**India bans sugar exports till Sept 30**

NEW DELHI: India has banned the export of sugar till September 30 this year, according to a government notification. The notification issued by the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) on May 13 said this order does not apply to sugar being exported to the European Union and the US under the tariff rate quota scheme. The order is also not applicable to the shipments under the advance authorisation scheme, government-to-government exports and consignments already in the physical export pipeline.

**Centre condemns attack on Indian-flagged ship off Oman coast, crew safe**

NEW DELHI: India on Thursday strongly condemned the attack on an Indian-flagged commercial vessel off the coast of Oman on May 13, 2026, calling it "unacceptable" and warned against continued targeting of civilian maritime activity. The Ministry of External Affairs confirmed that all Indian crew members on board are safe following the incident. The crew was rescued with assistance from Omani authorities, whom India thanked for their swift response. In an official statement released, the government also expressed gratitude to the Omani authorities for swiftly rescuing the crew following the incident. Reiterating its position on maritime security, India said attacks on commercial vessels and threats to civilian mariners violate international norms and must be avoided. It also stressed the importance of ensuring freedom of navigation and uninterrupted global trade.

**Idols vandalised at temple in UP's Deoria, police deployed**

DEORIA (UP): Unidentified individuals allegedly vandalised idols of Lord Hanuman and Nandi at a Kali Mata temple complex here, triggering tension in the area, police said on Thursday. A case has been registered against unidentified persons and efforts were underway to nab them. Tarkulwa SHO Bhubendra Singh said, adding that the installation of new idols at the temple has also begun. Idols at the temple situated on the Chhoti Gandak riverbanks in Konhwalia Babu Rai village in Tarkulwa area, were found damaged on Thursday morning after the priest, Yogendra Singh, reopened the premises following Wednesday's evening prayers, they added.

**Rupee settles at record low of 95.73 against US dollar**

MUMBAI: The rupee weakened further and fell to a record low of 95.73 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday, amid a strong dollar and worries over inflation amid elevated energy prices. Forex traders said the rupee is expected to trade with a negative bias amid inflation concerns and the strength of the US dollar in the overseas market. The West Asia crisis and the blockade of the Strait of Hormuz have disrupted crude petroleum imports into India. Also, the sharp rise in crude prices has made fuel imports costlier.

## 104 people killed as storms and rain batter UP, many injured

Uttar Pradesh Relief Commissioner Harikesh Bhaskar on Thursday informed that at least 104 people have lost their lives across Uttar Pradesh due to relentless rain, lightning, and thunderstorms in various parts of the state over the past 36 to 48 hours. The Relief Commissioner added that continuous monitoring is being conducted, and the 24-hour Integrated Control and Command Centre remains fully operational. Orders have also been issued to all officials to conduct field inspections. Furthermore, the Chief Minister has announced compensation measures, and financial relief is currently being disbursed to the affected individuals. Earlier in the day, Uttar Pradesh CM Yogi Adityanath directed state officials to provide immediate assistance to victims of the recent storms and lightning. The Chief Minister has ordered the prompt release of compensation following reports of casualties and property damage over the last 24 hours. Yogi directed officials to immediately visit the affected sites and provide assistance to the victims, release compensation and instructed districts to provide updates on the situation every 3 hours. He has further asked all District Magistrates to prioritise relief work. He also directed that compensation disbursement, rescue operations, and other related work should be updated on social media. According to the press release, information regarding loss of human lives, livestock loss, and crop damage has come from 19 districts, including Barabanki, Bahraich, Kanpur Dehat, Basti, Sambhal, Hardoi, and Unnao. Additional-



ly, 130 livestock (both large and small) have perished, and 98 houses have sustained damage. CM Yogi has expressed condolences to the families of the deceased. On the other hand, on Tuesday, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science and Technology and Earth Sciences, Dr Jitendra Singh, launched two advanced weather forecasting systems developed under the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), aimed at providing hyper-local, AI-enabled and impact-based weather services across the country.

According to a list issued by the Prayagraj district administration, seven deaths were reported in the Handia area, four in Phulpur, three in Soraon, two in Meja and one in Sadar due to the storm and rain.

In Bhadohi, district administration sources said at least 16 people died in

storm-related incidents. Additional District Magistrate Kunwar Virendra Kumar Maurya said trees and electric poles were uprooted in several areas while many houses were damaged in the storm.

Fatehpur Additional District Magistrate Avinash Tripathi said nine people were killed and 16 injured in storm-related incidents in the district.

"Eight people, including five women, died in Khaga tehsil, while a woman died after a wall of a house collapsed in Sadar tehsil," he said.

In Pratapgarh, four people died in separate incidents of wall and cemented shed collapses and lightning strikes amid strong winds and rain, officials said.

Superintendent of Police Deepak Bhukar said Bhim Yadav (25) died after he was trapped under the debris of a cemented shed that collapsed in Ojha Ka Purwa

## 416 Punjab govt schools achieve 100% pass rate in Class 12: CM Mann

Punjab's government schools have scripted a major turnaround in public education, with 416 Government Schools recording a perfect 100% pass result in the Punjab School Education Board (PSEB) Class 12 examinations under the Bhagwant Mann Government's Sikhya Kranti. ## Ravneet Bittu flags off Amritsar-New Jalpaiguri Amrit Bharat Express

CHANDIGARH: Union Minister of State for Railways and Food Processing Industries, Ravneet Singh Bittu, on Wednesday officially flagged off the inaugural run of the 14664 Amritsar-New Jalpaiguri Amrit Bharat Express from the Amritsar Railway Station.

The ceremony was attended by senior railway officials, political leaders, and a large gathering of passengers, marking a significant enhancement in rail connectivity between Punjab and Eastern India. The newly launched express train is slated to cover a distance of approximately 1,900 kilometers. Speaking to the media during the event, Minister Bittu emphasized that the Amrit Bharat series has been specifically conceptualized to cater to common citizens and middle-class travelers, providing them with high-end amenities at affordable costs. He noted that the service would prove immensely beneficial for devotees and laborers frequently traveling between the two regions. The Amrit Bharat Express boasts several modern features, including a maximum speed capability of 130 km/h. It is equipped with advanced safety and comfort installations such as CCTV cameras, emergency talk-back buttons, mobile charging points at every seat, and spacious luggage areas. The Minister further highlighted that the train's design incorporates fire-resistant materials and enhanced safety protocols to minimize risks during transit.

## EC to conduct SIR Phase-III of electoral rolls in 16 States including Punjab, Chandigarh

AGENCY NEW DELHI, MAY 14

The Election Commission of India (ECI) on Thursday announced the conduct of Special Intensive Revision (SIR) Phase-III of electoral rolls across 16 States and three Union Territories, covering over 36 crore electors in a phased manner. According to the press note issued by the Commission, the exercise has been planned in coordination with the ongoing house listing component of the Census to ensure optimal use of field machinery. It further stated that the revision will cover the entire country under Phase-



III, except Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, where the schedule will be announced separately. After considering the completion of Phase-II of the Census in these

three State/UTs and due consideration of the weather in the upper reaches/ snow bound areas, SIR schedule for these three State/UTs will be announced later," it added. The poll body said that over 3.94 lakh Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will carry out house-to-house verification work, supported by 3.42 lakh Booth Level Agents (BLAs) appointed by political parties during the enumeration phase. The ECI emphasised that the exercise is participatory and involves all stakeholders, including electors, political parties and election

officials. It also urged political parties to appoint BLAs for each polling booth to ensure full participation and transparency in the process. "ECI requests all political parties to appoint BLAs for each Polling Booth, in order to ensure full participation of political parties so that SIR is conducted with complete transparency and full participation of political parties," it said. The Commission further said that in the earlier two phases of SIR, covering 13 States and UTs, over 59 crore electors were covered with the participation of more than 6.3 lakh BLOs and 9.2 lakh BLAs. The Special Intensive Revision (SIR) schedule has been outlined for multiple States and Union Territories with clearly defined timelines for each stage of the electoral roll process.

## VD Satheesan to be next CM of Kerala

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: VD Satheesan will be the next Chief Minister of Kerala as Congress announced him as the Legislative Party leader of Kerala Congress on Thursday after more than a week of intense deliberations with Kerala party leader rushing back and forth to Delhi. With the announcement, Congress will proceed to form the government in the state, ending days of speculation as the top leaders jostled among themselves for the post. Congress General Secretary KC Venugopal and senior leader Ramesh Chennithala were the other leaders in the fray for the state's top post. Satheesan served as the Leader of Opposition in Kerala Assembly before the UDF's decisive victory in the 2026 Kerala Assembly elections. The alliance won 102 seats in the 140-member assembly. As the next Kerala CM is an-



nounced, the Congress Kerala Committee will meet Governor Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar today and stake claim to form the government. Satheesan won the 2026 Kerala Assembly election from the Paravur constituency, securing his sixth consecutive term as an MLA. Satheesan secured 78,658 votes and defeated CPI candidate ET Taison Master by a margin of 20,600 votes. He has represented the Paravur constituency for 25 years, having first won the seat in 2001. As the Leader of the Opposition in the Kerala Legislative Assembly since 2021, Satheesan emerged as a prominent face of the United Democratic Front (UDF) campaign against the ruling Left government. He has been a vocal critic of the state government on various political and governance issues.

## NIA court fixes June 4 for consideration of chargesheet in Red Fort car bomb blast case



NEW DELHI: A special NIA court at Patiala House Courts has fixed June 4 for consideration of the chargesheet in the November 2025 Red Fort car bomb blast case. According to the NIA, the high-intensity Vehicle-Borne Improvised Explosive Device (VBIED) explosion killed 11 people and injured several others, besides causing extensive damage to nearby property. The agency has invoked provisions of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Bharaliya Nyaya Sanhita, Explosive Substances Act, Arms Act and Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act. Among those chargesheeted is the alleged main conspirator Dr. Umer Un Nabi, whose proceedings are proposed to be abated owing to his death. The remaining accused named in the prosecution complaint are Aamir Rashid Mir, Jasir Bilal Wani, Dr. Muzamil Shakeel, Dr. Adeel

Ahmed Rather, Dr. Shaheen Saeed, Mufti Irfan Ahmad Wagay, Soyab, Dr. Bilal Naseer Malla and Yasir Ahmad Dar. The NIA alleged that all the accused were associated with Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind (AGuH), an offshoot of Al-Qaida in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS), which was declared a terrorist organisation by the Ministry of Home Affairs in 2018. According to the agency, the chargesheet is based on an extensive investigation conducted across Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Gujarat and Delhi-NCR. The prosecution complaint reportedly contains 588 oral testimonies, over 395 documents, and more than 200 seized material exhibits. The NIA has alleged a larger "jihadi conspiracy" involving radicalised individuals, including medical professionals, allegedly inspired by AQIS/AGuH ideology.

**Farmer training camp organized by PAU-FASC Sangrur**

To promote the balanced and judicious use of chemical fertilizers, Punjab Agricultural University (PAU), Ludhiana, through its Farm Advisory Service Centre (FASC), Sangrur, organized a village-level farmer training camp at Dhadogal village on recommended paddy and basmati varieties, soil test-based fertilizer management, and efficient phosphorus application practices. More than 50 farmers participated in the camp.

Leading the programme, Dr. Ashok Kumar Garg, Senior Extension Scientist, urged farmers to apply fertilizers strictly on the basis of soil testing. He emphasized that balanced fertilizer use not only reduces the cost of cultivation but also enhances crop productivity and improves soil health. During the camp, he explained the scientific procedure for soil sampling and gave a practical demonstration on collecting soil samples for testing.

Dr. Garg advised farmers to avoid the indiscriminate use of Diammonium phosphate (DAP) in paddy and basmati cultivation and urged them to



use Urea judiciously. He specifically cautioned against the practice of applying two to three bags of urea during puddling. He also advised farmers to apply zinc only in recommended quantities to correct zinc deficiency in paddy fields. Highlighting the importance of biofertilizers, Dr. Garg informed farmers that Azospirillum inoculation in paddy nurseries not only helps increase crop yield but also improves the biological health of the soil. Detailed information on recommended fertilizers and other management practices for raising a healthy paddy nursery was also shared. The cultivation and benefits of green manure crops such as Sunn hemp (sunn hemp) and Sesbania bispinosa were discussed as effective ways to im-

prove soil health. During the interaction, Dr. Garg also shared recommendations regarding the identification and management of dwarfing disease in paddy nurseries and advised farmers to regularly monitor their nurseries. He provided detailed information about PAU-recommended paddy varieties, including PR 131, PR 132, and PR 126. Speaking about the newly recommended PR 133, he said the variety matures in about 111 days after transplanting and yields nearly 30.5 quintals per acre.

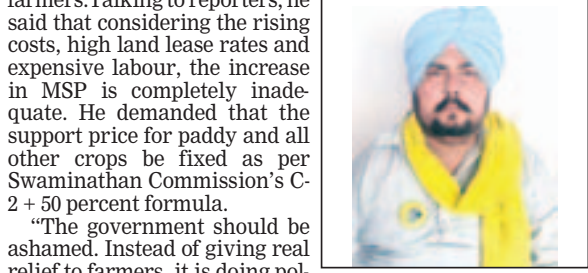
**Increase in MSP bad joke on farmers: BKU Ekta Malwai leader**

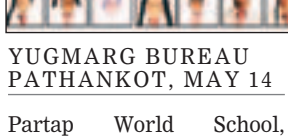

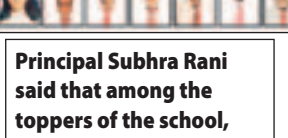

#### Jail sentence for successors of 'Hare Krishna Arts' for defying court order

**UNI HAMIRPUR:** The District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Hamirpur, has sentenced the new owners and successors of the Ludhiana-based firm 'Hare Krishna Arts' to one year of simple imprisonment each, along with a fine. This case pertains to a defective machine purchased in the year 2015. Sumit Agnihotri, the proprietor of 'The Ads,' had filed a complaint with the Consumer Commission after the machine malfunctioned. On August 8, 2019, the Commission ordered the firm to either replace the machine or refund the sum of Rs.16 lakh, inclusive of 9 per cent interest. Additionally, directions were issued to pay Rs.25,000 as compensation for mental harassment and Rs.10,000 towards legal expenses. In the course of the proceedings, the original proprietor of the firm, Vinod Kumar, passed away in November 2019.

## Public now trusts Congress's policies: Sukhwinder Sukhu

Taking aim at the previous BJP government, the Chief Minister stated that the public now places its trust in the policies of the Congress party. The Chief Minister was addressing a press conference in Dharamshala on Thursday, during which he highlighted the ongoing development works in Dharamshala and Palampur—including an inspection of the heliport project. Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu remarked that the Governor's decision to reduce the number of vehicles in his convoy is a welcome step; however, he noted that the state government is already moving towards fiscal discipline by actively cutting down on expenses. municipal corporation election campaign in Mandi, the Chief Minister mentioned that he himself travels in a small electric car, the running costs of which are significantly lower compared to petrol-powered vehicles. He further informed that the government has already reduced the size of the convoys accompanying the Chief Minister and other ministers. Additionally, a temporary reduction of 30 per cent has been implemented in the salaries of ministers, and a 20 per cent reduction in the salaries of MLAs. The Chief Minister asserted that the objective behind these decisions is to make the state

economically self-reliant, and the government is continuously working towards improving its financial health. During this interaction, CM Sukhu also launched a scathing attack on the BJP. He alleged that the previous BJP government had squandered the state's resources through wasteful expenditure during its tenure. He pointed out that while massive buildings were erected at a cost of thousands of crores of rupees, the public today derives no tangible benefit from them. The Chief Minister remarked that while the BJP may be dreaming of returning to power, it is essential to first prove one's worth in the eyes of the public. He also highlighted that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced a relief package of Rs. 1,500 crore for Himachal Pradesh, yet the state has not received these funds to date.

## Nation stands with PM Modi, opposition spreading panic: Harsh Mahajan

BJP Rajya Sabha MP Harsh Mahajan said that the country stands firmly with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and is ready to support every step taken in national interest. Supporting the Prime Minister's recent appeal to citizens, Mahajan stated that the advisory was voluntary, precautionary, and based on long-term national interest, adding that there is no shortage of essential commodities in India. He accused opposition parties, including Congress, Aam Aadmi Party, and Samajwadi Party, of spreading confusion and fear instead of supporting the nation during challenging global circumstances. Mahajan said the opposition was attempting to create unnecessary panic through misinformation and social media campaigns regarding shortages of fuel and essential goods. Harsh Mahajan said India's economy is currently strong and stable, unlike during the UPA era when inflation had reportedly reached double digits and the economy was categorized among the "Fragile Five."

## Himachal's Anti-Chitta model to be replicated in other states

**SHIMLA:** The Government's Anti-Chitta Model, which has proved effective in cracking down on drug traffickers, is now drawing attention from across the country. The regional office of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has sought a detailed report from the state government to study the model and explore its implementation in other states for more effective action against the drug menace. After the Congress government came to power in the state, Chief Minister Thakur Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu directed the preparation of a comprehensive strategy to tackle the growing menace of 'chitta' (heroin). Under this strategy, not only drug traffickers but also drug abuse patterns were mapped at the Panchayat level. Himachal Pradesh has become the first state in the country to identify drug addicts and traffickers at the Panchayat level and categorize areas into Red, Yellow and Green zones based on the cases of chitta in these panchayats. The survey revealed that 234 Panchayats in the state were severely affected by chitta abuse and trafficking, and were categorized under the Red Zone. Following directions from the Chief Minister, police surveillance and enforcement were intensified in these areas, yielding encouraging results. Under the Anti-Chitta Model, the state government has focused not only on strict action against drug traffickers but also on the rehabilitation of victims affected by substance abuse. The government implemented the PIT-NDPS Act and detained 174 offenders under its provisions, making Himachal Pradesh the leading state in the country in taking such stringent action. Additionally, illegal properties worth Rs. 51 crore belonging to drug traffickers have been confiscated, which is three times higher than during the previous government.

## Congress corruption model exposed in Dharamshala, tender mafia and scams flourished at public expense: Bikram Thakur

Senior BJP leader and former minister Bikram Thakur launched a sharp attack on the Congress government and the Dharamshala Municipal Corporation administration ahead of the Municipal Corporation elections, stating that Congress rule in Dharamshala has become a symbol of corruption, administrative chaos, tender mafia operations, water crisis and complete failure of development works. BJP alleged that the Congress-led Municipal Corporation ignored public issues while promoting corruption and political patronage. Bikram Thakur said that a case had been registered against senior Congress leader and councillor Devender Singh Jaggi in connection with an



alleged scam involving the leasing of Municipal Corporation property, which reportedly caused a loss of more than ?1.4 crore to the public exchequer. He alleged that while the Municipal Corporation received only Rs. 18.39 lakh as rent, nearly Rs. 1.61 crore was allegedly earned through sub-leasing arrangements. He further stated that under the leadership of Mayor Neenu Sharma, the Municipal Corporation imposed additional financial burden on

the public. In the 2025-26 municipal budget, the electricity cess was proposed to be increased tenfold from 1 paisa per unit to 10 paisa per unit, reflecting Congress' tendency to impose higher taxes instead of providing relief to citizens amid rising inflation. The BJP leader alleged that the Dharamshala Bus Stand project has remained incomplete for years due to land disputes, pending approvals and administrative inefficiency under the Congress

government. He said repeated announcements and foundation stone ceremonies failed to deliver any actual benefit to the people.

Bikram Thakur also alleged that a "tender mafia" has been operating within the Dharamshala Municipal Corporation, with nearly 80 percent of civic works being controlled by just five to seven contractors. He claimed that commission-based tender allotments and large-scale irregularities in public works have become hallmarks of the Congress administration. He said allegations have also surfaced regarding misuse of Municipal Corporation funds for renovation of the Commissioner's residence during the Mayor's tenure, while several wards continue to suffer from poor civic infrastructure and lack of basic amenities.

## BJP's Patra questions Rahul Gandhi on funding source of 54 foreign visits

BJP MP Sambit Patra on Thursday questioned Congress leader Rahul Gandhi over the funding of his foreign visits, alleging that the Leader of Opposition had spent nearly Rs 60 crore on 54 overseas trips over the past 22 years. Addressing a press conference, Patra claimed that Rahul Gandhi had undertaken several foreign trips while holding elected office and alleged that details regarding the source of funding for these visits were not public. "LoP Rahul Gandhi has been in an elected position for nearly 22 years. In these years, he has travelled abroad multiple times. Officially, the declared foreign trips amount to 54. These tours are public, but their funding is not public," Patra said. He further alleged that three to four people accompanied Rahul Gandhi on each



foreign visit and claimed that the total expenditure on these trips amounted to nearly Rs 60 crore. "On each of his foreign trips, about 3-4 people have travelled with him. The total expense of his foreign trips has been Rs 60 crore," the BJP leader alleged. Patra questioned how the expenditure on the visits was financed. "We have the details of Rahul Gandhi's income from 2013-14 to 2022-23. In 10 years, Rahul

Gandhi's income was Rs 11 crore. With an income of Rs 11 crore, Rahul Gandhi has spent Rs 60 crore," he alleged. The BJP leader further questioned whether the trips were funded personally, by the government, or by foreign entities. "The question that arises is - when he travels abroad, is the funding being done by the Government of India or by some foreign agency? If there is foreign

funding, then provisions under FCRA apply. If it is personal funding, then it must be declared under income tax laws," Patra said. The remarks came after Rahul Gandhi criticised PM Modi's "seven appeals" where the Prime Minister urged citizens to prioritise work from home, reduce fuel consumption, avoid foreign travel for a year, adopt Swadeshi products, reduce cooking oil consumption, shift to natural farming and curb gold purchases to help the country cope with global economic pressures caused by international conflicts while addressing a gathering in Secunderabad. Rahul Gandhi termed the appeals as "failures" rather than "sermons." "These aren't sermons -- these are proofs of failure," alleging that after "12 years" of governance, the government was now instructing people "what to buy, what not to buy, where to go, where not to go," Gandhi posted on X.

## AIUTUC State Vice President Mehar Singh Bangar condemns anti-labour codes

HISAR: AIUTUC General Secretary Shri Shankar Dasgupta, in a press statement, strongly condemned unilateral notification of anti-labour codes and called for intensifying protests. He said: Central trade union AIUTUC strongly opposes and condemns arbitrary move by Central Government to notify final rules of Wage Code (2019), Social Security Code (2020), Industrial Relations Code (2020), and Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 on May 8 despite strong opposition from entire working class of country. This unilateral move, taken without meaningful consultation with central trade unions and without holding an Indian Labour Conference, is a direct attack on democratic norms and a violation of international labour standards to which India has signed. These codes, introduced in name of "ease of doing business," prioritize corporate profits over lives of workers. These codes are systematically undoing historic gains made through 150 years of hard-fought struggle, effectively pushing Indian workers back to colonial-era exploitation. We condemn move to make union registration more difficult, decriminalize violations by employers, criminalize trade union activities and practically eliminate right to strike.

# Govt extends Karnal smart city project till 2027, CS reviews progress

The Haryana Government has extended the tenure of Karnal Smart City Limited and its Project Management Consultancy till March 31, 2027 to ensure timely completion of ongoing projects and smooth handing over of assets to the concerned departments. Similarly, Faridabad Smart City Limited project has been granted extension till March 31, 2027.

This was disclosed during the meeting of the State-Level High-Powered Steering Committee (SLHPSC) chaired by Haryana Chief Secretary Sh. Anurag Rastogi today to review the progress of Smart City Mission projects in Karnal and Faridabad.

During the meeting, it was informed that the extension has been granted in line with the directions of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) so that the remaining projects nearing completion can be executed efficiently and citizens continue to benefit from modern urban infrastructure.

The Chief Secretary reviewed the

physical and financial progress of projects being implemented under the Smart City Mission in Karnal and Faridabad and appreciated the pace of development works being carried out in both cities. The Chief Secretary empha-



sized that the Smart City Mission has significantly strengthened urban infrastructure, improved civic amenities and enhanced the quality of life for citizens through modern and technology-driven development initiatives. He

directed officials to ensure timely completion of the remaining projects and effective utilization of public assets created under the Mission.

Commissioner and Secretary, Urban Local Bodies Department, Sh. Ashok Kumar Meena informed that Faridabad Smart City Limited has undertaken 46 projects worth Rs 916.83 crore, out of which 32 projects have already been completed. Similarly, Karnal Smart City Limited has taken up 122 projects worth Rs 930 crore, with 86 projects already completed and several others in advanced stages of execution. He said a large number of completed projects have already been handed over to the concerned departments for future operation and maintenance. Faridabad Smart City Limited has handed over 23 completed projects, while Karnal Smart City Limited has handed over 83 projects to the respective agencies. It was further shared that both smart cities have successfully utilized the grants allocated under the Smart City Mission. Each city received a total financial provision of Rs 980 crore jointly from the Government of India and the Haryana Government in a 50:50 ratio.

# CM Flying raids unregistered dental hospital in Hisar, Class 9-pass youth found treating patients

A major case of alleged medical negligence and illegal healthcare operations has surfaced in Hisar after the CM Flying Squad conducted a raid on an unregistered dental hospital where an unqualified youth was allegedly treating patients.

The joint operation was carried out by the CM Flying Hisar team along with officials from the Health Department. During the raid, several serious irregularities were detected, following which the dental facility was sealed and an FIR was registered against two persons.

The action was led by CM Flying Hisar Range in-charge Sunaina along with Dental Surgeon Dr. Pulkit, ASI Surender and HC Jitender.

According to officials, the team had received information that a private clinic operating under the name "Gera Dental" in Hisar was allegedly running without registration and providing unauthorized dental treatment to patients.

Acting on the complaint, the joint team conducted a surprise inspection and examined the documents, staff and facilities present at the clinic.

During the inspection, officials reportedly found that the clinic was not registered under any relevant government healthcare regulations. No valid licence, OPD register or records of a registered doctor were found at the premises.

The most shocking revelation during the raid was that a youth identified as Pradeep Kumar, reportedly educated only up to Class 9, was allegedly examining patients, prescribing medicines and collecting consultation charges while seated at the dental chair.

Officials said patients present at the clinic also confirmed that Pradeep had attended to them and provided medicines.

Clinic operator Mahender Bajaj reportedly informed the team that the clinic was being run by Dr. Tarun Gera. However, investigators claimed that no documents, prescription slips, billing records or registration details linked to



Dr. Tarun Gera were found at the spot. This raised suspicion that the facility was operating illegally without proper medical supervision.

The inspection also revealed that the clinic allegedly lacked mandatory approval from the Haryana State Pollution Control Board. No records related to biomedical waste disposal or waste management arrangements were found during the raid.

During questioning, Rakesh, a resident of Sisyai Ravan village, told officials that he had visited the clinic for dental treatment where Pradeep examined him, gave medicines and charged money.

Another patient, identified as Dr. Sandeep, also stated that his dental check-up had been conducted by Pradeep and that he had paid for medicines at the clinic.

CM Flying Hisar Range in-charge Sunaina stated that operating a medical facility without registration and allowing unqualified persons to provide treatment is a serious offence

It is reported that, in an attempt to avoid police custody, the accused had even filed a bail application in court; however, the court refused to grant him bail. Despite this, the accused continued to wander from place to place in a desperate bid to elude the police. As soon as the investigation of the case was handed over to CIA Ladwa, the in-charge—Inspector Surender Singh—look the matter seriously and constituted a special team to apprehend the accused. The team not only laid an elaborate trap to capture the prime accused but also conducted



raids at several locations. The police team ultimately achieved success in this endeavor, and the prime accused was arrested by the team just yesterday. This outcome was reached following a written assurance provided by Ladwa DSP Nirmal Kumar. The DSP gave a written undertaking to

the committee formed by the villagers, assuring them that he stood in solidarity with the deceased's family members and that strict action would be taken against anyone found guilty in this case. It was only after receiving this assurance from DSP Nirmal Kumar that the deceased's family and the villagers proceeded to perform the final rites for the deceased. Nevertheless, despite these assurances, it took the police approximately 24 days—following Labh Singh's death—to apprehend the prime accused in this case. Providing details regarding the case, CIA Ladwa In-charge Inspector Surender Singh stated that Sandeep Kadami—the prime accused in the Halapur case involving the death of Labh Singh—has been arrested.

## Govt bans sugar exports with immediate effect

India, on Wednesday, banned sugar exports with immediate effect until September 30, 2026, or until further orders. The Ministry of Commerce & Industry announced the decision through a formal notification that shifts the export status for various sugar categories from the "restricted" list to the "prohibited" category. The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) confirmed that the amendment affects raw sugar, white sugar, and refined sugar classified under ITC (HS) codes. This regulatory change comes as a measure to manage domestic supply and ensure food security over the next two years. "The export policy of Sugar (Raw Sugar, White Sugar and Refined Sugar) under ITC (HS) Codes 1701 14 90 and 1701 99 90 is amended from 'Restricted' to 'Prohibited' with immediate effect till September 30, 2026, or until further orders, whichever is earlier," the notification stated. Despite the overall ban, the government provided specific exceptions for certain international obligations and existing schemes. The prohibition does not apply to sugar exported to the European Union and the United States under CXL and TRQ quotas, which will proceed according to the procedures established in relevant public notices. Furthermore, shipments under the Advance Authorisation Scheme (AAS) will continue to be governed by the Foreign Trade Policy 2023. The Ministry also detailed transitional arrangements for consignments already in the physical export pipeline. Shipments where the loading of sugar onto the vessel commenced before the notification's publication date are allowed to proceed. The DGFT also permitted exports in cases where shipping bills were filed and vessels had already berthed or anchored at Indian ports with an allocated rotation number. "The approval for loading in such vessels shall be issued only after confirmation by the concerned Port Authority regarding berthing/anchoring prior to this Notification," the Ministry noted. Consignments already handed over to Customs or Custodians and registered in electronic systems with verifiable evidence are also exempt from the immediate ban. However, the government also mentioned that exports might be permitted to other countries to meet their specific food security needs, provided there is a formal request from their respective governments. The notification highlighted that if the date of prohibition is not extended beyond September 30, 2026, the export policy for these sugar categories will automatically revert back to the 'Restricted' status.

## PM Modi's diplomatic tour to strengthen India's Energy and trade partnerships

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on a five-nation diplomatic tour from May 15 to 20, with a strong focus on bolstering India's energy security partnerships, advancing semiconductor and technology cooperation, and deepening strategic engagement with key global partners. The visit, covering the United Arab Emirates and four European nations, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway and Italy, comes at a time when India is actively expanding its global economic and geopolitical footprint amid evolving international dynamics.

During the UAE leg of the visit, energy security will remain a key priority, with two significant Memoranda of Understanding in the areas of LPG cooperation and Strategic Petroleum Reserves expected to be signed. The engagements are aimed at reinforcing India's long-term energy resilience while simultaneously accelerating cooperation in trade, investment, defence and critical technologies.

"On PM's UAE visit and discussion on India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), We have a concrete agenda covering the full spectrum of bilateral relations with the UAE, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, and other Nordic partners. This includes discussions and engagement with the business community. In the UAE, the visit follows recent developments around OPEC pipelines. With the Netherlands, semiconductors are a key area of cooperation, and discussions will include Advanced Semiconductor and IMEC-related topics, which will also be covered and briefed accordingly," MEA Secretary (West) Sibi George said.

The tour will begin in the UAE on May 15, where Prime Minister Modi will hold talks with UAE President Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan on bilateral relations, energy cooperation, regional developments and investment partnerships. India and the UAE



share a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, with the Gulf nation remaining one of India's key economic and energy partners. More than 4.5 million Indians live and work in the UAE.

The UAE is an important partner for India in energy security. Last year, it was the fourth-largest source of crude oil for India, meeting nearly 11% of the country's requirements. In the LNG sector, Indian companies and the UAE's Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC Gas) have entered into long-term supply contracts. The UAE is also the largest supplier of LPG to India, meeting nearly 40% of the country's requirements. In addition, the UAE is the second-largest destination for petroleum, oil and lubricant exports from Indian

refiners.

India and the UAE are also expanding cooperation in the field of renewable energy. A major highlight of the visit will be the India-Nordic Summit in Norway, where discussions are expected to centre on emerging technologies, semiconductor collaboration, green transition, innovation and resilient supply chains. India is also likely to seek stronger partnerships with Nordic nations in clean energy, digital infrastructure and advanced manufacturing sectors.

This will be the first visit of Prime Minister Modi to Norway, and will mark the first visit from India to Norway in 43 years.

From May 15 to 17, the Prime Minister will visit the Netherlands and participate in engagements linked to the third India-Nordic

Summit, which is expected to focus on green technology, climate action, digital innovation, trade and sustainable industrial partnerships.

MEA Secretary (West) Sibi George said, "During the visit, the Prime Minister will hold bilateral talks with the Prime Minister of the Netherlands. He will also meet their Majesties, King Willem-Alexander and Queen Maxima. Prime Minister is also expected to address the Indian community and meet top business leaders of the Netherlands."

This would be Prime Minister's second visit to the Netherlands. Last one was in 2017. The visit comes at an important juncture in the bilateral ties of both the countries. Our partnership has considerably deepened over the last few years across traditional sectors like trade, investment and

priority sectors of what that is, water, agriculture and health as well as people, the MEA said.

"The visit to the four European countries comes in the backdrop of the India-EU FTA that we finalised earlier this year," Sibi George said.

Officials said the visit will primarily focus on trade, technology, clean energy, innovation, defence cooperation, resilient supply chains and strategic investments, while also advancing India's broader economic and geopolitical engagement with Europe and the Gulf region.

A major highlight of the European leg will be Modi's visit to Sweden, where he is scheduled to address the European Roundtable for Industry alongside European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen. The forum brings together top business leaders from the European Union, EFTA countries and the United Kingdom, reflecting India's growing role in Europe's economic and strategic priorities.

The forthcoming visit reflects the growing depth of India-Sweden ties under the India-Sweden Innovation Partnership announced in 2018.

Sweden today is one of the world's most innovative economies, and India and Sweden increasingly view each other as complementary innovation and technology partners, the MEA said.

During the visit, the prime minister will hold consultations with the Prime Minister of Sweden covering the spectrum of bilateral actions, including trade and investment, green transition, AI and emerging technologies, resilient supply chains, difference, cooperation, space, collaboration, climate action, and people-to-people ties.

## India secures extradition of terror-financing accused Iqbal Singh from Portugal

The Government of India has successfully secured the extradition of fugitive Iqbal Singh from Portugal in a major breakthrough against transnational

drug trafficking and financing terrorism. He will now face trial before courts in India.

The extradition was carried out under the bilateral extradition

coordination between the Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, National Investigation Agency, Central Bureau of Investigation and the Indian Embassy in Lisbon, working alongside Portuguese agencies.

Officials described the extradition as a significant step in India's continuing crackdown on fugitives involved in organised crime, narcotics trafficking and terror-linked activities abroad.

In an official statement issued in Lisbon on 13 May 2026, the Indian government thanked Portuguese authorities for their cooperation and support in ensuring the successful extradition.

The development underscores New Delhi's growing international coordination in pursuing wanted fugitives and dismantling global criminal and terror-financing networks.

## India's AI ambitions require public-private partnership model for scalability: AI4India

India's journey toward scaling artificial intelligence is shifting from a question of basic capability to a focus on how these technologies are developed and governed. As the nation eyes leadership in the global AI landscape, a public-private partnership model is emerging as the necessary framework to balance rapid innovation with digital sovereignty, according to the AI4India Weekly substack. The blueprint for this trajectory resides in India's previous digital successes, such as the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) and the Unified Payments Interface (UPI).

As per AI4India, these success stories rarely emerge from pure state control or unrestricted private-sector dominance. Instead, they thrive on a collaborative architecture that allows public infrastructure and private innovation to work together at scale. AI4India.org, a non-government entity, is working to democratise access to Artificial Intelligence and ensure social and inclusive growth for India. "Neither the government nor the private sector can achieve this alone. What we need is a true fusion -- a strong public-private partnership," stated Lt. Gen. Rakesh Kapoor AVSM, VSM (Retd.) during a roundtable on "New and Emerging Opportunities in AI" hosted by AI4India and the Centre for Policy Research and

Governance (CPRG). This direction remains visible in the current policy approach. The weekly substack highlighted Prime Minister Narendra Modi advocating for a public-private partnership model for pooling critical AI resources like compute power, emphasizing the hybrid nature of the emerging strategy.

The government recognizes that it cannot build a competitive ecosystem at the required



speed alone, given the massive investments needed for semiconductors, cloud capacity, and research. "But leaving AI entirely to market forces also carries risks. Fragmented systems, concentration of power, foreign platform dependence and uneven access could undermine both innovation and digital sovereignty," the organization wrote. It also noted Union IT Minister

Ashwini Vaishnaw, highlighting how AI can strengthen existing digital systems and improve public service delivery, while institutions like the NPCI begin to integrate AI into payments and grievance redressal.

A meaningful framework for this partnership requires multiple layers of cooperation. The government funds foundational infrastructure, including sovereign compute capacity and Indian-

language resources, while creating regulatory guardrails. Public institutions then play a central role in sectors like healthcare and education, where large-scale data systems already exist. The AI4India Weekly mentioned that the private sector focuses on the application layer, building tools for MSMEs and citizen-facing services. Startups develop specialized solutions for sectoral workflows, while larger firms contribute infrastructure and research. Academic institutions act as the third pillar by supporting foundational research and talent

development to strengthen long-term capability. "If India can replicate the collaborative architecture that powered UPI, it may not only build a competitive AI ecosystem but also define a governance model for how large-scale technologies can be deployed in the digital age," the weekly substack stated.

## Study raises possibility of country without butterflies



A study has been released, which for the first time tallies butterfly data from more than 76,000 surveys across the continental United States. The results: between 2000 and 2020, total butterfly abundance fell by 22 per cent across the 554 species counted. That means that for every five individual butterflies within the contiguous US in the year 2000, there were only four in 2020.

Action must be taken," said Elise Zipkin, a Red Cedar Distinguished Professor of quantitative ecology at Michigan State University and a co-author of the paper. "To

lose 22 percent of butterflies across the continental U.S. in just two decades is distressing and shows a clear need for broad-scale conservation interventions," Elise added. In this paper, Zipkin and Haddad were among a working group of scientists with the USGS Powell Center for Analysis and Synthesis who aggregated decades of butterfly data from 35 monitor programs, including records of over 12.6 million butterflies.

Using data integration approaches, the team examined how butterfly abundances changed regionally and individually for the 342 species with enough

data. Abundance is a term that threatens to become ironic. Butterfly populations dropped an average of 1.3% annually across the country, except for the Pacific Northwest. But even that encouraging result came with a caveat.

Further scrutiny of the apparent 10% increase in overall abundance in the Pacific Northwest over the 20-year study period was credited largely to the California tortoiseshell butterfly, which was enjoying a population boom not expected to be sustained. "This is the definitive study of butterflies in the U.S.," said Collin Edwards, the

study's lead author. "For those who were not already aware of insect declines, this should be a wake-up call. We urgently need both local- and national-scale conservation efforts to support butterflies and other insects. We have never had as clear and compelling a picture of butterfly declines as we do now." Edwards had been a postdoctoral research associate at Washington State University, Vancouver, and now works at the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The results reveal that 13 times as many species declined as increased - with 107 species losing more than half their populations.

**AJAY MALHOTRA FATEHGARH SAHIB:** With the Bassi Pathana Municipal Council elections scheduled for May 26, the nomination process that began on May 13 has already run into trouble. According to him, the heavy workload has caused unavoidable delays in issuing the documents. Reacting

strongly to the situation, BJP senior leader Kuldeep Singh Sidupur from the Bassi Pathana constituency said that if the Municipal Council fails to provide essential documents like the NOC on time, then the notification issued by the State Election Commission loses its significance. He criticized the administrative lapse, stating that such negligence undermines the democratic process.

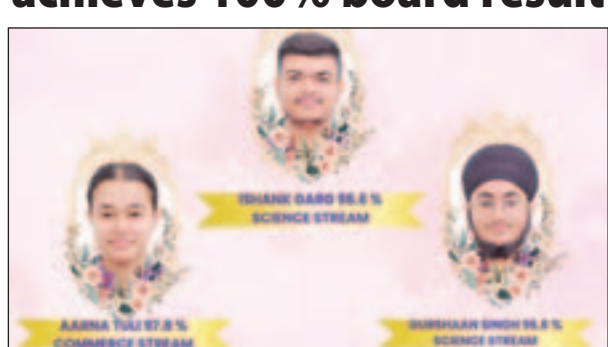

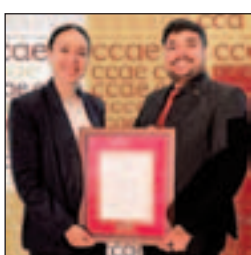
SDM Devendra Sharma holds meeting of officials to speed up HPV vaccination campaign

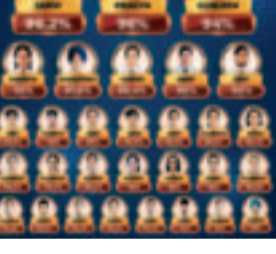

## FIFA World Cup final to feature first-ever halftime show with Madonna, BTS and Shakira

Actor and musician Jena Malone has recalled an unsettling fan encounter she experienced at the age of 14 following the release of the 1998 drama 'Stepmom', according to People. Malone, who played Anna, the daughter of Susan Sarandon's terminally ill character Jackie Harrison in the film, said the incident occurred while she was attending school in New York. "I remember there was one bad fan experience I had on a subway, and it was right after Stepmom came out, which is another one that I feel like really people hold dear to their hearts," Malone said, as per the outlet. Recalling the interaction, she said, "Some woman just looked at me across from on the subway and she's like, 'Were you that little girl in Stepmom?' And I was like, 'Yeah.' She's like, 'I just wanted to slap you.' The comment left Malone startled at the time. "I wasn't the best socially adapted human, so that was an interesting one," she said. "And I was like, 'If I'm alone in public, maybe I should be like, 'No, that's not me,' just in case." The actor added that she would have felt "a little bad for lying" if she had denied her identity. Malone also shared that her 8-year-old son, Ode Mountain, whom she shares with Ethan DeLorenzo, often notices when she avoids acknowledging fan recognition in public. "Sometimes I just don't feel like saying 'yes.' Sometimes I feel protective in front of my son, but then he'll be like, 'Did you just lie? You just lied to the mom. Go back and tell them that you were that person,'" she said, according to People. She added humorously, "He does not like it at all. And sometimes he'll answer for me, 'Yes, she is. Would you like an autograph?' He's like, 'Here she is. Let's all line up.' It's so funny." Released in 1998, 'Stepmom' also starred Julia Roberts as Isabel, the woman preparing to marry Jackie's former husband. The film explored themes of family, illness and blended relationships as Jackie struggles to accept a new maternal figure in her children's lives. Apart from acting, Malone recently returned to music with the release of her new album Flowers for Men on May 8, marking her first album release in more than a decade. Describing the record as "sci-fi folk," Malone said the album explores relationship dynamics and emotional expectations. "I was reading a lot of relational books -- lots about love, lots about all the different attachment theories, different love relational styles from polyamory to ethical non-monogamy, to relationship anarchy," she said about the inspiration behind the album, according to People.
