Centre approves Rs  
10,000-cr ATF price  
stabilisation fund

NEW DELHI: In a major relief measure for the aviation sector grappling with soaring fuel costs amid the ongoing West Asia crisis, the union Cabinet on Wednesday approved a one-time budgetary support package of up to Rs 10,000 crore for Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) to facilitate Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) price stabilisation for scheduled Indian airlines.

Announcing the decision after a Cabinet meeting, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the government had approved the creation of a Price Stabilisation Fund that would provide interest-free advances to OMCs, enabling them to offer more predictable fuel prices to Indian carriers operating both domestic and international services.

"The union Cabinet has approved one-time budgetary support not exceeding Rs 10,000 crore for Oil Marketing Companies to provide ATF price stabilisation support to Scheduled Indian Airlines for their domestic and international operations," Vaishnaw told reporters.

RBI dismisses gold  
sale rumours

MUMBAI: Debunking reports of gold sale, the Reserve Bank of India on Wednesday said there is no change in the physical stock of gold, which remains unchanged at 880.52 tonnes.

The clarification from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) comes following reports that the RBI may have sold gold amounting to approximately USD 12 billion to shield its foreign-currency reserves from the impact of the ongoing conflict in West Asia.

"The RBI emphasises that these reports are not correct," the central bank said in a statement.

Indian national  
killed in attack on  
Kuwait airport

DUBAI: An Indian national was killed in an attack that targeted Kuwait International Airport, officials said on Wednesday.

In a post on X, the Embassy of India in Kuwait expressed its "deepest condolences at the tragic demise of an Indian national due to an attack on the airport in Kuwait today."

It said the mission is "closely co-ordinating" with the Kuwaiti authorities to render all possible support and assistance to the bereaved family as well as those injured in the incident.

17 foreigners among 21 dead in  
Delhi hotel fire; eight on ventilatorAGENCY

Seventeen foreign nationals were among the 21 people killed in the devastating fire at a hotel in Delhi's Malviya Nagar on Wednesday, with most of the victims reportedly hailing from Liberia, Nigeria, Mozambique and Bangladesh, officials said. Earlier in the day, at least 21 people were killed and more than 40 rescued after a massive fire broke out at Flourish Stay B&B in Malviya Nagar at around 8:48 am. Officials said over 15 foreign nationals were among the deceased. Addressing a press conference, Max Healthcare Group Medical Director Dr Sandeep Budhiraja said eight patients injured in the fire are currently on ventilator support and remain in critical condition. "Eight patients are on ventilators and undergoing treatment. The majority of them have suffered from asphyxiation injuries, which are caused by smoke inhalation. All of them have minor burns, not deep burns. One patient had burns of more than 25 per cent. He was on a ventilator, so we shifted him to the burn ward at Safdarjung Hospital. Five patients were stable and came with minor injuries," Budhiraja said. The doctor further said several patients suffered fractures after reportedly jumping from upper floors to escape the blaze. "These patients basically had two or three types of injuries: lung injuries, minor burns, and bone injuries. Because many patients claimed they jumped from high buildings, the resulting fractures were long bone fractures and pelvic bone fractures. One patient has a spinal injury and is undergoing neurosurgery," Budhiraja said. He added that both Indian and foreign nationals



were among the victims and said 18 of the deceased included nine men and nine women. Meanwhile, Chief Fire Officer (South Zone) Abhilash Kumar Malik said the Delhi Fire Service initially deployed seven fire tenders after receiving a call at 8:50 am, later increasing manpower and equipment as the scale of the incident became clear. "7 vehicles were initially dispatched, along with an Assistant Divisional Officer. However, as calls increased, we increased the number of vehicles and the officers' category. When our team initially arrived, they conducted firefighting and a search operation. We evacuated 39 people from there and transferred them to hospitals," Malik said.

PM Modi announces Rs 2 lakh ex-gratia  
for next of kin, Rs 50,000 for injured

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday announced Rs 2 lakh ex-gratia to the victims' families, and Rs 50 thousand to the injured in the fire incident in Delhi's Malviya Nagar that claimed 21 lives, while expressing grief for the victims' families. In a post on X, the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said that an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund (PMNRF) will be provided to the next of kin of each deceased, while those injured in the incident will receive Rs 50,000. "The loss of lives due to a fire incident in Malviya Nagar, Delhi is tragic.

CBSE clarifies students can  
use UPI, cards, net banking  
for re-evaluation payments

NEW DELHI: Amid reports that students were facing difficulties making payments on the Verification and Re-evaluation portal without accounts in State Bank of India (SBI), Canara Bank, Bank of Baroda, or Indian Bank, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) on Wednesday clarified that students are not required to hold accounts in these banks to complete the payment process. In a post on X, CBSE said candidates can use multiple online payment options, including UPI, net banking, credit cards, and debit cards through the designated payment gateways available on the portal. "Payment gateways of SBI, Canara Bank, Bank of Baroda and Indian Bank are available on the Verification and Re-evaluation portal. Students need not have an account with these banks to complete payment but can use any of these payment gateways to make payments. Candidates may use the available online payment options - UPI, Net banking, Credit card / Debit card, through the designated gateways," CBSE said. The board further stated that as of 9:30 am on Wednesday, nearly 40,000 students had completed the application process through the facility without facing any issues. "As of 9:30 am today, nearly 40,000 students have availed this facility and completed the application process successfully without any issues. Please rely on official CBSE communications for correct information," CBSE said. The clarification came after Delhi Leader of Opposition Alishi alleged that students could make payments for re-evaluation applications only through accounts in SBI.

## Punjab set to get BJP's double-engine government in 2027: Hry CM

Nayab Singh Saini on Wednesday said the state is poised to elect a BJP-led double-engine government in the 2027 Assembly elections. Extending his congratulations and best wishes to the new state president, Sh. Nayab Singh Saini said Sardar Kewal Singh Dhillon's organisational experience, public connect and commitment to the party's ideology would provide fresh impetus to the BJP's expansion in Punjab.

During his visit, the Chief Minister also performed Pooja. He said the Bharatiya Janata Party is an ideology-driven organisation where national interest and public service remain paramount. The BJP's commitment to nation-building and welfare-oriented governance, he added.

Fee hike by private schools  
to be capped at 5 pc annually  
in Punjab: CM MannBUREAU

The Punjab government on Wednesday announced a major regulatory framework for private schools, proposing a cap of five per cent on annual fee hikes and mandating the refund of excess fees collected over the prescribed limit during the past three years.

Addressing a press conference in Chandigarh, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said the government would introduce a stringent law to curb arbitrary fee increases and prevent private schools from imposing undue financial burdens on parents.

Under the proposed legislation, private schools will not be allowed to raise fees by more than five per cent annually. Mann said institutions that have increased fees by more than 15 per cent over the last three years would be required to refund the excess amount collected from parents.

The Chief Minister also said schools would no longer be permitted to compel parents to purchase books, uniforms, or other items from specific shops. Educational institutions would be required to provide complete information regarding such requirements in

advance and ensure parents have the freedom to make purchases from vendors of their choice.

Mann said the government would bring an ordinance within the next few days, followed by a comprehensive law during the upcoming Monsoon Session of the



Punjab Assembly. He added that the proposed regulations would apply to all schools in the state, including national and international institutions.

He said complaints related to fee hikes already received by District Education Officer (DEO) offices would be investigated, and action would be taken against schools found vio-

lating regulations. The Chief Minister announced that annual audits of private schools would be conducted to ensure compliance with the new rules. He said the government was preparing a detailed legal framework in consultation with experts from various fields to strengthen transparency and accountability in the education sector.

Mann further said amendments would be made to the Punjab Regulation of Fee of Unaided Educational Institutions Act, 2026. He criticised the previous framework introduced during the government of former Chief Minister Amrinder Singh, alleging that it allowed schools excessive freedom in determining fee structures. According to Mann, earlier provisions permitted fee increases of up to eight per cent, but subsequent changes enabled institutions to raise charges without adequate regulation. Referring to the recent death of a Class XI student in Amritsar, Mann described the incident as deeply tragic and said it had highlighted the need for stronger safeguards against alleged harassment linked to fee payments.

## DK Shivakumar sworn in as Karnataka's CM, leads new cabinet

Shivakumar sworn in as Karnataka's 25th CM, leads new cabinet DK Shivakumar on Wednesday was sworn in as the 25th Chief Minister of Karnataka at a grand ceremony held at Lok Bhavan here, formally taking charge of a new Congress-led government in the state.

Shivakumar also became the eighth Chief Minister from the Vokkaliga community, marking a significant political milestone as he assumed office amid a large gathering of national and state leaders, religious heads, and public figures.

Along with him, 13 ministers were sworn in, completing the first stage of cabinet formation. The event marked



the formal transfer of executive responsibility to the new Council of Ministers. The ceremony was attended by se-

nior Congress leadership, including Rahul Gandhi, AICC president Mallikarjun Kharge, KC Venugopal, Karnataka in-

charge Randeep Singh Surjewala, and former Chief Minister Siddaramaiah. Chief Ministers from several states also participated, underscoring the political significance of the occasion. The gathering included religious leaders, film personalities, sportspersons and industrialists, with over 40 swamis present alongside notable personalities such as actor Ravichandran, actress Jayamala, actor Kichcha Sudeep, actress Ramya, former cricketer Venkatesh Prasad and industrialist Anil Kumble. Shivakumar's family members, including his mother Gowrama, wife Usha and children, were also present at the ceremony. In a departure from convention, the oath-taking ceremony was conducted facing east instead of the traditional west-facing orientation, following advice from spiritual.

Three students convicted in Zakir  
Musa-linked terror case

CHANDIGARH: A special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court has convicted three students associated with a terror module of the Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind (AGH) for waging war against the nation and orchestrating a terrorist conspiracy.

The court will pronounce their sentences on June 4 via video conferencing, while a fourth accused, Suhail Ahmad Bhat, was acquitted due to a lack of sufficient evidence. The convicts, identified as Zahid Gulzar, Yasir Rafiq Bhat, and Mohammad Idris Shah, were found guilty under various sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), the Arms Act, the Explosive Substances Act, and the Indian Penal Code, including

criminal conspiracy. The case dates back to October 10, 2018, when security agencies raided a hostel room at an educational institute in Jalandhar. The operation led to the recovery of an AK-56 rifle, a 30-bore Mauser, ammunition, and one kilogram of explosive powder, which forensic analysis later identified as a mixture of ammonium nitrate and aluminium commonly used in bomb-making. Following the initial recovery and sensing deeper cross-border ramifications, the investigation was subsequently handed over to the NIA. Investigations revealed that the convicted students were in direct communication with Zakir Musa, the slain chief of the AGH terrorist outfit.

Nihangs begin 'Khalsa Tax'  
collection in Punjab over  
Himachal entry levy

CHANDIGARH: Members of the Nihang organisation Tarna Dal on Wednesday began collecting what they termed a "Khalsa Tax" from vehicles entering Punjab from Himachal Pradesh, protesting against the entry tax imposed by the neighbouring hill state. The collection drive started near Kiratpur Sahib on the Kullu-Manali highway, where Nihang volunteers stopped vehicles and sought contributions from motorists. Tarna Dal leader Nihang Achhar Singh said the organisation was charging Rs 100 from cars and other small vehicles, Rs 200 from light commercial vehicles and between Rs 300 and Rs 500 from larger vehicles. He also announced plans to

stage a road blockade near Mor-da village on the same highway later in the day to intensify the protest against the Himachal Pradesh government's taxation policy. Responding to questions over the legality of the collection, Achhar Singh said the money would be used for "Sarbat da Bhala" (the welfare of all) and claimed that no vehicle owner would be forced to pay. He distinguished the move from toll collection by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), stating that highway tolls are linked to road construction and maintenance, whereas, according to him, Himachal Pradesh was imposing an unjustified burden on travellers.

**Pensioner doctors of Punjab condemn delay in release of pay arrears**

**SANGRUR (SUSHIL GOYAL):** Pensioner Doctors Association Punjab (PDAP) has strongly condemned the inordinate delay in the release of arrears of pensioner doctors, both PCMS and medical dental teachers, who had retired after December 2015, despite the decision taken in the meeting of Council of Ministers held under Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on February 13, 2025 in which liquidation plan of payment of the arrears was decided and duly notified by the Government vide notification dated February 18, 2025. In a statement, the PDAP state President Dr DC Sharma and State General Secretary Dr Surinder Singla alleged total violation of its own Liquidation Plan for the release of arrears etc by the Punjab Government. Dr Singla said the state Government was supposed to release the arrears for the year 2016 employees in 12 equal monthly installments, starting from April 2026 and was to pay three installments till June 2026 but till date most of the pensioner doctors have not received the same. Similarly arrears of leave encashment were to be paid in four installments, starting from April 2025 and then after every six months. These are also not being paid in time on one or the other pretext, he added. Dr Singla said the continuous delaying tactics of the government for not releasing the financial dues of the senior citizen pensioners is grave injustice and political bullying amounting to Contempt of the Court urging the Punjab and Haryana High Court to take suo motu notice of the delaying tactics of Punjab Government.

**Pathankot gets first PERT team for pulmonary embolism treatment**

**PATHANKOT (SHARANJEET):** In a major step towards advanced emergency cardiac and pulmonary care, Amandeep Hospital, Pathankot, in collaboration with Ujala Cygnus Hospitals, has launched the region's first Pulmonary Embolism Response Team (PERT) for the treatment of life-threatening pulmonary embolism cases. Hospital authorities said pulmonary embolism occurs when blood clots block arteries in the lungs, leading to a sudden deterioration in a patient's condition. Timely diagnosis and immediate treatment are therefore crucial. Dr Amandeep Kaur, Director of Amandeep Hospitals, said the newly formed team at Amandeep Hospital, Pathankot, comprises Dr Suresh Kaul, HOD and Senior Consultant Chief Cardiologist, Dr Neelam Kaur, Senior Consultant Cardiologist, and Dr Sourabh Mahajan, Chief Consultant Critical Care and Anaesthesia. The team will ensure rapid assessment of patients and prepare specialised treatment plans as per medical requirements. Dr Amandeep Kaur said pulmonary embolism is a critical condition where every minute is valuable. She added that, for the first time in Punjab, such a dedicated team has been formed to provide patients with faster, coordinated and advanced healthcare services.

**Mega sewerage desilting drive's progress to be monitored via digital dashboards : Bains**

In a major pre-monsoon push to end sewage overflow and urban water-logging, Punjab Local Government Minister, Harjot Singh Bains today unveiled the state's largest-ever sewerage desilting drive, announcing that 2,200 km of sewer lines and 1,400 chronic hotspots across all cities and towns will be cleared before the rains hit.

Local Government Minister, Harjot Singh Bains informed that the drive covers 800 km of main trunk lines and 1,400 km of branch lines inside mohallas. The department has identified 1,400 chronic hotspots where sewage overflow is reported every monsoon.

"Every year, when rains come, every city and every mohalla has some points where sewage overflows. This time, under the vision of Chief Minister, Bhagwant Singh Mann, we have been given a clear target, no sewage overflow anywhere in Punjab's cities and towns," Bains stated. Sharing the city-wise breakdown, Bains said the drive will cover 108 km of sewer lines and 47 hotspots in Ja-



landhar, 93 km in Patiala, 40 km and 42 hotspots in Ludhiana, 55 km and 39 hotspots in Bathinda, 36 km in Mohali, 14 km and 15 hotspots in Zirakpur, 11 km and 11 hotspots in Kharar, 7 km and 3 hotspots in Dhuri, 21 km in Kotkapura and 7 km in Nangal, where desilting is being done for the first time. All local body and Sewerage Board JEs and other staff have been given spe-

cial training for the drive, said the Local Government Minister, while stating, "We have deployed super-suction machines and high-capacity jetting equipment. Separate control rooms and digital dashboards are being set up for real-time information."

He further shared that Progress will be monitored daily through a dashboard and accountability has been fixed from JE to SE level.

The drive will be completed in mission mode

Sharing a startling example, S. Bains said, "In Ludhiana's Bhattian area, our team found concrete had been poured inside a sewer line from a house built nearby. That line was choked for six years, causing trouble for the entire locality. Such negligence will not be tolerated."

Local Government Minister, Bains said he would personally remain on the field and all officers have been ordered to do the same. "We are involving all our MLAs and MCs as well. Our aim is that this time, you will see a real difference, no water-logging, no sewage back-flow, no dengue-spreading from water stagnation," he said.

## Mann govt extends sehat scheme to lone residents, adds 17 treatments

In a move expected to ease pressure on government hospitals and bring healthcare closer to thousands of patients, the Bhagwant Mann Government has allowed 17 additional medical procedures to be carried out at empanelled private hospitals under the Mukh Mantri Sehat Yojana (MMSY). The decision, coupled with the inclusion of individuals living alone in the scheme, marks a significant expansion of the state's universal health insurance scheme.

For countless families across Punjab, a hospital visit often means long queues, crowded wards and anxious waits for treatment. In an important step towards reducing that burden, the state government has broadened access to healthcare by permitting 17 medical procedures, previously restricted to government hospitals, to be performed at empanelled private institutions under the Mukh Mantri Sehat Yojana. The decision has effectively shortened the list of procedures reserved exclu-



sively for government hospitals, opening the door for beneficiaries to seek treatment at a much larger network of healthcare providers. Health minister Dr Balbir Singh shared that the move will improve accessibility, particularly in districts where specialised services are scarce or government facilities are struggling with heavy patient loads. "This is expected to reduce pressure on major government facilities, shorten waiting times, and improve access to timely care," he said.

The newly approved procedures cover a wide range of medical specialties, which will help people get treated closer to their homes instead of travelling long distances to overcrowded tertiary hospitals.

In Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) care, patients can now undergo fracture setting of the nasal bone and adenoidectomy at empanelled private hospitals. These are common procedures that often require timely intervention, especially among children and accident

victims. General Surgery has witnessed one of the largest expansions. Procedures such as hydrocele operations, incision and drainage of abscesses, appendectomy, and both open and laparoscopic gall bladder surgeries have now been brought within the ambit of private hospitals participating in the scheme. For many patients, this could mean shorter waiting periods and treatment closer to home.

Women's healthcare has also received considerable attention. The expanded list includes medical termination of pregnancy beyond 12 weeks, hysterotomy, hospitalisation for antenatal complications, and examination under anaesthesia for minor girls, unmarried sexually inactive women and survivors of sexual abuse. These additions will help ensure more timely and accessible care for vulnerable patients. Similarly, eye care and orthopaedic services have been strengthened. Ophthalmology procedures such as pterygium excision and entropion correction can now be performed at empanelled private hospitals.

## Two linked to drugs and arms smuggling module held with 2.2kg heroin, 6 pistols

In a major breakthrough amidst the ongoing drive to make Punjab a safe and secure state as per directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Amritsar Commissioner Police has busted a cross-border illegal arms and drug smuggling module with the arrest of two accused persons and recovered 2.225 kg heroin and six sophisticated pistols along with 12 live cartridges from their possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Wednesday.

Those arrested have been identified as Sukhdev Singh alias Sukh (23), a resident of village Chicha in Amritsar and Harjinder Singh alias Jinder (37), a resident of village Lodhi Gujjar in Amritsar. Both arrested accused are habitual offenders with criminal cases relating to kidnapping and illegal possession of arms have already been registered against them.

The recovered pistols include one .30 bore (made in China), two 9MM Glock pistols (made in Austria), one



9MM Glock pistol (made in USA) and two .30 bore pistols (made in Turkey).

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that preliminary investigation has revealed that the arrested accused were in contact with cross-border smugglers and were allegedly receiving consignments of heroin and weapons via drones from across the border for further distribution to criminal elements in Punjab.

The DGP said that further investigation is underway to establish forward and backward linkages in this case to identify other members associated with the network. Sharing operational details, Commissioner of Police (CP) Amritsar Gurpreet Singh Bhullar

said that acting on specific intelligence inputs, a police team apprehended accused Sukhdev alias Sukh and recovered 2.225 kg heroin from his possession. Preliminary investigation revealed that the accused was actively involved in drug smuggling and had procured the heroin consignment for further distribution, he said. He said that during further investigation, police arrested another accused identified as Harjinder Singh alias Jinder and recovered four pistols from his possession. Based on the disclosure statement made by arrested accused Harjinder alias Jinder, police recovered two additional pistols from a location pinpointed by him, he added.

## Farmers seek relief over fuel supply restrictions

# Education Minister reviews progress of key education reforms

Education Minister Rohit Thakur today here chaired a review meeting with senior officers of the Education Department to assess the progress of ongoing programmes and reforms in education sector.

The Education Minister said that the present state government has accorded the highest priority to the education sector and has introduced several significant reforms that are yielding positive results. He stated that the government is now planning to introduce Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programmes for students who have completed their bachelor's degrees.



Under this initiative, students will get opportunities to work with various industries while receiving a stipend. It will enable them to enhance their skills and improve their employment prospects.

He said that the government is also planning introduction of foreign language courses at the college level, which would help students acquire global

language skills and create employment opportunities in international markets. Highlighting the success of the B.Voc. initiative, Shri Thakur said that the initiative has received an encouraging response from students. In view of its success, the government is planning to introduce four additional courses under the programme.

Rohit Thakur said that in accordance with the budget announcement, the government has increased the honorarium of SMC teachers, Mid-Day Meal Workers, Water Carriers, Computer Teachers and Multi-Task Workers working under the Education Department by Rs. 500 per month. Reviewing the performance of students in the HPBOSE examinations, the Minister said that the results of Class 10 and Class 12 would be analysed in detail. He directed the officers to ensure accountability and stated that annual increments of consistently poor-performing teachers could be withheld. He also stressed the importance of regular biometric

attendance and salary deductions would be considered in cases of persistent non-compliance. The Minister said that 1,131 various categories SMC teachers were appointed through LDR category. LDR process for 714 PGT and 102 DPE posts would be conducted shortly, while the process for Computer Teachers would be taken up after the necessary amendments to the R&P Rules. He also directed the department officials to expedite the recruitment process for thousands of vacant teaching posts that have been sent to the Rajya Chayan Aayog and the Himachal Pradesh Public Service Commission.

## Congress has lost the semi-final of power and is no longer fit to play the final: Randhir Sharma

BJP Himachal Pradesh Media In-Charge Randhir Sharma said that the results of the Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local Body elections have clearly reflected the mood of the people of Himachal Pradesh. The electorate has delivered a decisive verdict against the Congress government and has overwhelmingly supported the Bharatiya Janata Party, indicating a strong desire for political change in the state.

Sharma said that the Congress government made repeated attempts to delay these elections. Various excuses, including delimitation, roster-related issues, administrative



restructuring and procedural hurdles, were cited to postpone the polls. The government was fully aware that it had lost public confidence and would face a humiliating defeat if forced to go before the people. Eventually, following judicial intervention, the elections were conducted and the results exposed the ground reality. He stated that out of the four Municipal Corporations in the state, BJP secured clear majorities in three major corporations —

Mandi, Dharamshala and Solan. Similarly, BJP-backed candidates emerged victorious in 12 out of 22 Municipal Councils and 18 out of 25 Nagar Panchayats, demonstrating widespread public support across urban Himachal. Randhir Sharma further said that the Zila Parishad elections delivered an even stronger mandate. BJP-supported candidates won 144 out of 250 seats, while Congress was reduced to just 60 seats. In Bilaspur, Congress failed to open its

account. Even in the Chief Minister's home district, the party performed poorly. In several districts, Congress was restricted to one or two seats, reflecting the growing public anger against the government. He added that BJP-backed candidates also dominated the Block Development Committee (BDC) elections. Out of 1,769 wards across the state, BJP-supported candidates won 1,109 wards, while Congress remained confined to 477. More than 65 percent of Pradhans and Up-Pradhans elected across the state are associated with BJP ideology and support base. Sharma said these results are not merely electoral victories but a direct vote of no-confidence against the Congress government.

## Rajeev Rana accorded secretary-level status by Himachal govt

The Deputy Commissioner informed that the first phase of the census, comprising House Listing and Housing Census, will be conducted from June 16 to July 15, followed by population enumeration in the second phase. Around 1,130 enumerators have been deployed across Bilaspur to ensure comprehensive coverage of every household.

## Six Ministers elected during first session of 18th Tibetan Parliament-in-Exile

On the first day of the first session of the 18th Tibetan Parliament-in-Exile, in accordance with the provisions of Article 22 of the Charter of the Tibetans in Exile, six candidates were elected as members of the 17th Kashag of the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA). This Article stipulates: "The duly elected Sikyong, after taking the oath of office, shall submit to the Tibetan Parliament a list of candidates required for his Kashag, providing their names and personal details, and shall clarify their eligibility for confirmation in accordance with the provisions of Article 21 of this Charter. If the candidates receive unanimous approval from the Parliament to be confirmed as Kalons



(Ministers), no further issue arises. However, in the absence of unanimous approval, a secret ballot regarding each candidate shall be conducted by the members present in the House, and any candidate securing at least 50 percent of the votes shall be declared an elected Kalon." Subsequently, the Sikyong shall appoint as Kalons those

candidates who have been approved by the Tibetan Parliament, either unanimously or by securing at least 50 percent of the votes. If all or any of the candidates proposed by the Sikyong fail to secure the requisite votes, the Sikyong shall submit a new list of candidates to the Tibetan Parliament in accordance with the aforementioned procedure.

**Janwadi Mahila Samiti demands stringent punishment to the doctor for sexual assault of minor girl**

**MAHENDER GOYAL HISAR:** The Janwadi Mahila Samiti (JMS) has expressed deep outrage over the sexual assault of a minor girl by a doctor at a government hospital in Kurukshetra district, Haryana and has demanded the harshest punishment to the perpetrator. It is noteworthy that the accused, Dr. Shailendra Sharma, raped a 15-year-old girl admitted to a government hospital in Kurukshetra for treatment of stomach pain, within the hospital premises. Dr. Shailendra Sharma had previously been jailed in 2017 for allegedly raping a woman by injecting her with sedatives but was later acquitted. Despite this, Dr. Shailendra Sharma was appointed as a consultant on a contract basis at the Kurukshetra government hospital by the BJP government after his retirement, resulting in the victimization of an innocent girl. Dr. Shailendra Sharma previously held positions as a senior medical officer at government hospitals in Kaithal and Kurukshetra and is said to have close ties with the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and the BJP government.

## SC forms expert committee to reassess definition and protection of Aravalli Range

**AGENCY NEW DELHI, JUNE 3**

The Supreme Court has set up a five-member High-Powered Committee to formulate a uniform definition and demarcation of the ecologically sensitive Aravalli Hills and Range for regulating future mining activities. A bench of Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, Justice Joymalya Bagchi, and Justice Vipul M Pancholi directed the committee to submit a conservation report by August 31. Constituting the expert committee, the bench observed that matters affecting ecological conservation and sustainable development cannot be resolved without informed expert evaluation, and entrusted the committee with reassessing the existing framework relating to the Aravallis. It said that any future action must be based on scientific assessment and aligned with the principles of environmental protection and sustainable development. The committee will be



headed by Kanchan Devi, Director General of the Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education, as per a May 25 order, which was made online on Tuesday. The apex court noted that expert evaluation was required to examine concerns that the current definition of the Aravalli Range—limited to land within 500 metres between two or more Aravalli hills—may significantly reduce the extent of protected areas. It observed that such a narrow interpretation could classify ecologically linked regions as "non-Aravalli" areas, potentially opening them up to mining and other environmentally harmful activities. The committee has also been directed to examine concerns that only 1,048 of Rajasthan's 12,081 Hills satisfy the prescribed 100-metre height criterion, potentially leaving a vast number of Hill formations outside the ambit of environmental protection. Highlighting the

ecological fragility and biodiversity significance of the Aravalli region, the top court said the Committee must objectively evaluate whether the proposed measures could lead to environmental impacts that may be irreversible or difficult to remedy. It stressed that any final decision should be grounded in scientific assessment and aligned with the principles of environmental conservation and sustainable development. "It must be emphasised that decisions of such far-reaching consequence ought not to be taken without the benefit of expert evaluation. The proposed Committee would be expected to objectively assess the implications of the measures contemplated and assist this Court in determining whether their implementation may give rise to ecological, environmental, or other consequences that may subsequently prove difficult, if not impossible, to reverse," the order stated.

## Govt proposes Rs. 100 crore green climate fund to tackle climate challenges

Haryana Forest and Environment Minister Rao Narbir Singh said that climate change has emerged as a serious challenge before the entire world. Countries across the globe, along with international organisations, are promoting research and innovation to find effective solutions to this growing concern. He said that in a major step towards making Haryana more climate-resilient and environmentally sustainable, the State Government has proposed the establishment of the 'Haryana Green Climate Resilient Fund' with a seed provision of Rs. 100 crore in the Budget for 2026-27.

The Minister said that a State-level World Environment Day programme will be organised in Gurugram on June 5, 2026. During the programme, various initiatives being undertaken by the State Government for environmental conservation, green development and climate change mitigation will be highlighted.

Rao Narbir Singh said that the theme for this year's World Environment Day is "Inspired by Nature—For Climate, For Our Future." The theme

emphasises reducing the impact of climate change, conserving and restoring ecosystems, promoting clean energy, adopting sustainable lifestyles and strengthening global cooperation for a secure future.



He said that the proposed Green Climate Fund will play an important role in promoting zero-emission vehicles, renewable energy, energy efficiency, water conservation, urban greening, climate-resilient agriculture and nature-based solutions across the state.

The Minister further said that the Haryana Government has launched a special mission-mode initiative to make the 313-kilometre stretch of the Yamuna River passing through the state pollution-free. Under the mission, which will be chaired by the Chief Minister, Sh. Nayab Singh Saini, efforts will be made to enhance sewage treatment capacity, prevent the discharge of untreated waste, ensure real-time monitoring of industrial units, conserve riverbanks, develop green belts and promote groundwater recharge.

He said that by 2026-27, scientific treatment of all drain water flowing into the Yamuna will be ensured, to achieve the goal of a clean and pollution-free river.

Expressing confidence in these initiatives, Rao Narbir Singh said they would give a new direction to environmental conservation in Haryana and help the state move rapidly towards sustainable, inclusive and green development. He also appealed to the people to make environmental protection a part of their daily lives and avoid the use of single-use plastic.

## World Bicycle Day: 'Mera Gaon Mera Mission' recalls its 'Ride a Bicycle, Save the Environment' campaign

On World Bicycle Day, social organisation Mera Gaon Mera Mission recalled its long-running "Ride a Bicycle, Save the Environment" campaign, highlighting the growing need to promote cycling as an eco-friendly and healthy mode of transport.

Karnal, once known as a city where bicycles were a common means of transport and which later earned Smart City status, has witnessed a sharp decline in bicycle usage over the years. The city's shared bicycle initiative launched by the Municipal Corporation also failed to sustain momentum after the Smart City designation.

Members of Mera Gaon Mera Mission said the organisation launched its cycling awareness campaign in 2015 and took it to schools, educational institutions and social organisations across several states, including Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Punjab and Delhi. More than 50,000 people reportedly signed pledge forms committing themselves to using bicycles. The campaign received support from political leaders, including the then Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal, legislators, ministers, Members of Parliament, doctors and educationists.

The organisation also attempted initiatives such as a



"Car-Free Tuesday" and "No Car Day" in Karnal. However, these programmes could not continue due to opposition from some sections of the public. Campaign members Shailender Jain and Sukhbir Tyagi said students were encouraged to adopt cycling as a pollution-free means of transport that helps save fuel, reduces accident risks and promotes a healthier lifestyle. Children who began using bicycles regularly during the campaign were also recognised and honoured by the organisation.

They expressed concern that cycling has become increasingly difficult due to the lack of dedicated cycling infrastructure in the city. They stressed the need for proper bicycle tracks in Karnal to encourage more people to use bicycles for daily commuting.

Campaign members Kuldeep Singh and Naresh

Saini said schools should play a greater role in creating awareness about cycling so that children choose bicycles over motorised vehicles and remain physically and mentally fit.

They noted that while most children learn to ride a bicycle as their first vehicle, it often disappears from their lives as they grow older and shift to motor vehicles. They said cycling remains one of the most effective ways to improve health, maintain fitness and protect the environment.

Health experts also support regular cycling, saying it helps maintain physical fitness, control weight, strengthen bones and muscles, reduce the risk of heart disease and lower stress levels. Cycling is also known to improve mood and boost energy levels.

**BARARA:** In light of rising temperatures and a potential drinking water crisis, the Public Health Engineering Department has launched a special drive against illegal and unauthorized water connections in Barara city, Adhoya Hindwan, and Adhoya Musalmana. Departmental teams conducted door-to-door inspections of water connections and issued notices to consumers found utilizing water in violation of established regulations. The campaign was led by Junior Engineer "Deepak Rana". He stated that the department's primary objective is to ensure the provision of clean and adequate drinking water to every household. To achieve this, it is imperative to curb illegal connections, prevent the loss of drinking water, and put an end to water wastage. He added that the department is continuously conducting such drives across Haryana against such connections, and notices are being issued to those found violating the rules. Deepak Rana explained that during inspections, if any consumer is found utilising a domestic water connection for non-domestic purposes—such as commercial activities or other unauthorized uses—action will be initiated against them in accordance with the rules. Such consumers will first be served a notice, granting them an opportunity to regularize their connection within a stipulated time frame. Failure to rectify the situation within the allotted time may result in the disconnection of the supply, in addition to the imposition of fines. Appealing to the residents of the area to cooperate in water conservation efforts, he stated: "Every single drop of water is invaluable. All citizens should use water strictly according to their needs and refrain from establishing any form of illegal connection or engaging in water theft, so that a regular and adequate supply of drinking water can be ensured for every family. During the campaign, the departmental team also engaged in raising public awareness regarding water conservation. Officials confirmed that this inspection drive will continue uninterrupted in the coming days. Strict action will be taken against any individual found to be involved in maintaining illegal connections or misusing drinking water.

UPI hits new high in May 2026  
with 23.2 billion transactions

The Unified Payments Interface continued its dominance in India's digital payments landscape with record volumes in May 2026, according to data released by the National Payments Corporation of India. The May numbers show UPI processed 23.2 billion transactions worth Rs 29.9 trillion during the month, keeping it far ahead of other payment rails. The NPCI data highlights UPI as the primary driver of digital transactions. The May 2026 data puts UPI transactions at 737.79 million per day on average, with a daily transaction value of Rs 84,423 crore, or Rs 0.84 trillion. The month-to-date figures capture the full strength of UPI adoption across retail, merchant and P2P payments. The May performance underscores UPI's role as the backbone of India's digital economy. With 23,201.93 million, or 23.2 billion transactions in a single month, UPI accounts for the bulk of real-time payments, far exceeding other systems tracked by NPCI. For context, IMPS recorded 358.10 million, or 0.36 billion transactions worth Rs 6,95,701 crore, about Rs 6.96 trillion. NPCI noted that the total UPI numbers published exclude Credit Card on UPI and Credit Line on UPI accounts, meaning actual usage is even higher once those segments are included. The continued month-on-month jump from April to May reflects growing consumer trust, deeper merchant acceptance, and expansion of UPI Lite and UPI for feature phones. The May 2026 figures come as digital payments get integrated into everyday spending, from small-ticket grocery purchases to large-ticket bill payments. UPI's real-time, low-cost infrastructure has made it the default choice for consumers and businesses alike. NPCI's ongoing upgrades on security, fraud prevention and cross-border UPI links are expected to support the next phase of growth. With FY27 underway, UPI's scale in May sets the tone for another year of strong adoption. The system's ability to handle more than 700 million transactions daily while maintaining stability has been key to its success. May's Rs 29.9 trillion throughput reaffirms UPI's central position in India's payments ecosystem.

If India is to realise its dream of emerging as a major global player in the semiconductor sector, it needs to reassess its core strengths and craft suitable strategies. The stark reality is that the country imports 90-95% of the semiconductors it uses today, and the domestic demand is projected to exceed \$240 billion by 2035. India spent nearly \$150 billion importing semiconductor products between 2017 and 2025.

In this scenario, it would be imprudent to reinvent the wheel and end up as an also-ran in the global race, particularly in the face of the widening gap between demand growth and limited domestic capability.

Given the complex nature of the industry and the changing geopolitics surrounding it, the Centre must favourably look into a wide range of suggestions made by the NITI Aayog to make India an indispensable player in the global semiconductor value chain. One of the important recommendations made by the think tank is that India must stop trying to catch up with global leaders in cutting-edge semiconductor manufacturing and instead focus on areas where it can become irreplaceable within the global chip supply chain.

It has been rightly argued that we should move away from the race to build the world's most advanced chips and focus instead on advanced packaging, system integration and manufacturing scale. Winning the semiconductor race will not be easy if India continues to run the existing race; instead, it should shift gears and target becoming the ecosystem player



that the global semiconductor industry cannot run without.

India's semiconductor demand is projected to grow at a compound annual growth rate of 19%. This demand is expected to be driven by electronics manufacturing, rapid expansion of data centres, increasing semiconductor content in vehicles, particularly electric vehicles and advanced driver assistance systems (ADAS), and the rapid adoption of artificial intelligence across consumer

and enterprise applications. Given the rising demand, excessive dependence on imported chips poses risks not only to economic growth but also to national security, as many semiconductor components used in defence systems are sourced from abroad.

The global chip supply chain is currently undergoing massive geopolitical pressure as the United States and its allies are trying to reduce their dependence on Chinese

semiconductor players and their markets. Though India traditionally had a strong base for the semiconductor design industry, hardware manufacturing has remained elusive. Over the last two decades, several consortia made multiple attempts at chip-making, but things never worked out.

It is estimated that India will require between \$135 billion and \$180 billion in capital expenditure over the next decade to build

infrastructure for semiconductor manufacturing, packaging, design and related ecosystem capabilities. The Centre must consider NITI Aayog's key recommendations, including setting up National Fab Academy, semiconductor-focused engineering curriculum, large-scale technician training programmes and a global talent initiative, to attract experienced semiconductor professionals.

## US job openings jump to 7.6 million in April as hiring, separations ease



US job openings rose sharply in April to 7.6 million, a gain of 731,000 over the month, while hiring and overall separations both eased, the US Bureau of Labor Statistics reported Tuesday. The data suggests demand for labour remains strong even as worker movement in payrolls cooled.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, "the number of job openings increased to 7.6 million in April," with the job openings rate rising to 4.6 per cent. Over the year, openings were up by 520,000. The increase was driven largely by professional and business services, which added 668,000 openings, offsetting a decline of 135,000 in finance and insurance.

Hiring activity softened during the month. The BLS said "the number and rate of hires decreased to 5.1 million (-419,000) and 3.2 per cent, respectively, in April," with hires little changed across all industries. Total separations, which include quits, layoffs and discharges, also declined. "In April, the number and rate of total separations decreased to 5.0 million (-399,000) and 3.1 per cent, respectively." The retail trade saw the biggest drop at 136,000 fewer separations. Within separations, quits held steady at 3.0 million, or a 1.9 per cent rate, while layoffs and discharges were little changed at 1.7 million, or 1.1 per cent. The Bureau of Labor Statistics noted that quits are generally

voluntary separations initiated by employees and can serve as a measure of workers' willingness to leave jobs. "Quits were little changed in all industries," the agency said. Layoffs and discharges decreased in retail trade by 88,000, but were otherwise little changed.

The report also broke down trends by establishment size. For firms with 1 to 9 employees, the job openings rate increased while hires and separations rates showed little change. For the largest establishments with 5,000 or more employees, the quits rate increased, but job openings, hires, layoffs and discharges, and total separations rates showed little or no change.

## India set to emerge as one of world's key AI, hyperscale infrastructure markets

India is poised to emerge as one of the world's most important AI and hyperscale infrastructure markets, driven by rapid expansion in data centre capacity, rising artificial intelligence workloads and strong policy support, according to Knight Frank India's latest report.

The report noted that India's data centre sector has entered a defining phase of expansion, with live IT capacity across the country's seven primary markets surpassing 1.6 GW by the end of 2025. "India's data centre industry is entering a once-in-a-generation infrastructure cycle," the report said, adding that the growth is being driven by "AI-led digital transformation, hyperscale cloud expansion, sovereign data requirements and proactive policy support."

The report highlighted that India added 371.5 MW of live capacity in 2025, following 361.6 MW added in 2024, reflecting a sustained growth cycle supported by strong demand from hyperscalers and AI-led workloads.

Cumulative colocation lease activity reached 2.06 GW in 2025, with AI emerging as a key demand driver. "AI-related colocation leasing alone reached 348 MW during the year, more than doubling compared with 2024," the report



said. It added that "nearly 20 per cent of total demand" is now linked directly to AI-related workloads, underlining the structural shift in demand patterns across the sector. Knight Frank India observed that the sector has transformed from a fragmented infrastructure base into a strategic asset class. "The sector, which has evolved from a fragmented infrastructure ecosystem into a strategic

institutional asset class over the last decade, is now witnessing unprecedented momentum," it said.

On regional growth, the report said Mumbai continues to dominate the market, accounting for nearly 47 per cent of India's total live capacity.

"Mumbai retained its position as India's largest and most mature data centre market," the report said, while

also noting the emergence of Chennai and Hyderabad as key growth hubs supported by subsea connectivity and AI-focused infrastructure demand.

Hyderabad, in particular, is rapidly emerging as an AI infrastructure hub, with global cloud providers expanding their presence and new hyperscale regions expected to go live in the coming years. The report also highlighted large-

scale investments and project announcements in Tier-II cities, including Visakhapatnam, which is witnessing gigawatt-scale development plans backed by major global and domestic players. "Visakhapatnam and Jamnagar signal India's next wave of AI infrastructure growth," the report said, pointing to multi-billion-dollar investments and planned AI-focused campuses.

According to Knight Frank, regulatory and policy developments such as data protection rules and sovereign AI initiatives are also reshaping demand for domestic infrastructure. "The implementation of India's Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Rules... marks one of the most significant structural demand drivers for the data centre sector," it noted.

Despite strong momentum, the report flagged execution challenges, particularly around power availability, transmission capacity and regulatory approvals, even as capital commitments continue to rise. At the same time, major global and domestic firms have announced large investment plans in India's data centre ecosystem, reinforcing long-term confidence in the market's growth trajectory.

## Study shows how allergies differ in urban, rural children

Scientists discovered that a previously uncharacterized subset of immune cells may play an important role in the development of allergy illnesses and explain disparities between urban and rural populations.

The study sheds light on how the immune system develops in early life and why urban children are more prone to allergies than rural children. Led by researchers from the University of Rochester Medical Center (URMC) Department of Pediatrics, including MD/PhD student Catherine Pizzarello and senior author Kirsi Jarvinen-Seppo, MD, PhD, the study uncovered a unique subpopulation of T cells known as helper 2 (Th2) cells with distinct molecular characteristics. T-cells are the foundational immune cells that fight off infections, but there is evidence that this

specific subtype is recognizing certain foods as allergenic and attacking them, according to Jarvinen-Seppo. "These pro-allergic T cells are more inflammatory than anything previously described in this context," said Jarvinen-Seppo, chief of Pediatric Allergy and Immunology at UR Medicine Golisano Children's Hospital. "They were found more frequently in urban infants who later developed allergies, suggesting they may be a predictive biomarker or even a mechanistic driver of allergic disease."

The study compared blood samples from urban infants with those from infants in a farming community, specifically the Old Order Mennonites (OOM) of New York's Finger Lakes region—known for their low rates of allergies. Researchers



found that while urban infants had higher levels of the aggressive Th2 cells, OOM infants had more regulatory T cells that help keep the immune system in balance and reduce the likelihood of allergic responses. While additional research is needed to identify a possible cause, Jarvinen-Seppo speculates that differences in the development of the gut microbiome between the two populations, and more exposure to "healthy" bacteria in rural children, may be a factor.

"The farming environment, which is rich in microbial exposure, appears to support the development of a more tolerant immune system.

Meanwhile, the urban environment may promote the emergence of immune cells that are primed for allergic inflammation," said Jarvinen-Seppo. The

work is part of a broader, NIH-funded investigation into how early-life exposures influence long-term immune outcomes. In 2023, Jarvinen-Seppo's team received a \$7 million grant from the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) to study environmental, microbiome, and immune differences between OOM and urban infants.

The goal is to continue this foundational work to uncover protective factors that could be translated into preventive therapies, including probiotics or microbiome-supporting interventions. "If we can identify the conditions for this disparity between the different T cell subpopulations, we can potentially find solutions in allergic disease development," Jarvinen-Seppo said.

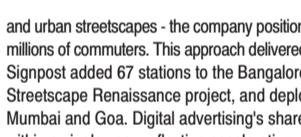

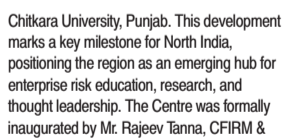
