Culprits caught within 4 hours of major daylight robbery in Subhash Colony

A major robbery occurred in broad daylight at a wedding venue in Subhash Colony, located on Vikram Marg, adjacent to Railway Road in the city's posh area. Robbers brandished revolvers and stole gold, silver, and cash. The incident occurred at 8:30 a.m. on Monday.

Five robbers entered the house and, pointing revolvers at everyone, demanded they hand over their gold, silver, and cash. When Aditya, who was from Australia and was getting married the following week, resisted, the robbers



shot him. Aditya's sister, Geeta, was also struck with the butt of a revolver. Within 10 to 15 minutes, they stripped the women of their jewellery, and cash stored in the cupboards, and fled. It is reported that the robbers also took the

CCTV DVR with them to prevent their photos from being seen on the cameras installed outside. Contractor Manoj Kumar, the owner of the house that was robbed, said the robbers took Rs 10-12 lakh in cash, some dollars.

Justice Maheshwari appointed chairman of SC Legal Services Committee

UNI NEW DELHI: Chief Justice of India Surya Kant has nominated Supreme Court judge Justice Jitendra Kumar Maheshwari as the new chairman of the Supreme Court Legal Services Committee (SCLSC). His appointment comes into effect from Monday. According to a notification issued on November 20 under Section 3A of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, Justice Maheshwari will take charge of the body responsible for ensuring free legal services and effective access to justice for eligible litigants before the Supreme Court. As Chairman, Justice Maheshwari will oversee the Committee's administration, policy formulation, and legal aid programmes, ensuring alignment with the mandate of the Legal Services Authorities Act. Justice Vikram Nath, who previously headed the SCLSC, has now been appointed as the Executive Chairman of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA). Justice Maheshwari has been serving on the Supreme Court since 2021. Before his elevation to the apex court, he served as the Chief Justice of the Andhra Pradesh High Court and as a judge of the Madhya Pradesh High Court.

Kangana seeks exemption from personal appearance in Bathinda defamation case

UNI CHANDIGARH: Actor and Mandi MP Kangana Ranaut has requested exemption from attending court hearings in person in a defamation case being heard in a Bathinda court. Her legal team will now submit a formal reply on December 4. According to court proceedings, Kangana's lawyers had earlier asked that she be allowed to appear via video conferencing for future hearings. The request was made after she attended court personally on October 27. Following the application, the court provided a copy to the complainant's counsel, who sought time to respond, leading to the matter being deferred to November 24. The case dates back to 2021 during the farmers' protest. At that time, Kangana had posted a tweet referring to 87-year-old farmer Mahinder Kaur from Bahadurgarh Jandian village in Bathinda as a woman allegedly participating in protests for money.

India, Canada agree to resume FTA talks

NEW DELHI: India and Canada have agreed to resume negotiations for a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with an aim to increase the two-way trade to USD 50 billion by 2030, according to Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal. An FTA or Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) has many strategic elements to it and it is a demonstration of the trust between the two countries, Goyal said here at an event on Monday. The pact would give confidence to investors, businesses of both sides, he said.

PM Modi to mark Guru Tegh Bahadur's Shaheedi Diwas in Kurukshetra today

Five tourists die, 7 injured as bus plunges into gorge in Tehri

UNI DEHRADUN, NOV 24

Five people died and seven others were injured when a bus carrying 29 tourists from Gujarat plunged into a gorge in Tehri district on Monday afternoon, police and Uttarakhand disaster response sources said.

Rescuers backed by State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and police saved 17 tourists while the injured were admitted to two hospitals.

The accident occurred near Kunjapuri temple in the Narendranagar hills of Tehri district. According to information shared by the District Disaster Management Department, all 29 passengers aboard the bus were tourists from Gujarat. They were on their way to visit the Kunjapuri temple when the driver reportedly lost control, causing the vehicle to skid into a gorge.

SDRF officials said that five tourists died at the accident site. The injured were evacuated by SDRF teams and transported to nearby hospitals. Three of them were referred to AIIMS Rishikesh, while four others were admitted to Shri Dev Suman Hospital, Narendranagar.

According to an SDRF release, information about the accident was received from the Tehri District Control Room, reporting that a



bus had fallen about 70 metres into a gorge near the Kunjapuri-Hindolakhil area under the Narendranagar Police Station. SDRF confirmed that 29 passengers were onboard the ill-fated vehicle.

Justice Surya Kant sworn in as the 53rd Chief Justice of India

Justice Surya Kant on Monday was sworn in as the 53rd Chief Justice of India, marking the beginning of his nearly 15-month tenure as the head of the nation's judiciary. President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office at Rashtrapati Bhavan in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, and several other senior Cabinet ministers, retired Chief Justices of India, and a large number of sitting Judges from the Supreme Court and various High Courts. The ceremony was also attended by Vice President C P Radhakrishnan, former Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal, and several other prominent dignitaries. Justice Kant succeeds Justice BR Gavai, who retired on Sunday evening. Appointed on

October 30 as CJI-designate, Justice Kant will serve until February 9, 2027, when he turns 65. After taking the oath, Justice Kant touched the feet of his elder family



members, marking an emotional and traditional moment at the ceremony. The occasion also featured a strong international presence, with foreign judicial delegates

participating in the oath ceremony. From Bhutan, Chief Justice Lyonpo Norbu Tshering and Lhaden Lotay attended. Kenya was represented by Justice Martha Koome, FCI Arb (Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators), EGH, Chief Justice and President of the Supreme Court of Kenya, along with Justice Susan Njoki Ndungu. Malaysia's delegation included Justice Tan Sri Datuk Nallini Pathmanathan, Judge of the Federal Court of Malaysia, and Pasupathy Sivapragasam. From Mauritius, Chief Justice Bibi Rehana Mungli-Gulbul and Rebecca Hanna Bibi Gulbul were present. Nepal's delegation comprised Chief Justice Prakash Man Singh Raut, Justice Sapana Pradhan Malla, Ashok Bahadur Malla, Anil Kumar Sinha, and Ursula Sinha. Sri Lanka was represented by Chief Justice P Padman Suresena, Sepalika Surasena, Justice S Thuraiaraja, PC, Sasikala Thuraiaraja, Judge A H M D Nawaz etc.

Bollywood icon Dharmendra passes away at 89, cremated with full honours

UNI MUMBAI, NOV 24

Veteran Bollywood actor Dharmendra, one of the most celebrated and beloved stars in the history of Indian cinema, was cremated with full honours at the Pawan Hans Crematorium in Vile Parle on Monday.

The legendary actor, aged 89, passed away at his Mumbai residence at about 1 pm on November 24, leaving the country in mourning.

The cremation witnessed deeply emotional scenes as members of the Deol family, close friends, and towering figures from the film industry gathered to bid their final farewell.

Dharmendra's wife, actress and MP Hema Malini, and daughter Esha Deol arrived in traditional white attire, visibly grief-stricken. His son, actor Sunny Deol, performed the final rites as per tradition, supported by family members Bobby Deol, Ahana Deol, and Vijeta and Ajeeta Deol.

The funeral drew some of the biggest names in Indian cinema. Amitabh Bachchan, who shared one of Bollywood's most iconic partnerships with Dharmendra in the 1975 classic "Sholay", arrived with his son Abhishek Bachchan and grandson Agastya Nanda, who had recently worked with Dharmendra in his final film "Ikki".

The presence of the Bachchan family added emotional weight to the moment.

A long list of Bollywood dignitaries attended, including Aamir Khan, Sal-



man Khan, Shah Rukh Khan, Sanjay Dutt, producer-writer Salim Khan, and director Rajkumar Santoshi. Many were seen consoling family members and recalling their personal memories of the actor.

Tributes also poured in from India's top leadership.

President Droupadi Murmu described Dharmendra's death as "a great loss to Indian cinema", acknowledging his lifelong contribution to Indian culture and film.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the actor's demise "marks the end of an era in Indian cinema", adding that Dharmendra brought unmatched charm, versatility, and sincerity to his performances.

Union Minister Nitin Gadkari, who shared a close personal bond with the actor, said the industry had lost "a very

good and kind-hearted human being."

The film fraternity expressed an overwhelming outpouring of grief.

Filmmaker Karan Johar called Dharmendra's passing "the end of an era", describing him as "a massive mega star and the embodiment of a hero in mainstream cinema."

Actress Kareena Kapoor Khan shared emotional photographs capturing Dharmendra alongside other legends, captioning them "Chardi Kala," symbolising an ever-rising spirit.

Several actors, including Ajay Devgn, Kajol, Madhur Bhandarkar, Kiara Advani, and Ananya Panday, expressed their condolences on social media, remembering him as a warm and a loving person who inspired generations.

Born December 8, 1935, in Nasrali, Ludhiana district, Punjab, Dharmen-

dra Kewal Krishan Deol hailed from a Punjabi Jat Sikh family. His father, Kewal Krishan Singh Deol, was a school teacher, and his mother, Satwant Kaur, a homemaker.

Raised in the village of Sahnewal, he completed his schooling in Lalton Kalan and matriculated in Phagwara in 1952 under Panjab University, Chandigarh.

In 1958, he won the Filmfare talent hunt — a life-changing victory that brought him to Mumbai. His early years were marked by struggle, perseverance, and a passion for cinema that carried him from small-town Punjab to the heart of Bollywood.

He made his film debut in 'Dil Bhi Tera Hum Bhi Tere' (1960), followed by supporting roles in 'Boy Friend' (1961) and 'Bandini' (1963). His breakthrough came in "Phool Aur Patthar" (1966) opposite Meena Kumari, which became the highest-grossing film of the year and earned him the title He-Man of Bollywood for redefining the action hero archetype.

From then on, Dharmendra became one of Indian cinema's most versatile and bankable stars. His iconic performances in 'Mera Gaon Mera Desh' (1971), 'Seeta Aur Geeta' (1972), and 'Sholay' (1975) solidified his legendary status. His portrayal of Veeru in Sholay, alongside Amitabh Bachchan, remains one of Indian cinema's most beloved roles.

The film's enduring friendship anthem "Yeh Dosti Hum Nahin Todenge" continues to resonate with audiences.

Rupee slips to record low amid liquidity crunch

UNI NEW DELHI: The Indian rupee touched a new record low of about Rs 89.50 against the US dollar. The currency came under pressure because the demand for dollars increased, cash availability in the banking system remained tight and foreign inflows were not steady.

The rupee depreciated quickly after it broke key levels, which activated automatic sell orders and pushed it down further. Depreciation of any currency refers to the fall in currency's value in a floating exchange rate system where demand and supply determine the value of currency. Importers have been buying more dollars for their payments, and the limited supply of dollars in the market made the rupee weaken more easily. Even though global factors like crude oil prices and the dollar index have been stable, domestic conditions have been enough to pull the rupee down. And US Dollar is linked to global oil trading as all crude oil sales are settled in dollars. A major reason for this fall is low liquidity in the financial system. With less surplus cash, the bond market has turned cautious and currency markets are reacting more sharply to changes in demand. This has kept the rupee under pressure ahead of important economic data.

Foreign investment has also been uncertain. Investors are being careful due to worries about global economic stability. The lack of steady dollar inflows has reduced the support the rupee normally receives from overseas money. Experts say the rupee may oscillate between Rs 88.80-90 in the coming days. The next direction will depend on whether foreign investment improves, liquidity conditions get better and how strongly the central bank steps in to control sharp movements. The weaker rupee is affecting many sectors. Companies that rely on imports are facing higher costs because dollar-priced goods have become more expensive.



Govt must take strict action in Jalandhar child rape and murder case : Advocate Ravinder Thakur

VERMA GURDASPUR : A heinous case of rape and brutal murder of an innocent girl in Jalandhar has triggered widespread outrage across the region. Condemning the incident, Advocate Ravinder Thakur — State Vice President of Sahakar Bharati Punjab and former President of the District Bar Association — has demanded the strictest and swiftest action from the government against the accused. He said that such barbarity is a blot on society and the offender must not be spared under any circumstances.

Advocate Thakur stated that incidents of this nature raise serious questions about law and order. He emphasized that the government should conduct the case in a fast-track court to ensure the harshest punishment for the accused at the earliest, so that a strong deterrent is created in the minds of potential offenders.

Jagminder Singh to become Punjab Vidhan Sabha Speaker during student session

JAGDEEP SINGH GILL JAITU : The Punjab government has called a special student session for one day in the Punjab Vidhan Sabha on November 26. This session will be conducted by students selected from government schools of 117 assembly constituencies of Punjab, in which Jagminder Singh, a student of Government Senior Secondary School in Faridkot district, will represent the Kotkapura assembly constituency for one day as the Speaker of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha. Jagminder Singh said that in order to create political awareness among the students, the Punjab government has decided to run the Vidhan Sabha session for one day on the occasion of Constitution Day on November 26. In the session, the roles of Vidhan Sabha Speaker, Chief Minister and MLA will be played by the students of class XI and XII of government schools of Punjab.

Congress built Chandigarh and Punjab institutions, BJP is trying to take them away: Amit Vij

VERMA GURDASPUR : In a press conference held in Pathankot, Punjab Congress Treasurer and former MLA Amit Vij leveled serious allegations against the BJP-led central government, accusing it of weakening Punjab politically, institutionally, and economically. He criticized the central government's decision to appoint a separate Lieutenant Governor for Chandigarh, calling it a conspiracy to undermine Punjab's historical rights, as until now, Punjab's Governor has traditionally served as the administrator of Chandigarh.

According to the orders issued by Additional District Magistrate-cum-Additional Deputy Commissioner (General) Amaninder Kaur, the places identified for peaceful protests include PUDA Ground in front of Tehsil Complex Jalandhar, Desh Bhagat Yadgar Hall, Burliton Park, Dussehra Ground Jalandhar Cantonment, Improvement Trust Ground Kartarpur, Dana Mandi Bhogpur, Kapurthala Road, west side of Nakodar, Dana Mandi village Saitawala (Phillau) and Nagar Panchayat Complex Shahkot. The orders state that the protesters will have to take prior permission from the Commissioner of Police or Sub-Divisional Magistrate, whichever is applicable. No weapons like knives, sticks or any other such weapons will be allowed during the protest. The organizer will have to give a written order to ensure a peaceful march along with the demonstration at every appropriate junction. The organizer/demonstrator will be responsible for any loss of life or property caused by any illegal action taken by them during the protest.

Severe dry cold wave hits Himachal, Lahaul-Spiti records freezing temperatures

Himachal Pradesh is grappling with a severe and dry cold wave, disrupting daily life across the state. A prolonged lack of rainfall has created drought-like conditions, causing temperatures to plummet. The tribal region of Lahaul-Spiti has emerged as the coldest area this season, with night temperatures dropping below freezing. The harsh winter isn't limited to high-altitude areas—thirteen major cities in the state

have recorded minimum temperatures of 5°C or lower, highlighting the intensity of this November cold wave. The sharp temperature drop in the hills has increased the risk of black ice formation on roads, making travel extremely difficult and dangerous. Moderate fog in areas like Sundernagar, Mandi, and Bilaspur on Sunday further added to the hazards for morning commuters. Meteorological Centre, Shimla scientist Sandeep Sharma said that the dry and cold weather is expected to

persist until November 27, with no significant changes in minimum temperatures over the next 48 hours. Night temperatures are expected to remain low over the coming 3–4 days, prolonging the impact of the cold wave. Authorities have advised residents and travelers to take precautions against frost and icy road conditions as the state continues to endure this unusually harsh winter spell. This dry weather is expected to continue, exacerbating the difficulties faced by the public.



Govt enhances disaster relief to Rs 8 lakh for affected families

The State Cabinet, in its meeting held here today under the Chairmanship of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, decided to enhance the compensation for loss of household articles for disaster-affected families from Rs. 70,000 to Rs. 1 lakh. The Cabinet decided to provide assistance of Rs. 7 lakh as a special package in case of complete house damage in fire incidents. It also approved Rs. 4.32 crore to the Air Force for providing helicopter services during disasters in the State. The cabinet decided to reorganize the Panchayats in the State. It was also decided to provide 150 days of employment under MNREGA and approval was given for the construction of retaining walls upto Rs 2 lakh for individual works. It decided to engage 1000 Rogi Mitras in the Health Department to ensure



better patient care in the health institutions across the State. The Cabinet approved the creation and filling up of 800 posts of constable in the Police Department. It gave its approval to open Sub Fire Centres at Kandaghat in Solan district and Rajgarh in Sirmaur district, along with the creation and filling of 46 posts of various categories and the purchase of four fire tenders for these centres. It was also decided to fill 150 posts of Junior Engineer (Civil) as Job

Trainees in the Jal Shakti Vibhag and the Public Works Department. It approved the creation of 9 super-specialty departments in Dr. Radhakrishnan Government Medical College, Hamirpur along with creation and filling up of 73 posts of Professor, Assistant Professor and Senior Residents. The Cabinet decided to create and fill up 27 posts of Senior Residents in the Super Specialty Department at Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government

Medical College, Tanda in Kangra district. It also decided to open a new Police Post at Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Government Medical College, Ner Chowk in Mandi district, along with the creation and filling of requisite posts of various categories. It decided to create and fill five posts of Junior Office Assistant (IT) in the Police Department. It also approved the creation and filling of five posts of various categories for the Digital

Forensic Facility at the Regional Forensic Science Laboratory, North Range, Dharamsala. The Cabinet has decided to extend social security pensions to all persons with 40 percent and above disability by removing the existing eligibility condition that barred beneficiaries whose guardians were employees or pensioners of government or semi-government, boards and corporations. The Cabinet decided to provide a 40 percent subsidy for conversion of 1000 petrol and diesel taxis into electric taxis under Rajiv Gandhi Swarojgar Start-Up Yojna- 2023. It decided to merge the Anti-Narcotics Task Force with the Special Task Force to create a unified Special Task Force under the Home Department, aimed at enhancing operational efficiency and establishing a single agency to comprehensively combat narcotics-related challenges.

Retired bureaucracy speaking BJP's language against Congress, Rahul Gandhi and opposition: Jagat Ram Sharma

National INTUC Secretary and State INTUC General Secretary Comrade Jagat Ram Sharma has termed the letter issued by 272 retired bureaucrats and public figures against Rahul Gandhi as highly condemnable. He said that the bureaucracy, which has deviated from its principles, is now speaking the BJP's language against Congress, Rahul Gandhi and the entire Opposition—proving the old saying true that some people “damage the very plate they once ate from.” In a press statement, Jagat Ram shared his personal views and said that today's bureaucracy, capitalists and communal forces are shielding the Union government—something that has existed since the British era. Recalling past experiences, he said he learned this deeply when



former President Giani Zail Singh, after winning from Anandpur Sahib and becoming Chief Minister of Punjab, spoke about how the system had always acted against freedom fighters. Jagat Ram said that during a secret meeting of Congress and CPI leaders at the Chief Restaurant near Nangal Dam canal—attended by Congress leader Sarla Parashar, CPI's Swarn Singh Kulgra and about five others—Giani Zail Singh revealed how, during the freedom struggle, the bureaucracy, courts, police

and corrupt leaders stood against the freedom movement. He narrated how false cases were slapped on freedom fighters, fake witnesses were produced, and many were unjustly jailed or even hanged by the British. After independence, Jagat Ram said, when Congress came to power, it destroyed the British-era records that had falsely branded many freedom fighters as criminals, robbers or dacoits. Questioning the retired bureaucrats of today, he said that they enjoyed full authority and benefits while Congress was in power and continue to draw hefty pensions even after retirement. “Yet you and your children repeat the BJP's narrative and speak ill of Congress and Rahul Gandhi,” he said, adding that if they truly felt Congress did them no good, they should renounce the pensions granted under Congress governments.

Negligence in implementing central schemes will not be tolerated: MP Suresh Kashyap

After the District DISHA meeting, former BJP State President and Member of Parliament Suresh Kashyap addressed the media and said that the primary objective of DISHA meetings is to review the progress of various centrally sponsored schemes so that the benefits of initiatives launched under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi reach the grassroots in a timely manner. Kashyap informed that a detailed review of schemes such as PMGSY, Jal Jeevan Mission, and the Prime Minister Employment Guarantee Programme was conducted during the meeting. He said that although Himachal Pradesh has been sanctioned a substantial amount—around ₹2,200 crore under PMGSY-IV and about ₹2,600 crore under PMGSY-II—several



projects are still pending completion. The MP expressed strong displeasure over the absence of officials from the Public Works Department during the meeting, calling it serious and unacceptable. He directed the district administration to immediately issue show-cause notices to the concerned officers. Kashyap emphasized that roads are considered the lifelines of the state, but delays in utilizing central funds and damages caused by heavy rainfall are worrisome. Many projects have remained incomplete

since 2016–17, reflecting clear negligence by responsible officials, he added. Commenting on the Chief Minister's statement regarding the postponement of Panchayati Raj elections, Kashyap accused the government of misusing the Disaster Act as an excuse. He questioned: “Are schools not functioning?” “Is the marriage season not underway?” “Are buses and public transport not operating?” “Is the government not celebrating events?” He said that if rural roads are blocked, it reflects the state government's failure, not a valid reason to delay elections. He added that while the government is organizing large rallies and celebrations, many families are still suffering due to the disaster—something he termed extremely unfortunate.

Govt's fight against drugs is limited to headline management and events: Jairam Thakur

Former Chief Minister and Leader of the Opposition Jairam Thakur said that the government is not fully serious about the fight against drugs. It's solely focused on headline and event management to garner attention. Today, I read in the newspapers that the drug menace has spread to 265 of the 412 panchayats in Shimla district. Of these, the drug menace has spread to 145 panchayats. The state police have divided these panchayats into three categories. Another incident came to light today, revealing the ruin of three generations due to drug abuse. A similar incident occurred in Kangra, where a mother, unable to bear the



plight of her child, was forced to buy drugs and ended up in jail. Such incidents are extremely painful. Just last week, a man was beaten to death at a drug de-addiction center, raising questions about the government's seriousness against drug abuse. Countless young people in the state have died prematurely due to this drug addiction. Jairam Thakur said that countless

cases of violence have been reported in rehabilitation centers under the guise of drug treatment, with reports of deaths. The chaos in these centers is at its peak. Some rehabilitation centers have even been closed due to violence. Youth are being assaulted in the name of drug de-addiction. These centers neither provide medication nor refer them to a doctor. According to available data, there are approximately 102 registered private substance use disorder rehabilitation centers in nine districts of the state, of which 40 have been closed. The chaos in private drug de-addiction centers is due to the lack of effective public services. No medical college in the state has a separate ward for drug addiction, which is the department that deals with it.

Children will visit ISRO, Atomic Center Mumbai, and Jalandhar Science City: Pathania

In his address, he stated that the primary objective of this van is to bring science information to children in rural areas at their doorsteps, so as to develop scientific thinking and curiosity. a major announcement, stating that the first 10 outstanding children selected through the program would be given an ISRO tour, 10 children would be given an educational tour of the Atomic Center in Mumbai, and 20 children would be given an educational tour of Science City Jalandhar.

India's seafood sector expands

India's seafood sector is gradually expanding its global market reach beyond its traditional dependence on the United States, as exporters diversify to counter the impact of rising tariffs. Shrimp exports recorded strong growth during the first five months of FY26, supported primarily by demand from non-US markets, including Vietnam, Belgium, China and Russia, a report by CareEdge Ratings highlighted. It stated "India's seafood sector is gradually broadening its market presence beyond traditional markets like the USA". According to the report, shrimp exports grew significantly in 5MFY26, with the total export value rising 18 per cent year-on-year to USD 2.43 billion.

This growth came alongside an 11 per cent increase in shipment volumes, which reached 3.48 lakh metric tonnes (LMT). Much of the momentum was driven by non-US markets, which accounted for 86 per cent of the incremental export value. Exports to non-US destinations surged 30 per cent year-on-year to USD 1.38 billion during the first five months of FY26 (5MFY26), compared to USD 1.06 billion in the same period last year. The shift reflects a strategic expansion by Indian exporters into newer and previously less accessible global markets.

As a result, the share of non-US markets in total shrimp exports increased from 51 per cent in 5MFY25 to 57 per cent in 5MFY26. The report also added that a rise in non-US exports has helped cushion the pressure emerging from the US market, where Indian shrimp has faced sharply higher tariffs since early FY26. Between April and August 2025, the effective tariff on Indian shrimp shipments to the US averaged around 18 per cent, compared with 13-14 per cent for key competitors Ecuador and Indonesia. Post-August, effective duties on Indian shrimp surged to nearly 58 per cent, while competing nations faced duties between 18-49 per cent.

Among non-US destinations, China remained the largest buyer, with exports rising 16 per cent. Japan, which earlier functioned primarily as a reprocessing market, maintained stable levels. Vietnam's role as a re-export hub strengthened, as exports doubled to USD 0.18 billion. Exports to Belgium also doubled to USD 0.14 billion, driven by improved demand from the European Union and stronger compliance with traceability requirements by Indian exporters. The report noted that while export momentum may soften in the second half of FY26 due to continued pressure from the US market and weaker fresh orders, efforts to open access to new markets and increased approvals for Indian units exporting to the EU and Russia are expected to support the industry.

Dedicated to the 350th Martyrdom Year of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji

In the spiritual and cultural heritage of India, if there is one personality whose presence has remained steadfast, radiant, and immortal for centuries, it is Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji. For generations, he has been revered as the true protector of humanity, a symbol of indomitable courage against tyranny, and a great guardian of religious freedom. His sacrifice was not for a single community or region, rather, it was for all of humanity. A sacrifice that safeguarded the spiritual soul of India and gave life to the principle of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam", the world is one family.

Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, also known as Tyag Mal in his childhood. He was the son of the Sixth Guru, Shri Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji, and Mata Nanaki Ji. He was born on 1 April 1621 in Amritsar, where today stands the sacred Gurdwara 'Guru Ke Mahal.'

It is believed that whenever humanity faces unbearable tyranny, a great soul emerges to protect dharma and restore righteousness. At the time of Guru Ji's birth, India was ruled by the Mughal emperor Aurangzeb, who sought to impose Islam across the entire country.

During that period, the majority of India followed Sanatan Dharma. Troubled by Aurangzeb's brutal forced conversions, Pandit Kripa Ram Ji, a revered Hindu leader from Kashmir, along with his companions, came to Sri Anandpur Sahib (Punjab) to plead with Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji to save their faith and stop the atrocities.

After listening to their plea, Guru Ji said that a great soul must offer sacrifice to end such tyranny. Young Gobind Rai, who heard the

entire conversation, told his father, Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, "There is no greater soul than you. Therefore, this sacrifice must be made by you." Hearing this, Guru Ji, deeply moved, told the petitioners, "Go tell Aurangzeb that if Guru Tegh Bahadur accepts conversion, the entire land of India will accept Islam."

When Aurangzeb received this message, he summoned Guru Ji to Delhi and ordered him to accept Islam. Guru Ji firmly refused. The emperor then declared death as the consequence of this refusal. On 11 November 1675 at Chandni Chowk, Delhi, even after witnessing his three devoted followers, Bhai Dayala Ji (boiled alive), Bhai Sati Das Ji (wrapped in cotton and burnt), and Bhai Mati Das Ji (sawed alive), being martyred, Sri. Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji remained unshaken. Finally, he too was beheaded.

Even after this cruelty, when Bhai Jaita Ji tried to bring Guru Ji's sacred head from Delhi, he was intercepted by Mughal forces near the village Garhi Kushala (Budh Khalsa), Sonapat. There, an ardent devotee, Bhai Kushal Singh Dahiya, offered his own head to distract the army, enabling Bhai Jaita Ji to safely carry Guru Ji's head through Tarawri and Ambala to Anandpur Sahib. Guru Ji's body was cremated by Lakhi Shah Vanjara, one of the wealthiest men of that time, by setting fire to his own house at Raisina (Delhi) to avoid detection. After this heart-wrenching event, the downfall of the Mughal empire became inevitable.

It is our great pride that India is the land of Gurus, saints, sages, and mystics. It was here, on the soil of Kurukshetra in Haryana, that the Mahabharata was fought to uphold dharma. Here, King Kuru ploughed the golden fields, and Lord Shri Krishna imparted the divine wisdom of the Bhagavad Gita to Arjuna. For this reason, the Government of Haryana decided to commemorate the 350th martyrdom year of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji at Jyotisar, Kurukshetra.

In 2015, the state government launched the "Sant-Mahapurush Samman and Vichar Prasara Yojana," under which programmes are organized to spread the teachings and lives of great saints including Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, Baba Banda Singh



Bahadur Ji, Dhanna Bhagat Ji, Sant Kabir Ji, Sant Namdev Ji, and Sant Ravidas Ji.

In Haryana, at Lohgarh (Yamunanagar), the capital of Baba Banda Singh Bahadur, a martial arts institute and the Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Medical College are being established. The 72-kanal land of Gurdwara Chilla Sahib (Sirs), associated with Guru Nanak Dev Ji, was allotted free of cost. Across the state, memorial gates, colleges, and institutions have been named after the revered Gurus.

The people of present-day Haryana shared a deep bond with Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji. There are nearly 28 Gurdwaras in the state dedicated to his memory, and his in-laws' home is at Lakhnaur Sahib (Ambala). Mass kidnapping in Nigeria: 300 abducted



At least 50 of the more than 300 students abducted from a Catholic school in Nigeria have managed to escape, Al Jazeera reported, citing a Christian group's statement following the incident closely.

Armed men stormed Saint Mary's Catholic School in Niger State on Friday, abducting 303 children and 12 teachers in what has become one of Nigeria's biggest mass kidnappings in recent years. In a statement on Sunday, the Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN) said the 50 students got away from their captors between Friday and Saturday.

The organisation confirmed that

all of them are now safe and back with their families. "As much as we receive the return of these 50 children that escaped with some sigh of relief, I urge you all to continue in your prayers for the rescue and safe return of the remaining victims," CAN's chairman in Niger State, Reverend Bulus Dauwa Yohanna, said in the statement. Friday's abduction happened just four days after another attack on a secondary school in neighbouring Kebbi State's Maga town, about 170km (106 miles) away. In that incident, gunmen kidnapped 25 schoolgirls and killed the school's vice-principal, as per Al Jazeera.

Authorities say at least one of those girls has since escaped and returned home safely, but 24 remain missing. The identities of the attackers in both cases remain unknown, and no group has claimed responsibility so far. Regional authorities and security agencies have launched search-and-rescue operations in surrounding forests and along escape routes, with police, military and even local hunters deployed to help, according to Al Jazeera. The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) called the abduction of children and their educators a "brutal and grave violation of children's rights" and urged their safe and immediate release.

United States President Donald Trump has warned that Washington could take military action against Nigeria, claiming the country's Christians are being deliberately targeted and killed. His remarks have drawn support from several voices in right-wing and evangelical Christian circles in the US. In a social media post on Friday, US Secretary of Defence Pete Hegseth said he met Nigeria's National Security Adviser Nuhu Ribadu and his team a day earlier. He said their talks focused on what he described as "the horrific violence against Christians in their country."

Japan aims to foster innovation, growth in areas of semiconductors, AI with India



Japan has underlined its commitment to deepen cooperation with India in critical and emerging technologies, including semiconductors and artificial intelligence, during a bilateral meeting between Japanese Prime Minister Takaichi Sanae and Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the sidelines of the G20 Summit in South Africa on Sunday. According to a statement issued by the Japanese Foreign Ministry, the meeting began at 1:40 pm local time and lasted for about 35 minutes. At the outset, Prime Minister Modi offered his heartfelt congratulations to Prime Minister TAKAICHI on her assumption of office and expressed his pleasure at holding the face-to-face meeting. In her response, Prime Minister TAKAICHI expressed her gratitude and conveyed her heartfelt condolences to the victims of the recent terrorist attack in Delhi and offered her sincere prayers for the swift recovery of those injured. She also stated that she would like to work with Prime Minister Modi to make Japan-India relations more robust and

prosperous. In response, Prime Minister Modi expressed his appreciation, the statement added. Prime Minister TAKAICHI further stated that, based on the Japan-India Joint Vision for the Next Decade launched during Prime Minister Modi's visit to Japan, she is determined to achieve tangible results across a wide range of fields, including security and defence, the economy, and people-to-people exchanges. She also mentioned that she aims to "leverage both countries' strengths to foster innovation and growth in the areas of critical and emerging technologies, such as semiconductors and AI, and to concretise cooperation in the area of economic security," as per the Japanese foreign ministry. In response, Prime Minister Modi stated his intention to advance concrete cooperation in these areas. The two leaders also concurred to cooperate in realising a "Free and Open Indo-Pacific." MEA said that both leaders emphasised that India and Japan remain valued partners and trusted friends.

A scripture that transcends boundaries of geography, caste, community, and creed can never be limited to a select few. No other text in world literature explains Karma Yoga—the yoga of selfless action—with the same beauty, depth, and completeness as the Gita. It teaches how to work with dedication, without attachment, and with unwavering focus on the welfare of all beings. This message is timeless. It applies

equally to kings and commoners, warriors and monks, seekers and scholars, the elderly and the young. The Gita is truly a scripture for all ages and all people. There is an interesting anecdote often narrated: Once, a Christian priest was sent to India with generous funds to propagate conversion. After committing the robbery, the accused also took away the CCTV cameras, DVR, and a Verna car purchased a year ago. Before fleeing, they fired five rounds. On hearing the gunshots, residents stepped out and immediately alerted the police. SP Gangaram Poonia, accompanied by the CIA team, Civil Lines police, and forensic experts, reached the spot. According to sources, the criminals abandoned the Verna car near Basant Vihar, which has been recovered. The exact value of cash and jewellery looted is yet to be determined, though the family estimates a loss of 50-80 lakh.



Karnal Police arrested all five accused from Dera Bassi within just three hours, with neighbouring district police placed on alert mode for the operation. Initial investigation suggests that during the robbery, the accused made a phone call to someone, telling the person that the amount of cash and jewellery they were told to expect was not found. The robbers also took away dollars, money, and other valuables given by the bride's family for the marriage.

Police officials believe that labourers who had recently worked in the groom's newly constructed house may be involved in sharing crucial inside information. With the help of Ambala Police, the accused were apprehended.

The groom's friend, Dheeraj, who reached the spot after the incident, said that a special prayer was held at the house on Sunday ahead of the December 4 wedding. On Monday morning, the groom's mother Meenakshi and aunt Sangeeta were in the kitchen, while Aditya, the groom, was sitting on the sofa. His father Manoj was in the bathroom, and his brother had gone out for a walk.

According to Dheeraj, the miscreants arrived on a motorcycle and entered the house on the pretext of asking for an address. When Sangeeta questioned them, they struck her on the head with the butt of a gun. They then pulled Manoj out of the bathroom and held all family members at gunpoint, confiscating their mobile phones to prevent them from calling for help. He said the accused removed bangles, necklaces, and earrings from the women, then looted the jewellery and cash kept safely for the wedding. Aditya, who had returned from Australia just ten days earlier, was shot when he tried to resist.

Prime Minister must clarify whether action will be taken in the paddy scam: Ratan Mann

The alleged Rs 5,000-crore paddy procurement scam in Haryana has caused deep concern among farmers across the state. What farmers describe as the loot of their hard-earned produce has now become a subject of discussion from village chaupals to city streets. In such a situation, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Haryana has gained significant importance. Farmers want to know whether the Prime Minister will address this alleged scam during his visit or return after implicitly endorsing the state government's silence.

The Bharatiya Kisan Union has posed direct questions: Will the Prime Minister speak on the Rs 5,000-crore scam? Will he announce a high-level, impartial investigation? Will he order strict and immediate action against those responsible for looting farmers' earnings? Will the

procurement process be made transparent in the future with concrete reforms? Farmers are looking towards the Prime Minister for clarity. Now is not the time for silence.

BKU state president Ratan Mann said the alleged irregularities in paddy procurement are not just accounting discrepancies but a direct attack on farmers' sweat and labour. He said that if the Prime Minister truly stands for farmers' welfare, he must speak clearly on this issue during his Haryana visit. Half-hearted responses will not work. If the government remains silent or attempts to suppress the investigation, the BKU will launch a major state-wide agitation. Mann said farmers seek trust, not excuses; action, not empty announcements. The government must now give answers. The Bharatiya Kisan Union assures Haryana's farmers that their voice will not be silenced and that it stands firmly with any farmer who faces economic, administrative or procedural injustice.

Ratan Mann said Haryana's farmers have always trusted the government, but this alleged Rs 5,000-crore scam has shaken that trust. Farmers want to know how seriously this attack on their livelihood is being taken. According to him, the Prime Minister's visit will be meaningful only if he announces a clear stand and firm action in this matter. The questions are direct, and farmers expect direct answers.

There is widespread anger among farmers over the alleged scam, which they say raises questions over the integrity of the procurement system. In such circumstances, the Prime Minister's visit has become crucial for the state's farming community. They want a clear assurance on whether action will be taken against those responsible. The BKU expects the Prime Minister to respect the sentiments of Haryana's farmers and announce a transparent investigation, strict action and concrete decisions in their favour.

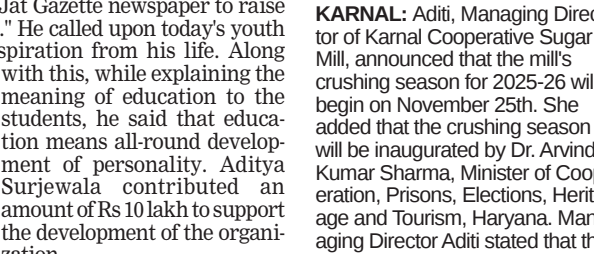


Karnal Cooperative Sugar Mill's crushing season to begin today: MD

KARNAL: Aditi, Managing Director of Karnal Cooperative Sugar Mill, announced that the mill's crushing season for 2025-26 will begin on November 25th. She added that the crushing season will be inaugurated by Dr. Arvind Kumar Sharma, Minister of Cooperation, Prisons, Elections, Heritage and Tourism, Haryana. Managing Director Aditi stated that this year, Karnal Cooperative Sugar Mill has set a target of crushing 5 million canes, as well as achieving 100 percent technical efficiency and high recovery.
