symbols of pride. The transformation is visible everywhere. The Central Vista redevelopment turned Kartavya

Path into a people's space, the New Parliament into a future-ready institution, and Kartavya Bhawan into a streamlined hub for governance. Where once there was decay, there is now ambition and confidence.

The scale of this change is backed by numbers. Between 2004 and 2014, cumulative central investment in India's urban sector was around ₹1.57 lakh crore. Since 2014, that figure has risen to nearly ₹28.5 lakh crore, a sixteenfold increase. In Budget 2025-26 alone, the Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs was allocated ₹96,777 crore, with one-third for metros and a quarter for housing. This unprecedented financial commitment is reshaping the urban fabric at a pace never seen before in independent India.

India's broader economic and digital surge amplifies this momentum. Today, we are the world's fourth-largest economy at roughly \$4.2 trillion, with digital rails powering everyday life. UPI just crossed 20 billion transactions in a single month and handles over ₹24 lakh crore in value monthly.

Over 900 million Indians are now online, and 56 crore Jan Dhan accounts anchor the JAM trinity that delivers subsidies directly and transparently. This scale of formalisation and fintech adoption is uniquely Indian, and profoundly urban in its impact.

The metro revolution illustrates the transformation on the ground. In 2014, India had about 248 km of operational metro across five cities. Today, over 1,000 km span more than 23 cities, carrying more than one crore passengers daily. Dozens of new corridors are under construction, from Pune and Nagpur to Surat and Agra, making urban commutes faster, cleaner and safer. This is not just steel and concrete; it is reduced travel times, cleaner air, and millions of hours of productivity returned to citizens.

Urban connectivity has been rewritten. NCR's choked peripheries are being decongested by the newly inaugurated UER-II, Delhi's third ring road, linking NH-44, NH-9 and Dwarka Expressway to ease traffic at chronic bottlenecks. India's first Regional Rapid Transit System, the Delhi-Meerut RRTS (NaMo Bharat), is already running on major sections and nearing full commissioning, slashing end-to-end travel to under an hour. These high-speed, integrated systems are defining a new metropolitan logic for a new India.

Expressways are recasting inter-city movement. The Delhi-Mumbai Expressway, the Bengaluru-Mysuru Expressway, the Delhi-Meerut access-controlled corridor, and the Mumbai Coastal Road are shortening distances and cleaning city air by taking long-haul traffic out of local streets. Atal Setu in Mumbai, the nation's longest sea bridge, now seamlessly connects the island city to the mainland. The Mumbai-Ahmedabad high-speed rail, India's first bullet train corridor, is advancing apace and will anchor a Western growth spine.

Inclusion has remained central. PM SVANidhi has extended collateral-free credit and digital empowerment to over 68 lakh street vendors, helping micro-entrepreneurs rebuild livelihoods and enter the formal economy. PM Awas Yojana (Urban) has sanctioned more than 120 lakh houses, with about 94 lakh already completed. Millions of families once confined to slums now live in secure pucca homes. These are not just statistics; they are transformed lives and aspirations unlocked.

Energy reform is improving daily urban life. Where kitchens once depended on costly and uncertain cylinder bookings, piped natural gas (PNG) is increasingly the norm, safer, cleaner and more

convenient. City Gas Distribution has expanded from just 57 geographical areas in 2014 to over 300 today. Domestic PNG connections have risen from about 25 lakh to over 1.5 crore, while thousands of CNG stations power cleaner public transport. Turning a tap for fuel is now a reality for millions of urban homes.

India has built the confidence to host the world. Bharat Mandapam successfully hosted the G20 Leaders' Summit. Yashobhoomi has emerged among the largest convention complexes globally, capable of welcoming tens of thousands of delegates. India Energy Week has drawn the global energy ecosystem to Bengaluru, Goa and New Delhi, signalling that our cities can convene the world at scale and with style. None of this would have been imaginable when dilapidated halls and crumbling stadia defined our civic infrastructure.

Transport modernisation is happening at scale and speed. Operational airports have more than doubled, from 74 in 2014 to about 160 today, thanks to UDAN and sustained investments. Vande Bharat now runs on over 140 services, cutting travel times across regions. Over 1,300 railway stations are being modernised under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme, with more than a hundred already inaugurated. In Delhi, the expanded Terminal-1 has lifted IGI's capacity past 100 million passengers per annum, putting our capital in the global big league.

Sensible tax policy supports consumers and growth. The recent GST rationalisation moves most goods and services into 5% and 18% slabs, with steep rates reserved only for select sin and luxury items. Essentials from personal-care items to many household durables have seen rate cuts; small cars and two-wheelers now attract lower GST; several medicines and medical devices

have become cheaper. For urban households, this means lower monthly bills, stronger consumption and a virtuous cycle of investment and jobs.

Having represented India abroad for decades as a diplomat, I saw firsthand how cities serve as the face of a nation. Vienna's Ringstrasse, New York's skyline, or the boulevards of Paris all embodied national ambition. It was clear to me that global perception begins in urban spaces. This conviction has guided my work in urban affairs: to ensure that Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Ahmedabad and our other cities reflect the confidence, modernity, and aspirations of a rising India. Just as my diplomatic career taught me the value of projecting India's image internationally, my ministerial role has been to make our cities worthy of that image. This is the arc of transformation: from post-Independence neglect to Modi-era modernisation. From Shastri Bhavan's decay to Kartavya Bhawan's ambition. From potholed roads to expressways and high-speed corridors. From smoke-filled kitchens to piped natural gas. From slums to millions of Pucca homes. From crumbling halls to world-class convention centres. From a hesitant capital to a confident global host. India's ancient cities like Pataliputra and Nalanda once embodied the heights of urban civilisation. Today, under Prime Minister Modi, Indian cities are again on that path, modern yet humane, ambitious yet inclusive, global in outlook yet rooted in our values. New Urban India is not being built in a day. But it is being built every day, brick by brick, train by train, home by home. And it is already transforming the lives of millions.

Demonstrators throw eggs on Bangladesh interim govt Adviser's car in London



As Information and Broadcasting Adviser of Bangladesh interim government Mahfuz Alam left a SOAS-University of London programme marking the first anniversary of Bangladesh's July uprising, a group of demonstrators threw eggs at Bangladesh High Commission vehicles and briefly tried to block their path. London's Metropolitan Police intervened effectively, as reports on Friday indicate Alam was not in the cars that were struck.

The Bangladesh High

Commission said police were in constant contact and assured "full security" for the Adviser during his engagements. The incident in London follows an attack on Alam a couple of weeks ago while he was on government business in New York. During an event at Bangladesh's Consulate General, protesters threw eggs (and, per multiple accounts, bottles) and smashed glass doors; the mission subsequently wrote to local authorities, including the State Department's local office, seeking action.

Press Secretary of the Chief

Adviser Shafiqul Alam publicly condemned the attempted harassment. The Government condemns this latest attack with the same conviction that our government, the people of Bangladesh and the authorities of both host countries stand on the side of civilised values while the thugs inhabit the world of barbarism and bullying. "This pattern of conduct has no place in any democracy that values argument over aggression and debate over thuggery. As we said after the attack in New York, violence is not protest; intimidation is not free speech. Those words apply with full force in London as they did in New York", Bangladesh interim government said in a statement. Meanwhile, Bangladeshi news outlet Prothom Alo reported that candidates backed by Islami Chhatra Shibir under the banner of the Oikkoboddho Shikkharthi Jote (United Students' Alliance) have secured nine out of the 15 key posts, including the Vice President (VP), General Secretary (GS), and Assistant General Secretary (AGS). For the VP post, Shibir leader Abu Shadik Kayem won with 14,042 votes.

UK MP condemns racist attack on Sikh woman in Oldbury



About MP Preet Kaur Gill on Saturday condemned a racially motivated attack on a Sikh woman in Oldbury. Gill said that the attackers reportedly said to her that she "does not belong here." In a post on X, she said, "I am deeply shocked by the horrific attack on a young Sikh woman in Oldbury. This was an act of extreme violence but is also being treated as racially aggravated, with the perpetrators reportedly telling her that she 'does not belong here.'" She does belong here. Our Sikh community and every community has the right to feel safe, respected, and valued. Racism and misogyny have no place in Oldbury, or anywhere in Britain. My thoughts are with the victim, her family, and the Sikh community."

"I know many constituents are contacting me to express their fear. I hear you. The rise in overt racism

recently is deeply concerning, and I will be working with West Midlands Police to ensure everything is being done to catch those responsible and to keep our community safe. No one should have to live in fear because of who they are. I will continue to press for stronger action against hate crimes and greater support for victims.

Together, we must stand united against violence and hatred," she further said. Gill added that she was born and brought up there, urging people to read Sikh history. "I was born here, and my family has contributed to this country for generations. My grandfather and great-grandfather both fought in the World Wars for Britain. They sacrificed for this country because they believed in it, and I'm proud of that heritage. Read Sikh history!" she added.

India's luggage market to touch Rs 267 bn by 2028



The Indian luggage industry is projected to grow at a healthy CAGR of 12 per cent to reach Rs 267 billion by Calendar Year (CY) 2028, up from an estimated Rs 170 billion in CY24, according to a report by Motilal Oswal Financial Services.

The report added that the sector, which had shrunk to Rs 60 billion in CY20 due to the pandemic, has staged a remarkable recovery with a 37 per cent CAGR between CY20 and CY23. "India's travel landscape has transformed dramatically post-pandemic," the report added. "Simultaneously, steady increases in air and rail passenger traffic strongly correlate with rising luggage industry revenues. Premiumization is accelerating as consumers shift towards branded, stylish, and durable luggage over

basic utility products," the report further added.

The report noted that weddings have significantly increased luggage demand in

India, driven by gift-giving customs, trousseau packing, and the growing trend of destination weddings. The market witnessed peak demand during Nov-Dec'24, with over 4.8m weddings during

this period alone. "Combined with other travel drivers, weddings form a crucial part of recurring luggage demand, especially among young urban consumers with rising disposable incomes,"

the report added.

The Motilal Oswal report stated that the branded players, who currently hold a 52 per cent market share, are expected to

grow faster than the overall industry, driven by rising disposable incomes, increasing urbanisation, and a resurgence in both domestic and international travel.

The shift from unbranded to branded products continues to accelerate, supported by product innovation, premiumization, and rapid expansion of e-commerce channels, the report added. The report highlights that brands such as VIP, Samsonite, and Safari collectively command about 33 per cent of the market, with strong positions across segments. The mass market (priced below Rs 4,000) forms the largest chunk, at approximately 60 per cent (Rs 102 billion), led by Safari (16 per cent), Aristocrat, and Kamliant (30 per cent combined). These brands focus on affordability, first-time

adoption, and wide distribution. The mid-priced segment, accounting for 30 per cent of the market, features VIP (21 per cent via VIP and Skybags) and American Tourister (17 per cent), both capitalising on brand recall, curated product offerings, and omnichannel strategies to attract value-conscious urban consumers. The premium segment (around 10 per cent) is evolving rapidly, with legacy players like Samsonite (20 per cent) and Carlton (8 per cent) maintaining dominance in business and international travel. The report added that digital-first D2C brands are disrupting the space with minimalist designs, influencer-driven storytelling, and strong appeal among Gen Z and millennial consumers in metros.

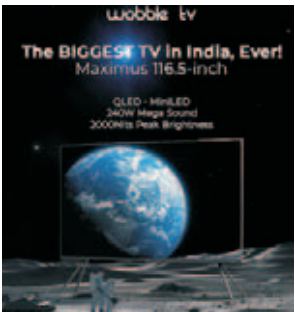

Changing Therapeutic Landscape of Coronary Artery Disease

More recently, new technologies like drug-coated balloons (DCBs) and bioresorbable scaffolds (BRS) have emerged. Each device has its own strengths and limitations. We have started combining them intelligently to give patients the best possi-

ble results. In this tailored approach, we use more than one device during the same procedure, based on the condition of the artery. The goal is to provide strong support where needed, while also minimizing the amount of permanent metal left inside the body. The most common strategies include: DES + DCB: A drug-eluting stent releases drug for a long duration slowly inside the artery is placed where structural support is essential along with the drug release, while drug-coated balloons are used in small vessels or in areas where a stent cannot be placed. This avoids unnecessary metal while still



delivering effective medication to the artery walls. DES + Bioresorbable Scaffold: In some cases, a combination of a permanent stent and a dissolving scaffold is used. The scaffold provides temporary support also releasing drug just like drug eluting stents, gradually dissolves, and leaves behind a more natural vessel, reducing long-term metal burden. DCB in Restenosis: If a patient already has a stent that has re-narrowed, drug-coated balloons can treat the blockage without adding another layer of metal.

Panic after firing at house of immigration agent



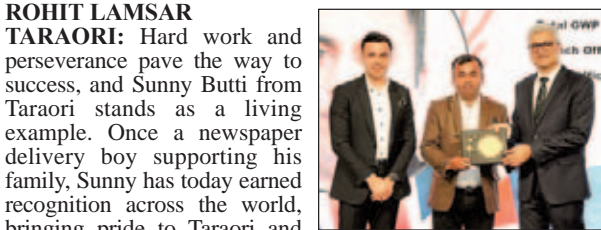

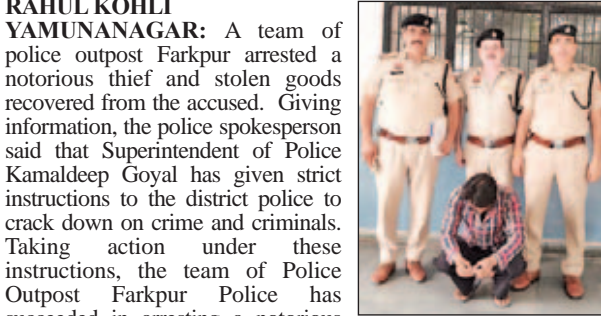


70 Teachers honoured at St. Lawrence International School

Police arrest notorious thief, recover stolen goods



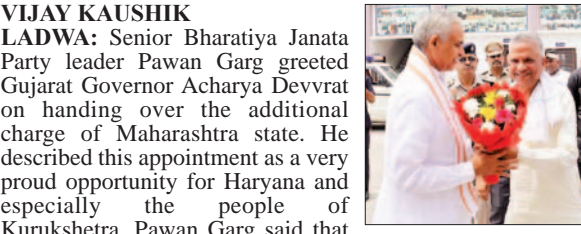

NEW CHANDIGARH: Indian opener Smriti Mandhana overtook New Zealand's Amy Satterthwaite to become the seventh-highest run-getter in ODIs. Mandhana achieved this

milestone during her side's first ODI against Australia at New Chandigarh. During the match, Mandhana played a fine knock of 58 in 63 balls, with six fours and two sixes. Her runs came at a strike rate of 92.06. Now in 106 ODIs, Mandhana has scored 4,646 runs at an average of 46.46, with 11 centuries and 32 fifties in 106 innings and a best score of 136, overcoming Satterthwaite (4,639 runs in 145 innings with seven centuries). At the top of the ODI run-scoring is Indian legend Mithali Raj, with 7,805 runs in 232 matches and 211 innings at an average of 50.68, with seven centuries and 64 fifties and a best score of 125*. Notably, this was also skipper Harmanpreet Kaur's 150th ODI, but she failed to score, making just 11 in nine balls. Coming to the match, India won the toss and opted to bat first. Openers Pratika Rawal (64 in 96 balls, with six fifties) and Smriti started things off for India with a 114-run opening stand as both slammed fifties.

To avail the benefits of the scheme, the prescribed documents have to be submitted along with the application.
